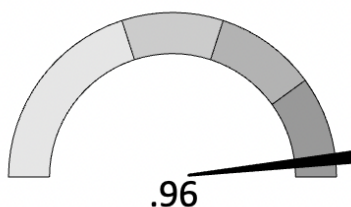
INTRODUCTION TO CHARTING THE TERRITORIES

A few years ago, I found myself wondering if there was a way to *rank* wrestlers in a way that made sense and that considered the unique nature of professional wrestling. For numerous reasons, most of the ways of measuring success in traditional sports (for both teams and individuals) are not transferable to “sports entertainment” as they call pro wrestling today.

The first step in this process was identifying what, exactly, I’m trying to measure. I wasn’t looking to measure what many people refer to as *workrate*, where a skilled wrestler such as Eddy Guerrero or Dean Malenko might be ranked above Hulk Hogan or Kamala. Instead, I was looking to arrange wrestlers in something akin to a depth chart, ***based on how the promoters and/or bookers wanted fans to perceive the wrestlers***. If we had a time machine and could go back and ask Bill Watts to put together a depth chart for all the wrestlers in Mid-South Wrestling in the spring of 1984, he’d probably be able to whip up a list of who he was pushing as the top guys, who was slightly lower on the food chain, and so on and so forth down to the preliminary wrestlers. By that same token, you might also use that time machine to find a fan who watched Mid-South Wrestling in the spring of 1984, one that watched with *suspension of disbelief*, and ask them who they thought were the top wrestlers in the territory, who was at a slightly lower level, and so on down the line. Chances are those lists would be very similar.

As I researched old wrestling cards for various territories over the years, it struck me that there’s **information** embedded in the structure of these cards. The main event, the match which was pushed as the most important of all the matches being presented on a given night in a given town, typically featured main event level wrestlers. Conversely, the opening matches typically featured preliminary wrestlers, or on occasion one newcomer being “pushed” by getting a win over a preliminary wrestler. Over time, I developed a statistic that I call the SPOT Rating. SPOT stands for Statistical Position Over Time, and it measures a wrestlers’ average position (or, their ***spot***) on the cards. The SPOT Rating is a number between 0 and 1 and is usually displayed to two decimal places. The highest possible SPOT is 1.00 and means the wrestler was always advertised in the main event during a certain period of time.

In this Almanac, the SPOT Rating for a wrestler is displayed using a chart that looks like a speedometer. Below is the SPOT Rating for The Brute (Michael Davis aka Bugsy McGraw) in this territory in 1973:



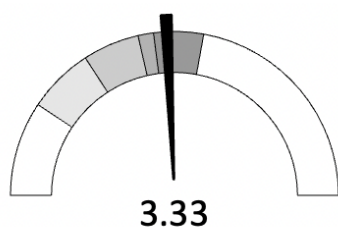
The Brute’s SPOT Rating when he wrestled in this territory in 1973 was a .96, a very high number when you consider a 1.00 would be a perfect score. The speedometer uses different levels of shading to help distinguish between categories of wrestlers. The cutoff points are as follows:

Lightest level of shading: SPOT Rating between .00 and .40 (Preliminary Wrestlers)
 Second-lightest level: SPOT Rating between .40 and .60 (Mid-Carders)
 Second-darkest level: SPOT Rating between .60 and .80 (Upper Mid-Carders)
 Darkest level of shading: SPOT Rating between .80 and 1.00 (Main Eventers)

In addition to the SPOT Ratings, there are 2 other statistics used in this Almanac.

The first one is Bookings per Week. For years, the general belief was that “everybody wrestled seven nights a week and twice on Sundays.” However, this was not the case for many territories at many times. Preliminary wrestlers were often booked less frequently than the main eventers. They may have still been physically present at shows when they weren’t booked; in some cases, they worked as a referee for some matches, or may have been on hand in case another wrestler had transportation issues or was injured and could not compete, or they may have just been there to watch and learn. Additionally, some of the top stars of certain territories, particularly if they were also an owner and/or booker for the territory, wrestled less frequently than the rest of the crew (Gene Kiniski in this territory at this time is a good example of this). By looking at the number of Bookings per Week for each wrestler in the territory, you get a better feel for how often a wrestler was booked compared to the rest of the crew.

