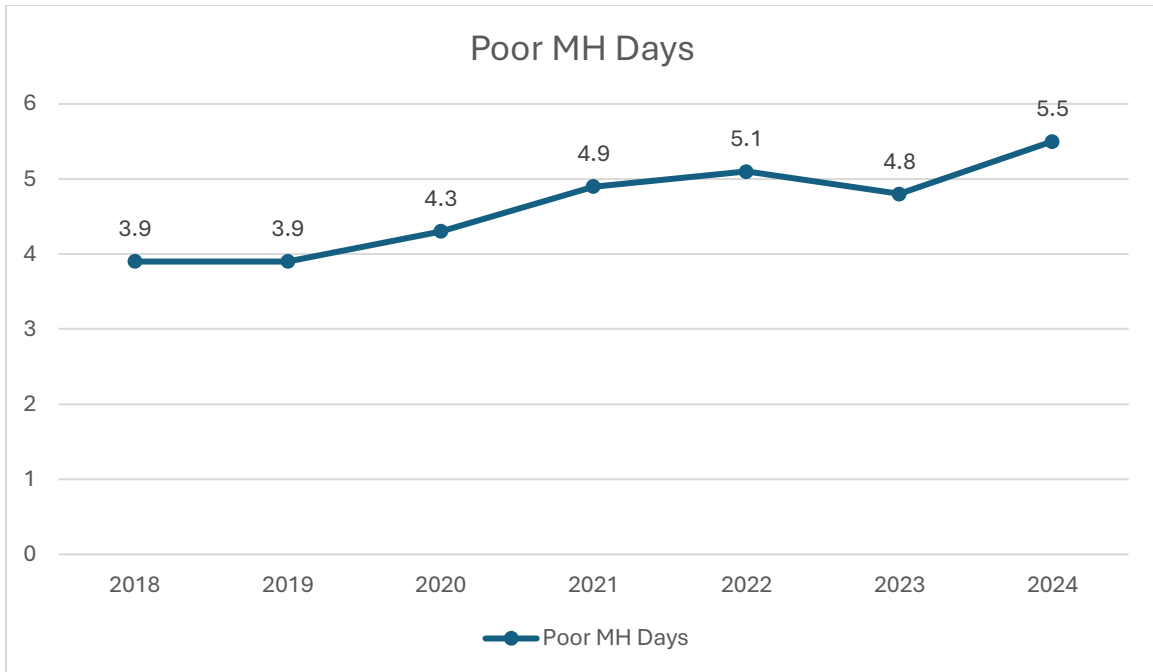

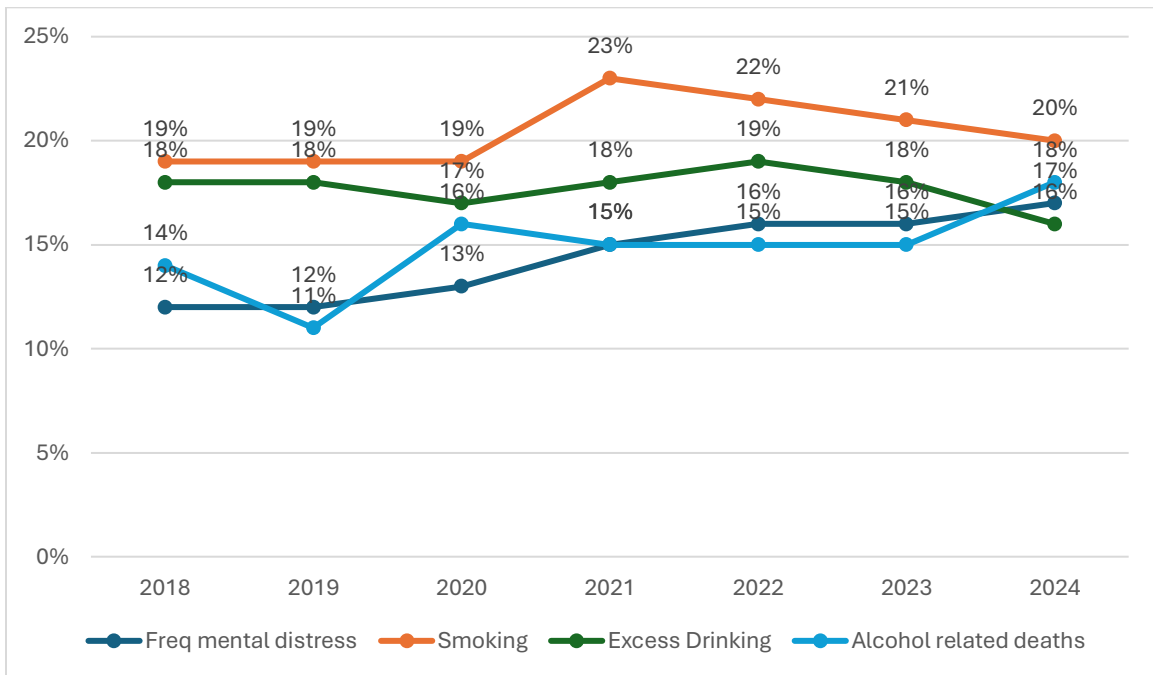

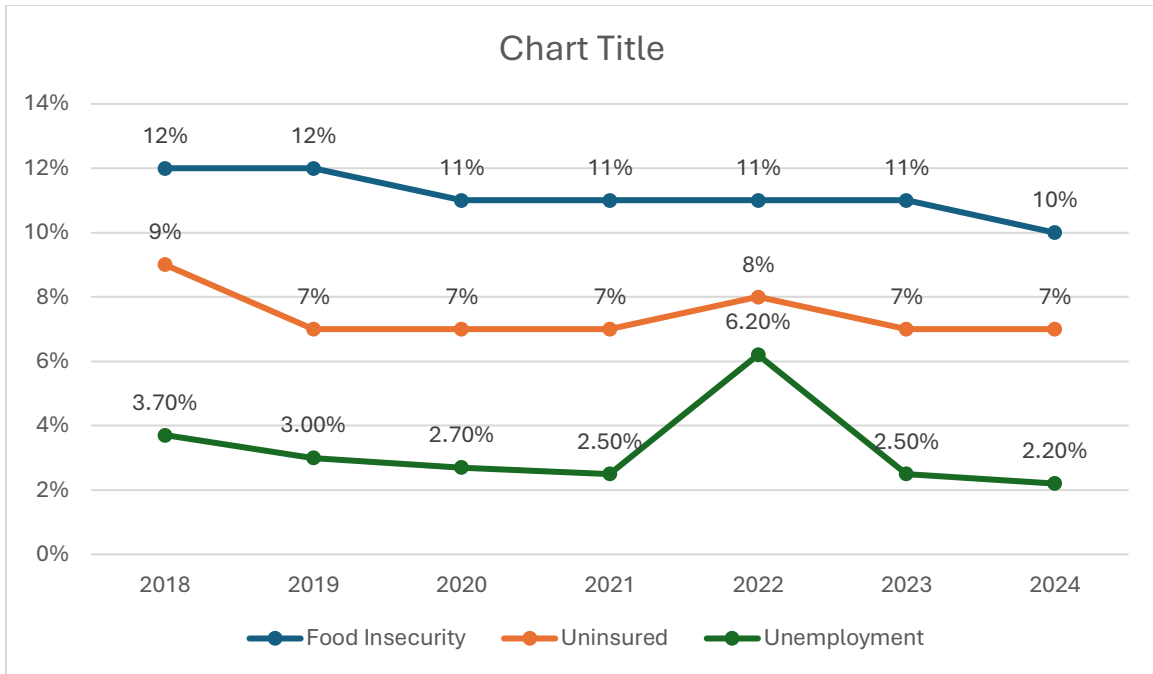




The number of poor mental health days per 30 days has increased from 3.9 days to 5.5 days.

