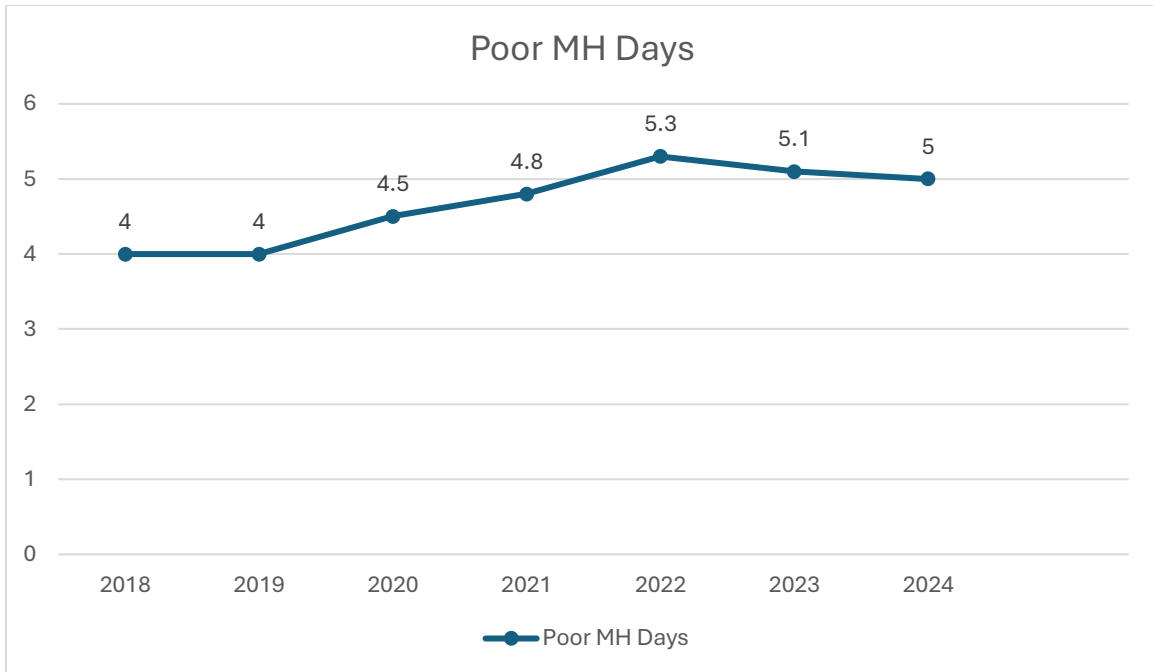

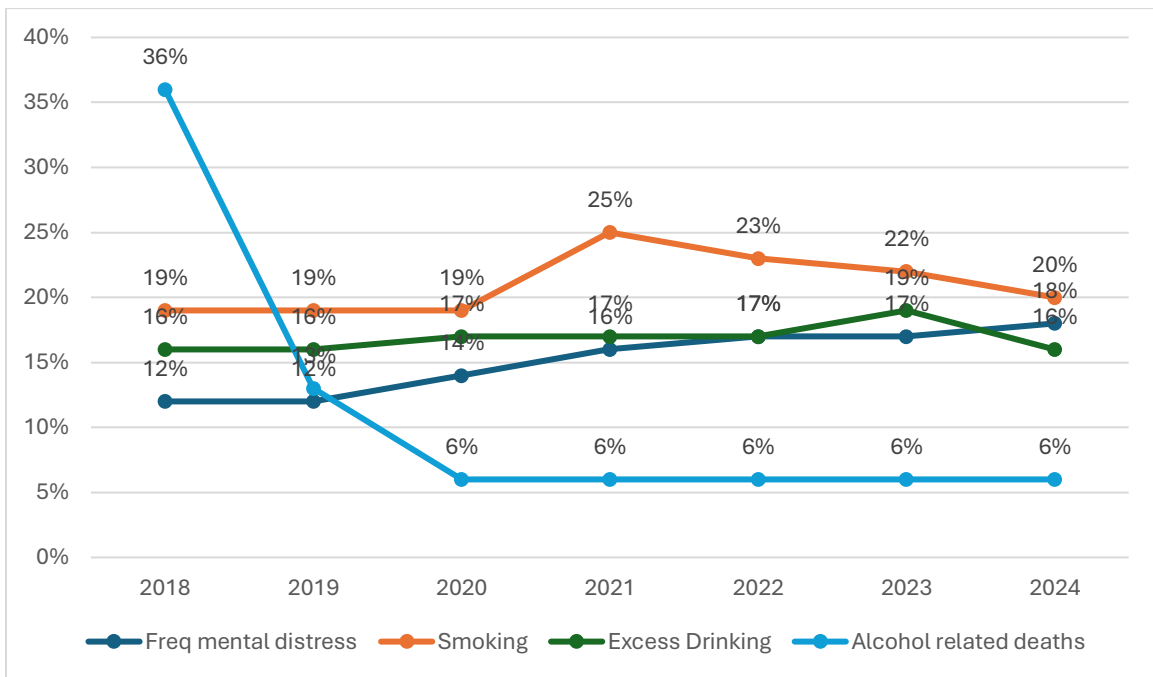

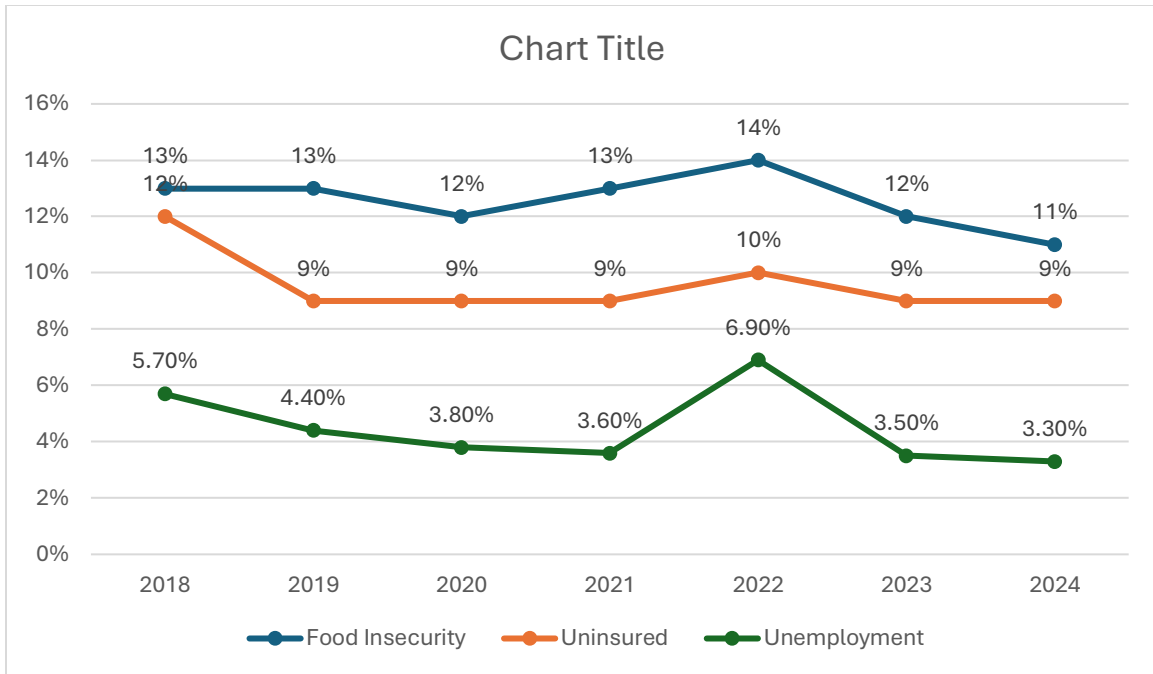




The number of poor mental health days per 30 days has increased from 4 days to 5 days.

