From Our Interim Pastor

On the last Sunday in September, an inquirers class began at St. Timothy with about twenty participants, most of whom are new to our church. Given the size of the group, we spent most of our first session introducing ourselves. The diverse group of learners included at least three people with advanced degrees in history, a psychiatrist and a couple of counselors, a raft of teachers, lots of people who are involved



in internet technology in one way or another, military veterans, parents and grandparents. I am both a bit intimidated by the group and looking forward to what promises to be lively conversation about the faith we share as Lutheran Christians.

One thing that became clear in the introductions is that not a few people come to St. Timothy because this congregation is known for its non-judgmental welcome to all God's beloved children. The comments we heard from some of the inquirers reminded me of a study of millennials done a few years ago by the Barna Group. It found that large majorities of young adults who do not attend church found church people to be judgmental (87%), hypocritical (85%), anti-gay (91%), and insensitive to others (70%). It is hard to see how followers of Jesus, who frequently criticized hypocrisy, and who said "do not judge!" and "treat others as you would have them treat you," could have gained such a bad reputation. And yet, that is where we are as church these days.

St. Timothy has a different reputation among many in the Hendersonville area. This community is one who, like Jesus, is becoming known for welcoming those whom others shun. And not just welcoming, but including and involving fully in the community's life. And the best part is, I've noticed that this welcome seems to be so much a part of the congregation that it happens without fanfare or self-consciousness or self-congratulations. When something becomes so much a part of you that you don't have to focus on it, and may hardly notice it, that characteristic has become a part of your deepest identity.

Shy Lutherans have a hard time being praised, but hear these words of appreciation from one who has come to appreciate who you are in these past four months: kudos, St. Timothy, for living out the gospel here in Middle Tennessee. Keep on embodying the good news of Jesus' love. Let's do our part to live down the church's bad reputation.



In our September council meeting Melissa House reported that, with the help of Dale Olson (thank you, Dale!), an informational card is being developed that will have our worship service times, contact info, etc. These will be available to hand out so that our greater community knows who we are and to amplify our "All Are Welcome" message.

Steve Hansen, our parish treasurer, reported there was increased giving this past month and overall all our accounts are in a good place. He has asked that all committees be working on their 2025 Ministry Plan. Also, in October our mortgage will reset. Steve has been in communication with Thrivent who states we will know our new mortgage rate on October 1st. In August we collected \$13,500 towards debt reduction. 