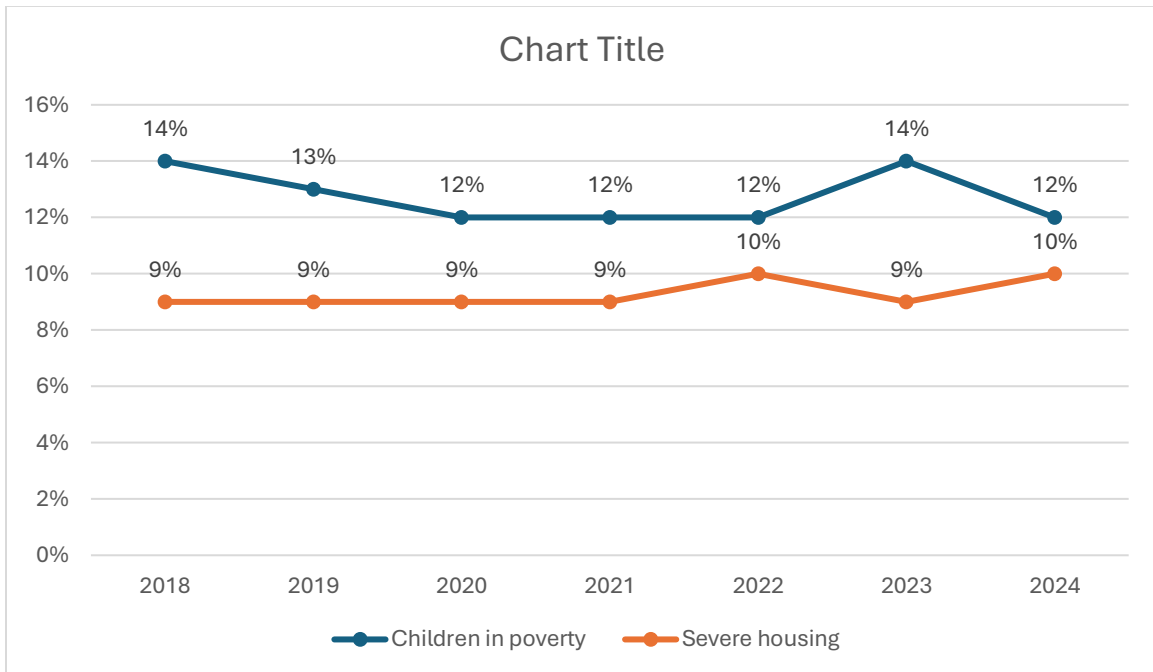


Frequent mental distress levels has increased from 12% to 17% since 2018. Smoking rates are slightly increased from 19% in 2018 to 20% in 2024. Excess drinking has decreased from 18% to 16% and alcohol related deaths have increased from 14% to 18%