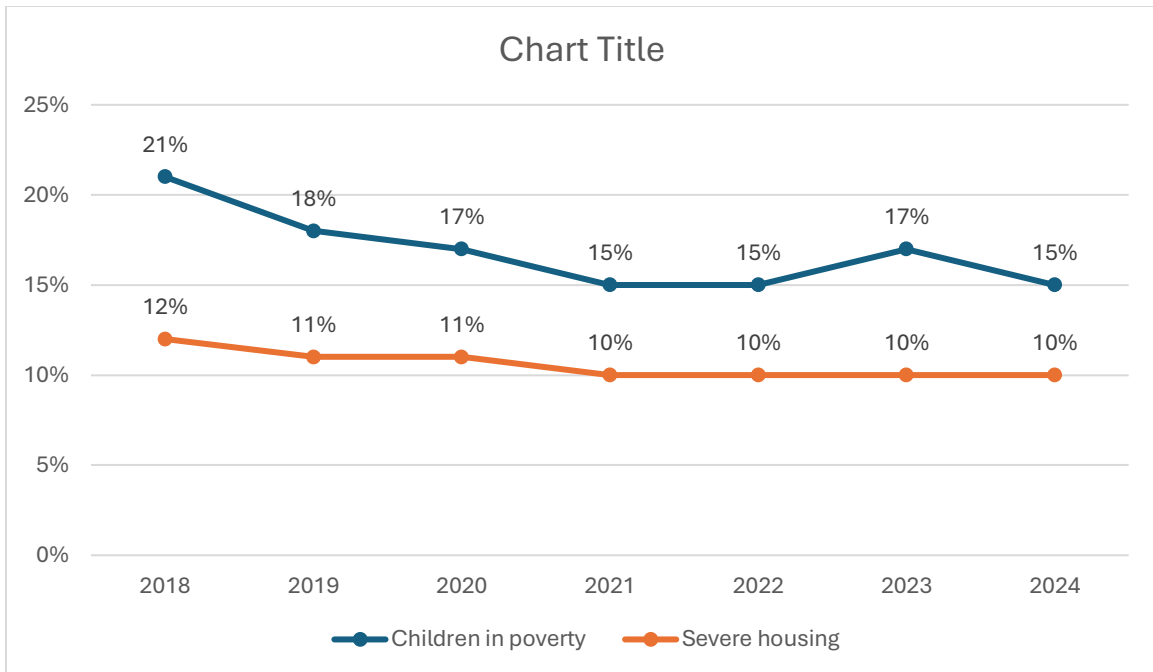


Frequent mental distress levels have increased from 12% to 18% since 2018. Smoking rates have increased from 19% in 2018 to 20% 2024. Excess drinking has stayed the same since 2018 at 16% and alcohol related deaths have decreased to 36% to 6% since 2018.

