

Teresa reported on the status of the website. We will have to start anew. Discussed the hosting & domain costs. Concurrance that they are reasonable.


Teresa proposed having programs at the General Meetings. Will need to have a program director.

CANINE HEALTH CARE

The Emotional Intelligence of Dogs

Current trends in dog lover language has increasingly identified dog owners as dog parents, dog moms, and dog dads. This transition from pet owner to dog parent connotes a higher level of relationship—potentially similar to the way we relate to our children in the amount of love we feel, the quality of our communication, complexity of interactions, and overall care we provide.

But are dogs actually able to relate back to us in an intellectual manner that reflects the sophistication of how we think we are interacting with them? Some scientists in the past have poo-pood the idea that dogs are intellectually advanced and that their master ability was specific to exceptional reading of body language, facial expression, and physical cues.

In "The Kindness of Canines" Emily Joshu reviews the work of several researchers including Carl Safina, Ph.D. an endowed professor at Stony Brook University. Dr. Safina reports that in recent years researchers have, in fact, learned that dogs are not only kind but actually **empathetic**. "Empathy is the ability of a mind to match the mood of another mind." Empathy is not an independent feeling, it is on a continuum anchored by sympathy and compassion with compassion being the most proactive. Interestingly, empathy has been considered a feeling/ability exclusive to humans only. Modern research, however, has uncovered that dog's capacity for empathic behavior is actually very strong and is the reason they can be so responsive to human emotions.

Numerous well controlled research studies have examined large samples of everyday house dogs and found significant evidence of their ability to emphathize with their owner. Taking this idea closer to home, most of us have personally experienced our dog coming to sit next to us quietly and laying by our side when he have experienced great sadness or tears. We also know the work of therapy dogs and their incredible ability to connect with sick children and the elderly in nursing homes.

According to Stanley Coren, a professor emeritus at Stanford University, "the average dog has a mind equivalent to the human mind at age 2-2.5 years old, and

superdogs have a mind equivalent to the human mind at age 2–3 years old. Even more astonishing, while dogs are able to empathize, human children only begin developing the capacity for empathy at approximately the age of 4.

This finding was supported in a landmark study in 2018 called "Timmy's in the Well: Empathy and Prosocial Helping in Dogs" where owners stayed behind a clear door where their dogs could see and hear them. Then owners were asked to either hum or cry and the researchers found that when the owner cried, their dog pushed through the door to emotionally rescue and support them three times faster then when they hummed.

Guess I really am a dog mom!