Bookings per Week is shown in the same ‘speedometer’ fashion as the SPOT Rating. Here is the Bookings per Week for The Brute in this territory in 1973:



The differently shaded sections on this speedometer represent *quartiles*. Of the 35 wrestlers listed in the Roster section of this Almanac, the 25% with the highest number of bookings all had between 3.21 and 3.90 bookings per week, and that is the darkest level of shading on the speedometer. The next 25% had between 3.00 and 3.21 bookings per week. After that, the next 25% had between 2.22 and 3.00 bookings per week. And the bottom 25%, the lightest level of shading on the speedometer, had between 1.31 and 2.22 booking per week. For all intents and purposes, you should consider anyone in the top three quartiles to be “full-timers”. As for the rest, while they were all regulars in the territory, they could be considered “part-timers” and were likely either preliminary wrestlers or top stars who also owned and/or booked the territory.

This also gives us a general idea of how complete our records are. In this territory at this time, they were running house shows five or six nights a week (Sundays was typically an off day; Tuesdays they taped TV and may or may not have had regular house shows). If we had complete data, we’d expect the top wrestlers to have between 5 and 6 Bookings per Week. Since the wrestlers in the top quartile all had between 3.21 and 3.90 Bookings per Week, we can estimate that our records are around 65% complete.

The other statistic used in this Almanac is FLW, which stands for Feud Length in Weeks. It takes into account:

- 1) how many times a match between the same two (or four) wrestlers occur
- 2) where on the cards those matches take place (main events are weighted more than matches lower on the cards)
- 3) how those matches are distributed over time (if they are wrestling each other almost every night for a few weeks in a row, that would be weighted more than if they wrestled each other once a week or once every other week over a several-week period)

The output is meant to approximate how long the feud lasted across the territory. In this era, if a main event match drew well, the promoters and bookers would likely want to build to a rematch or even a series of rematches. The higher the FLW, the more likely that this was a feud that ‘clicked’ at the box office. An FLW Score of 3.00 or above is a pretty good indicator that the match in question was a “feud”.

For every wrestler listed in the Roster section, you will see other ring names they used (not a complete list, only well-known names), if they were a heel or babyface (and if/when that changed), their average weekly SPOT Rating, their Bookings per Week, the total number of weeks they were a regular in this territory, a chart showing which specific weeks they were booked at least once in the territory, and their biggest feuds based on FLW.

Also in this Almanac you will find:

- A map of the territory and a list of all known regular towns
- A list of other wrestlers not listed in the Roster section that were booked in the territory. This includes the traveling World champion, attractions like Haystack Calhoun or (in later years) Andre the Giant, women wrestlers, little persons, managers, and others
- A Roll Call of Champions
- A ranking of the top 12 wrestlers/teams
- A ranking of the top 8 feuds (with results and details for the 4 biggest feuds where available)
- Advertised lineups for all known house shows in the territory, featuring month-by-month calendars and results for select cities (with attendance where available)

With the results, I do not list any details regarding match outcomes; merely who won and who lost (or noting if it was a draw). While some newspapers listed detailed results from the matches indicating if a victory occurred by pin or disqualification and exactly what happened, others merely listed “Wrestler A beat Wrestler B”. That really doesn’t tell us much, and just because the newspaper *doesn’t* say a match ended via disqualification or other means, that doesn’t mean it didn’t. And even if it was a pinfall, it doesn’t necessarily mean it was a “clean victory”. If a heel wrestler won a main event by pinfall in this era, I’d be willing to wager there was some level of shenanigans involved.