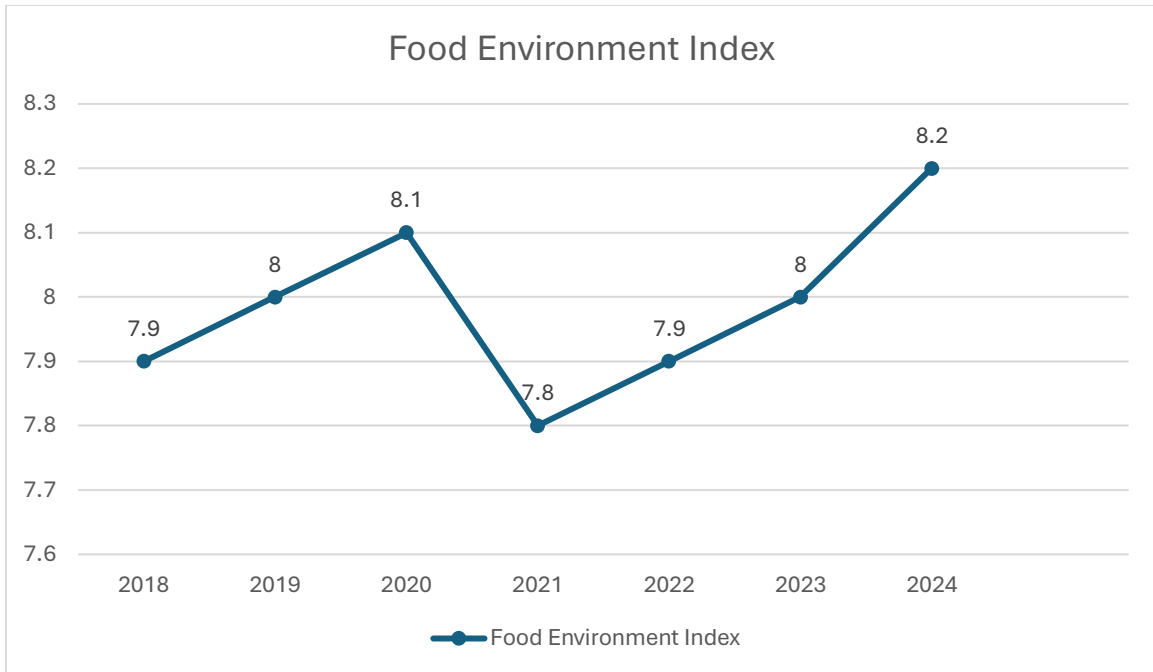


Food insecurity has decreased from 13% to 11%

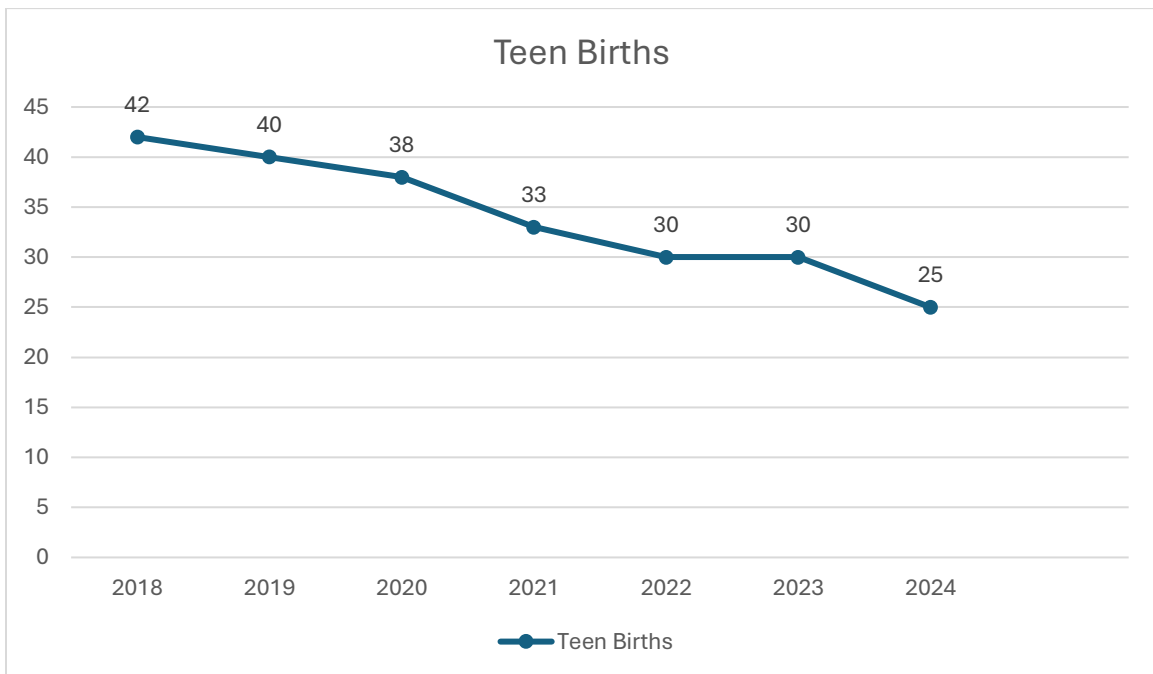
Uninsured rate has decreased from 12% to 9%. Unemployment rate decreased from 5.7% to 3.3%



