







The number of poor mental health days per 30 days has increased from 4.1 days to 5.4 days.




Frequent mental distress levels has increased from 12% to 18% since 2018. Smoking rates have increased from 19% in 2018 to 21% 2024. Excess drinking has stayed the same at 17% and alcohol related deaths have stayed the same at 17%




Food insecurity has decreased from 12% to 11%


Uninsured rate has decreased from 11% to 9%. Unemployment rate decreased from 4.2% to 2.7%




Children in poverty has stayed the same at 17%. Severe housing issues has decreased from 11% since 2018 to 10% in 2024.




The food environment index has decreased from 8.4 to 8.1 since 2018.



Teen births have decreased from 35 to 23 since 2018.



Overdose rates have increased from 12 to 12.9 since 2018. There was no data for suicide rates for Martin County for 2018-2024.



The mental health provider ratio is how many patients there are to every one mental health provider. The average in Indiana is 550:1. Martin county has had a slight decrease from 5090:1 to 4900:1 since 2018.
