Potential use of Permeable Pavement in OHE

- A) The Board is considering allowing the limited use of State-qualified "Permeable Pavement" for projects that exceed the 5,300 square foot Built Upon Area (BUA) limit in OHE.
 - a) Background
 - In the past, individual Storm Water permits were issued by the State of NC.
 - i. There is currently a State-issued permit for Permeable Pavement in place for one lot in OHE. It was issued in 2012.
 - ii. The DEQ recently delegated the responsibility for approving these Permits to the Association.
 - By approving the use of Permeable Pavement, The Association would assume
 the responsibility for enforcing compliance with the State-mandated guidelines as
 well as any potential risks of non-compliance.
 - b) These projects would require approval by the Association and would be subject to a maximum limit of the combined total of permeable and impermeable surface coverage, based the total square footage of the lot.
 - c) Owner costs for these projects will be significant.
- B) Built Upon Area (BUA) Credit
 - a) If approved by the Board, an eligible owner could apply to the Association for a State Storm Water BUA Credit (to meet the <u>5,300 BUA limit</u>) for any surfaces that the meet all the Permeable Pavement requirements specified in the OHE Storm Water Permit.