I understand you might be used to having that additional information stating if victories were by disqualification or not. As mentioned a couple of paragraphs earlier, we do list detailed results (when available) for the biggest feuds in the territory each year. Oftentimes “what happened” during a match early on in a feud directly leads to the stipulations for the next match in the series. In these cases, we want to have that level of detail as it helps us follow along with the feud.

If you really think about it, the SPOT Rating gives us a better feel for who the top stars were than wins and losses do. If Sean Regan beat The Brute in the main event of a wrestling card, the most important takeaway isn’t that The Brute *lost* the match, it’s that he *was in the main event*.

The SPOT Rating, as well as the other statistics used in this Almanac, were compiled using the largest possible collection of house show records. Many of them had previously been lost to history for decades. Over the last few years, I have collected these through a variety of sources, from online newspaper archives to traveling across the country and visiting local libraries and state archives. The overwhelming majority of house shows listed in this Almanac come from originally sourced material; there are only a handful of cards where I copied and pasted information found on websites or in other books. My records are not complete, but they are more complete (and accurate) than any other source. That’s a bold statement, but it’s a true statement.

If you happen to have any information on house shows from this territory during this time period that are not listed in this Almanac, feel free to reach out to me on Twitter @AlGetzWrestling and let me know. While I have made every effort to thoroughly proofread and vet the information in this Almanac, it is possible I got something wrong. If you think I made a mistake, please let me know; but be warned I am going to ask you to ‘show your work’. If your only source is something you saw online, chances are that during my research I saw the same thing you did and am reasonably certain that my information is correct.

ABOUT THE TERRITORY

Since 1968, All-Star Wrestling had been run by Sandor Kovacs and Gene Kiniski. Pacific Northwest Wrestling promoter Don Owen had some level of involvement as well. Vance Nevada's book *Wrestling in the Canadian West* states that Owen was listed as a co-promoter in some programs shortly after Kovacs took over, but Vance also mentions that several of the wrestlers did not believe that Owen had any financial stake in the parent company started by Kovacs, called Northwest Wrestling Promotions.

Given that Owen was peripherally involved in some fashion, it should be no surprise that All-Star Wrestling maintained a very strong relationship with its neighbor to the south, Pacific Northwest Wrestling based out of Portland. Wrestlers from the Portland crew would occasionally come up to wrestle in British Columbia, generally on Monday nights for the weekly Vancouver cards. And wrestlers from All-Star could sometimes be found competing in Oregon, generally on the weekly Saturday night cards in Portland.

In between British Columbia and Oregon lay Washington state. For many years, Harry Elliott promoted cards in Seattle for Don Owen. In the late 1960s, Pacific Northwest Wrestling lost their television in the market. Not long after Sandor Kovacs took over All-Star Wrestling, he purchased Seattle from Elliott and ran the town regularly, along with cards in Tacoma and Spokane and spot shows in some smaller Washington towns. By the spring of 1973, however, the Washington shows dried up. Dean Silverstone, who had been promoting some of the spot towns in Washington and printing the programs for many of the cities in All-Star Wrestling's territory, made a proposal to Kovacs, Kiniski, and Owen to "re-open" Washington with Silverstone actively promoting the towns in the state and expanding their television presence. His proposal was rejected. In the book *"I Ain't No Pig Farmer!"*, written by Silverstone and Scott Teal, Dean mentions that in later years he learned that while Kovacs and Kiniski were on board with his proposal, Don Owen was not. The fallout from this would lead to Dean starting his own promotion, Super Star Championship Wrestling, in September 1973.

In addition to being a partner in All-Star Wrestling, Kiniski had also been wrestling for the promotion regularly. Since losing the NWA World Heavyweight title to Dory Funk Jr. in 1969, Kiniski wrestled in his "home base" more often than he had when traveling around the world defending the World title. He would still make appearances in other territories, but they were not as frequent. As we get into 1973, however, it does appear that Kiniski reduced his in-ring schedule, perhaps so he could focus on the business side of things when at home in British Columbia. He was a staple of the Monday night cards in Vancouver but did not appear as often in the other cities in the territory. On average, he was booked to wrestle on shows less than half as often as most of the "regulars" in the territory.

