




Handbell Spring Concert Founders Hall

At our May Council meeting, Pr. Amanda reported that our onsite and online worship attendance continues to be steady. We love seeing such life and vitality in our midst. Pr. Amanda will be having intergenerational 1-room Faith Formation during the summer months. Be on the lookout for more information about that. Also, Pr. Amanda has facilitated the formation of a Grief Support Group at STLC. The next meeting will be June 24th at 4:00pm in the Community Room. This is open to the community so if you know someone who may have interest, invite them to this vital ministry.

In the President's Report, Ken Tsuchiyama shared that there have been a rash of fraudulent emails being sent to parishioners in the name of Pr. Amanda. Usually they are requesting some sort of financial donation to be sent via gift cards. If you receive one of these emails NEVER click on any link, mark the email as spam, then call the office to let us know. Because of these emails, council has made the decision to cease emailing our member directory to anyone. We understand this may be an inconvenience to some but we think it's in the best interest to protect everyone's contact information. Any member can access a directory via our website. Click the "About Us" tab then scroll down and click "Congregation Portal". This is a password protected portal that has parish specific info like past council meeting minutes, Annual Reports, and member directory. If you need help setting up your password, call the church office at 615-824-6244.

Our treasurer, Dave Miley reported that in April, expenditures were markedly increased mainly due to larger one-time expense invoices that were paid. These included organ maintenance, water heater replacement, and having the Narthex doors repaired.

Finally, ya'll, Confirmation Sunday was amazing! Despite having to make the last minute decision to hold services in Founders Hall, this was a great opportunity for all to see how resilient we at St. Tims are; we are Church. Council would like to thank everyone for your patience and willingness to pivot to Founders Hall for our Worship services. We are still navigating the maintenance on the Sanctuary air conditioning unit. We will keep you updated on this as information becomes available.
