

Renmore come from behind to snatch a draw

DYNAMO Blues made a welcome return to the Premier League on Sunday when they shared six goals with last season's runners-up Renmore.

Both teams, playing their first game of the season, played good open attractive football with hardly a foul of note in the whole 90 minutes.

The home side dominated the first half and with better finishing could have been two or three goals up with good efforts from Coll and O'Mahoney well stopped by the Tuam side's 'keeper.

Against the run of play, Blues scored first, Acton slipped a ball to Ray Burke who calmly drew the 'keeper and duly slotted the ball home, to put Blues one up at the interval.

Ten minutes into the second half Blues went two up with another simple one-two passing movement up the left allowing Burke to get his second goal of the game.

Renmore stepped up the pressure and were rewarded with a series of corners and

eventually prized open the tough Blues defence. O'Mahoney curled the ball across for Langan to powerfully head home Renmore's first goal of the season.

The home side began pushing more players forward in search of an equaliser. However instead of an equaliser Blues broke away and got their third goal of the game.

Burke, again, was heading towards goal when Círan Conneely upended him in the box to concede a penalty. From the resulting spot kick Noel Kelly saw his kick parried by John Burke, Kelly followed in like a flash and buried the ball in the back of the net.

From the kick off Conneely made up for his mistake by rising highest in the Blues box to head home another of O'Mahoney's corners.

With only two minutes remaining, Renmore snatched a well deserved equaliser.