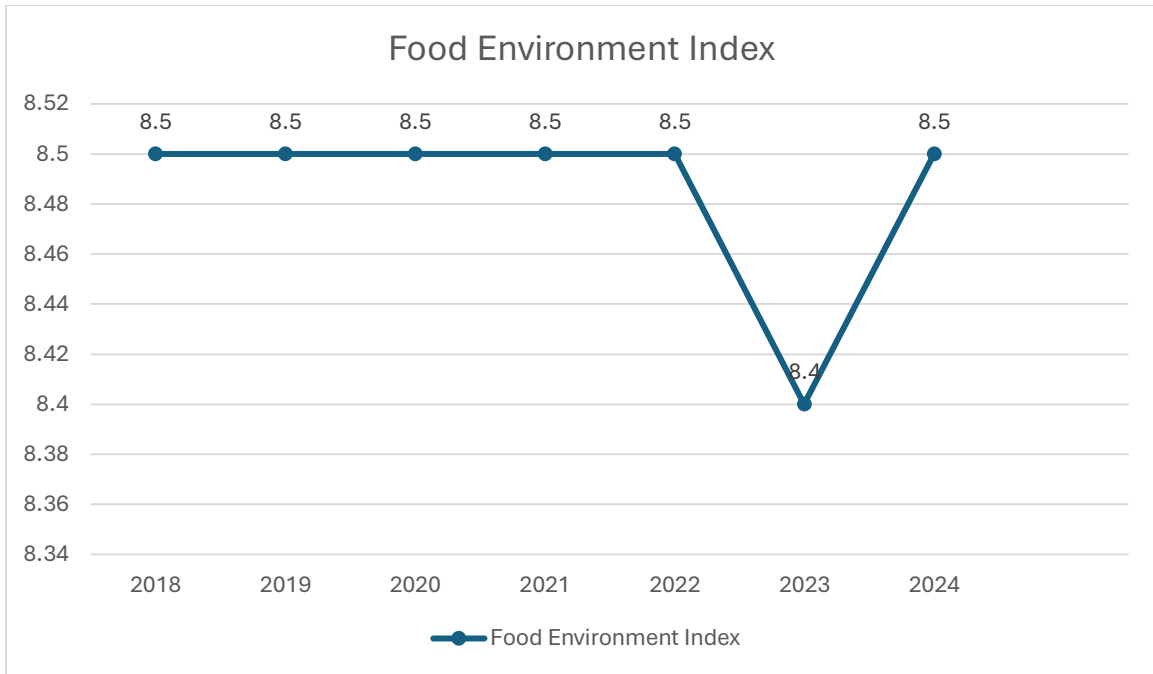


Food insecurity has decreased from 12% to 10%

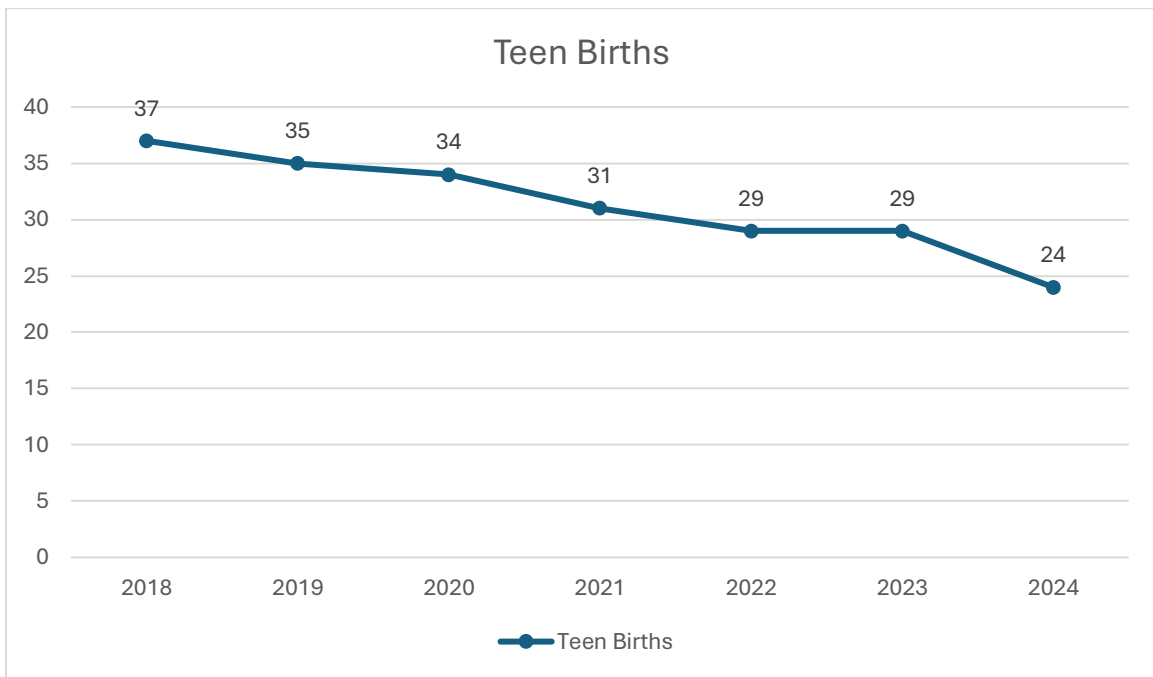
Uninsured rate has decreased from 9% to 7%. Unemployment