From the Pastor

As the busy summer months come to an end, I've resumed an old habit. I start each day by naming three things for which I'm grateful and three things about which I am excited. At the end of the day, I write down three "wins" from the day as well as one thing I'll do to improve. The practice helps me to begin and end each day in thanksgiving for God's gifts and to reflect on one way I can better live into my baptismal call to discipleship.

It's important to center ourselves in God's goodness, particularly when we feel besieged by those forces which rebel against God's mission to heal, reconcile, and save. In the final month of summer, our scripture texts in worship will point us again and again to our holy center and to God's action.

We'll begin with naming what matters and what doesn't, and look to Christ revealed in word and sacrament as where we find meaning. Then we'll think about Christ revealed in our own lives, through our words and actions.

The following week scriptures' authors remind us that God comes to us and serves us without shame. They follow with a call to action: naming how we see God at work in us and in the world.

The third week of August is a disturbing message. Jesus declares himself the great divider. It's worth pondering from what Jesus seeks to divide us. Sin and death-dealing actions, both individual and collective, drive Jesus' determination to drive wedges between us and whatever separates us from life in God.

The fourth week we see God in Christ setting the captive free, healing on the sabbath, and restoring someone to community. It's disruptive to those who witness these actions. Once again, Jesus is a disturber of the peace, including our own.

We'll close out the summer with laying on of hands, anointing, the blessing and commissioning of faith formation leaders, and God's invitation to us to keep turning back to our center, the One who gives us life. And we'll also notice how God urges us to extend that invitation to others.

This Christian life isn't easy. It calls us to cling to hope in spite of discouragement, despair, and plain old tiredness. It calls us to turn, return, and re-turn to God, finding ourselves once again in font and table and word, held within the body of Christ. It calls us to lives of thankfulness and praise, both for what God has done, is doing, and will do in our lives and in the life of the world, but also for what God equips us to do as God's holy people.

As summer closes, may you find moments of thankfulness, and moments when you see God calling you into deeper discipleship.

Change—whether welcome or unwelcome—can stretch us in ways we never imagined. Yet when we surrender to God, we embrace the one true constant in this life, a constant that provides us security.

I've recently been reflecting on the amount of change I've experienced over the past year. It started when I stepped in as the Interim Director of Music Ministry, and then got engaged shortly after. My now wife and I spent months planning and saving for our wedding, preparing ourselves for one of the biggest changes of our lives. I later took off the interim tag and embraced my music ministry role permanently. My wife and I got married and I helped her move to Tennessee. While we finished up our honeymoon, I got a call from my mother letting me know that our dog of fifteen years, Rufus, was going to need to be let go as he declined in his old age.

That's a lot of life packed into twelve months. Every one of these moments some element of joy, stress, growth, and uncertainty, challenging not just myself, but my wife, our families, and friends.

In the midst of so much movement, one truth has remained steady: God does not change. Malachi 3:6 reminds us plainly: "I the Lord do not change. So you, the descendants of Jacob, are not destroyed" (NIV).

Part of my wife and I's honeymoon was a week-long trip to DisneyWorld. While there, we rode a number of rides and roller coasters.

Change can feel like a rollercoaster—highs, lows, sharp turns, and sudden drops. We don't always know what's coming next. But if you've ever been on a rollercoaster, you know the key to staying safe isn't in controlling the ride—it's in holding tightly to the safety bar. That safety bar doesn't move. It stays with you through the entire ride. God is that steady presence. When we cling to Him — when we surrender our control, our fears, our need to have it all figured out—we find security in the One who remains unchanged.

Surrendering to God isn't a sign of weakness. It's an act of trust. It's saying, "I don't have all the answers—but I know the One who does."

From the Stewardship & Finance Committee: Other Ways to Give financial gifts to St. Timothy

This is a very serious and important season for St. Timothy as we are faced with a very expensive replacement cost for the A/C in the sanctuary. Some might consider giving an extra gift of a STOCK. Also, if you are 70 ½, age or older, here is another way to give from your investments while reducing your taxable income. (Dr. Dale Olson)

Request a QCD (Qualified Charitable Distribution):

A Qualified Charitable Distribution allows you to donate directly to a charity like St. Timothy Lutheran Church which counts toward your RMD (Required Minimum Distribution) and may reduce your taxable income.

Submitting Your Request to your Investment Firm.

- **Step 1. Select the QCD Amount.** Select the dollar amount for the QCD (Maximum of \$108,000) that will be withdrawn from your account's fund.
- **Step 2. Verify the Charity (St. Timothy Lutheran Church).** Your investment firm will have a database of charities for your convenience. You can verify "St. Timothy Lutheran Church of Hendersonville, TN" as the charity that you wish to receive the amount.
- Step 3. After you submit the request to your investment firm, they will mail you a check with the primary address of St. Timothy Lutheran Church. (Usually, the check should arrive within 10 business days. Or some investment firms will electronically send the amount directly to the charity.
- Step 4. If your investment firm sends you the check, you are responsible to send the check or bring the check to St. Timothy.
- Step 5. St. Timothy will send you a receipt of your gift for proof when you file your taxes.

Our thanks to all of you for your generous financial support of St. Timothy. This is a season that we need everyone to consider a gift to the glory of God. All are special in the eyes of God.