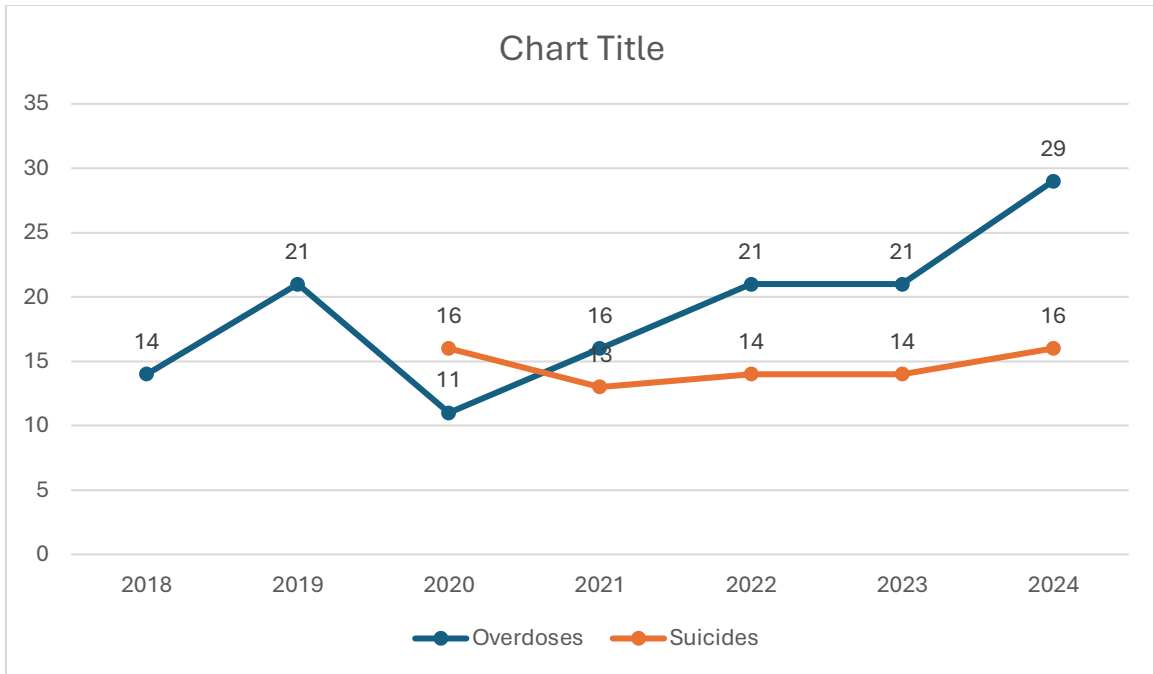
Children in poverty has decreased from 21% to 15% since 2018. Severe housing issues has decreased from 12% to 10% since 2018.