rate decreased from 3.7% to 2.2%



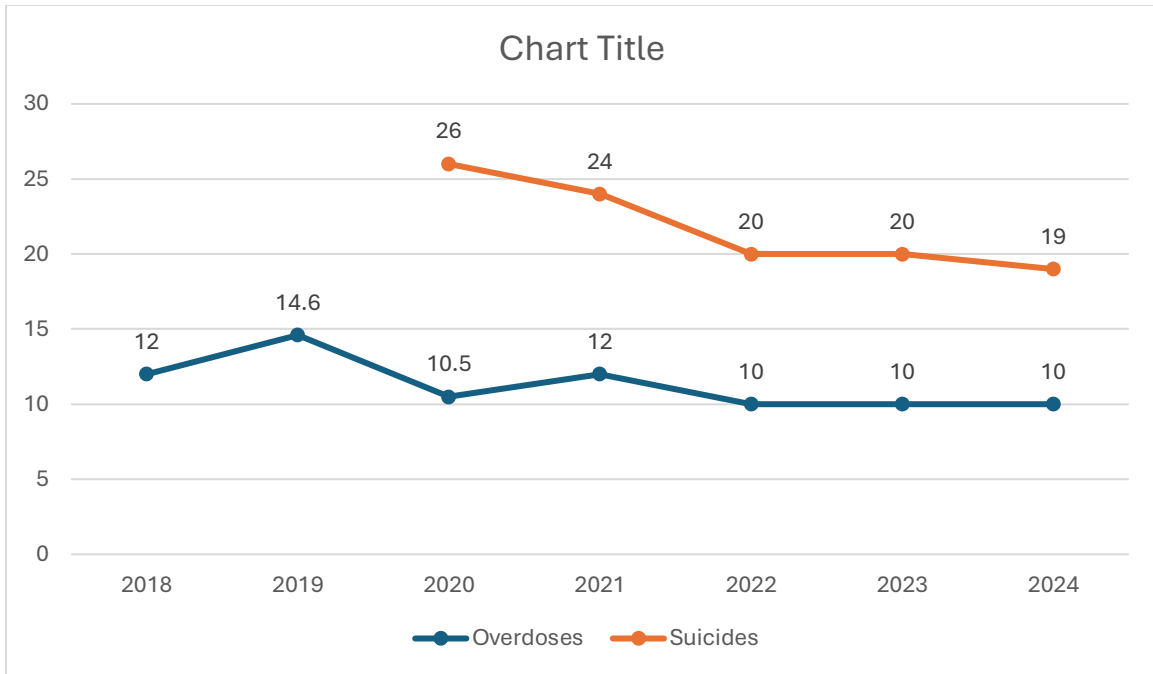
Children in poverty decreased from 14% to 12%. Severe housing issues increased from 9% to 10%.