In late 1972, one of the wrestlers brought in to work Vancouver was a man named Michael Davis, who had been wrestling as The Skull in Portland. With Kiniski not wrestling full-time and the territory's other top heel, "Bulldog" Bob Brown, about to leave the territory, Gene asked Don Owen if Davis would be interested in coming to work for All-Star full time. In his autobiography, *Brute Power*, co-written with Ian Douglass, Davis states that originally, he didn't want to go, but Owen convinced him to give it a try. Davis ended up having a wildly successful two-year run in Vancouver as The Brute.

MAP OF THE TERRITORY

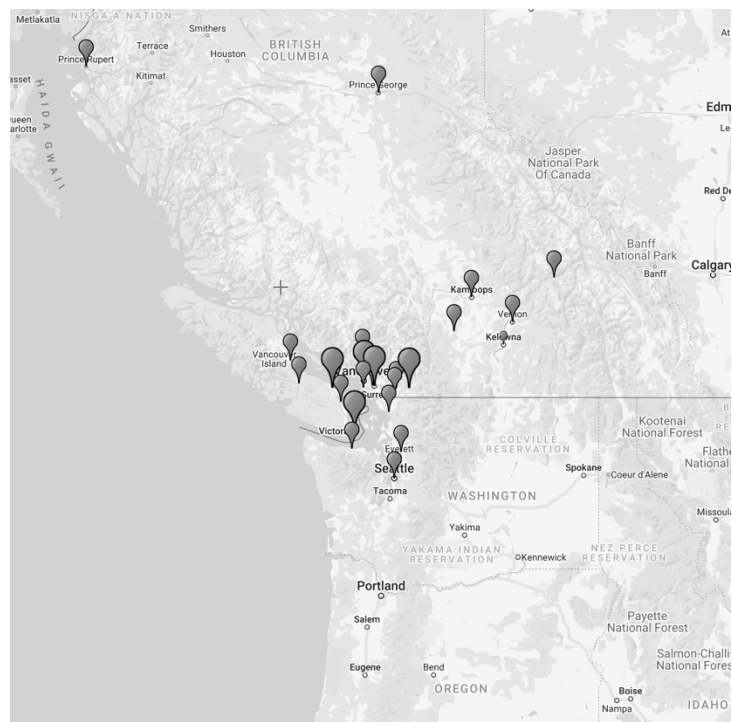

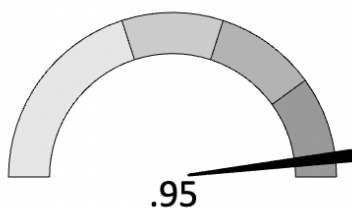

MAIN EVENTERS

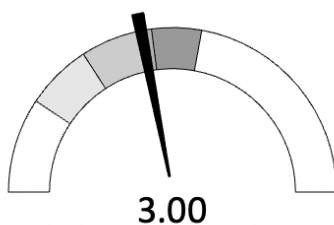
Wrestlers with an average weekly SPOT Rating between .80 and 1.00 are considered Main Eventers. This means they are usually (but not always) in the main events of the shows they're booked to wrestle on. These are generally the biggest stars of the territory, the champions, top contenders, and wrestlers with the proven ability to put 'butts in seats' when given the opportunity. Within this list, wrestlers with a SPOT Rating above .90 should be considered the top tier stars in this territory at the time they were here.

Wrestlers are listed in alphabetical order (usually by their first name). At the end of this section, the same wrestlers are listed in descending order by their SPOT Rating.