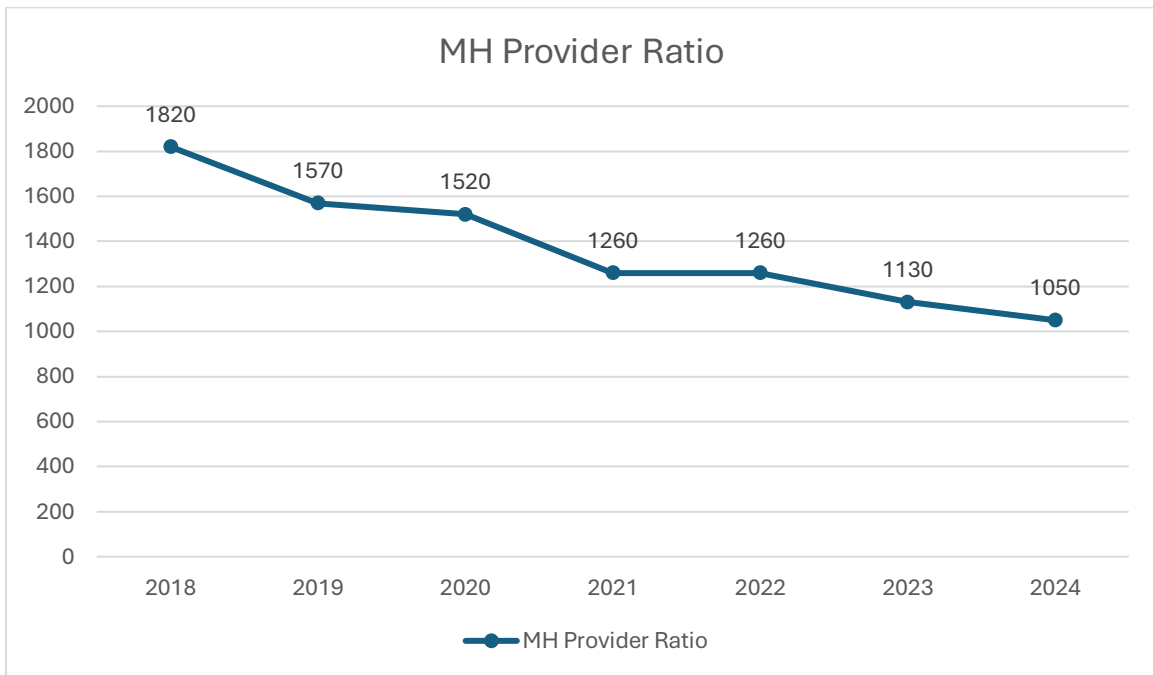
The food environment index has decreased from 7.9 to 8.2 since 2018.



Teen births have decreased from 42 to 25 since 2018.



Overdose rates have increased from 14 to 29 since 2018. Suicide rate has stayed the same at 16.



The mental health provider ratio is how many patients there are to every one mental health provider. The average in Indiana is 550:1. Lawrence county has had a decrease from 1820:1 to 1050:1 since 2018.