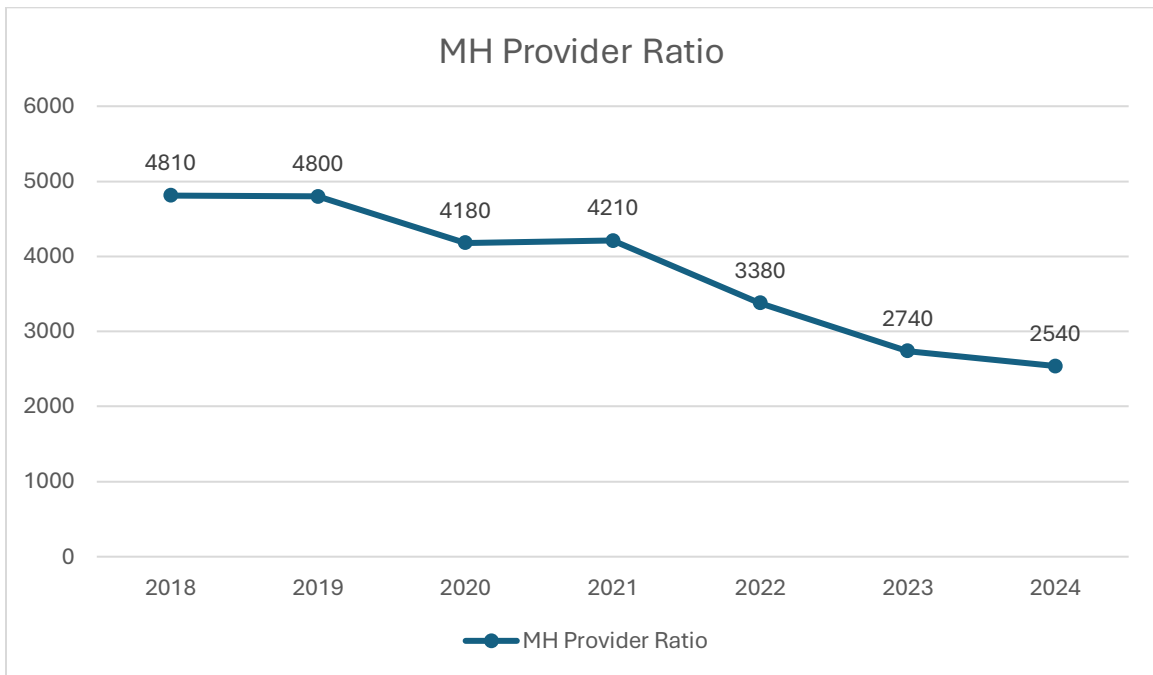
The food environment index is the same at 8.5 since 2018.



Teen births have decreased from 37 to 24 since 2018.



Overdose rates have slightly decreased from 12 to 10 since 2018. Suicide rates have decreased from 26 to 19 since 2020.



The mental health provider ratio is how many patients there are to every one mental health provider. The average in Indiana is 550:1. Gibson county has seen vast improvement since 2018 and cut the ratio in half since then. Though still quite above the Indiana average, there has been great improvement.