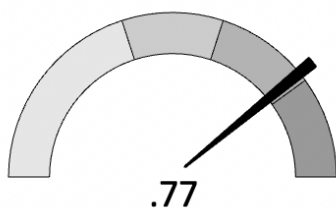
UPPER MID-CARDERS

Wrestlers with an average weekly SPOT Rating between .60 and .80 are considered Upper Mid-Carders. This means they are generally booked in the upper half of the cards, sometimes (but not usually) in the main event. Often, secondary champions of some territories will be in this category. You may also find wrestlers who are 'on their way up' the cards, starting lower on the cards and moving up to the main events. Those weeks spent moving up ("getting pushed") will affect their weekly average SPOT Rating.

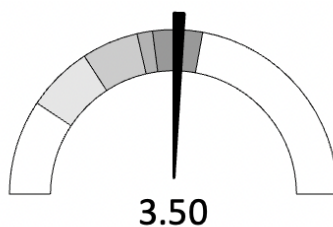

MID-CARDERS

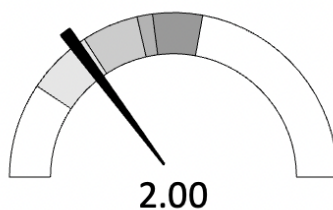
Wrestlers with an average weekly SPOT Rating between .40 and .60 are considered Mid-Carders. They are generally booked in the middle portion of the cards, perhaps occasionally being featured in higher profile matches in smaller towns. These wrestlers should generally be seen as less than “championship caliber”, though they are usually capable of winning televised matches and are given some semblance of a “push”.

Wrestlers are listed in alphabetical order (usually by their first name). At the end of this section, the same wrestlers are listed in descending order by their SPOT Rating.

PRELIMINARY WRESTLERS

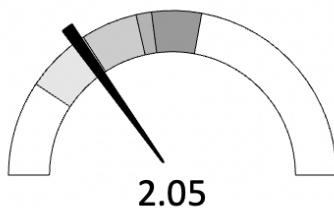
Wrestlers with an average weekly SPOT Rating below .40 are considered Preliminary Wrestlers. These are wrestlers usually found on the losing end of televised matches. They are generally booked in the opening matches of house shows. More often than not, they wrestle against other preliminary wrestlers on the house shows, trading wins and losses with “evenly-matched” competition. As such, we do NOT use the j-word when discussing their role.

Wrestlers are listed in alphabetical order (usually by their first name). At the end of this section, the same wrestlers are listed in descending order by their SPOT Rating.

OTHER WRESTLERS APPEARING IN THE TERRITORY

In addition to the full-time members of the roster, many wrestlers came in for brief stays. As with most territories, the NWA World Heavyweight champion made occasional appearances in the territory, as did a few other wrestlers with a national profile. Other wrestlers coming to territories for brief periods of time included the so-called “special attractions”: women wrestlers, little persons (both male and female), and even the occasional four-legged creature.

ROLL CALL OF CHAMPIONS

The following lists all known championships and titleholders in the territory in 1973. Keep in mind that wrestling in the territorial era was often not “linear”; what is acknowledged in one town (or more accurately, TV market) is often not acknowledged in another area or perhaps is not acknowledged until a later date. This can include title changes. Also, the concept of titles being “held up” can sometimes refer to a town-specific angle to build to a rematch and may not be acknowledged in other markets.

- Dutch Savage & Steven Little Bear are billed as champions for a title defense on January 22nd, but there is no further information on how they acquired the titles
- The Brute & Mike Webster beat Savage & Little Bear on January 22nd in Vancouver to win the titles

KNOWN HOUSE SHOWS

A “known house show” is one for which I have either:

- a) obtained some form of publicly available documentation (newspaper ads, articles, programs, etc.) listing the date of the show, the location, and at least some information about who was scheduled to appear; or
- b) found a listing for the card from a respectable source and made sure it passed the ‘sniff test’

Usually, we have the full card but there are rare occasions where we only know some of the matches, or only know what wrestlers are scheduled to appear.

Of the 183 house shows listed in this Almanac, 162 of them come from my original research. A small number of match results in the “Top 8 Feuds” section came from wrestlingdata.com.
