#### **Committee Reports:**

From Catherine Neighbor:

(This is a post I did for one of the dog groups I'm a moderator for. Good info for all dog lovers tho)

Gender: Does it matter?

Hey Gang, for those who don't know me, I'm the behaviorist of the group. My degree emphasized Animal Behavior and Psychology from Texas A&M university, and I've been training dogs for over 20 years now (I specialize in aggression, severe abuse case, and very young puppies). I stopped counting how many dogs I've trained when I hit 2500, and that was back in 2003. I'm telling you this just so you know I really DO know what I'm talking about on this subject — I will go into more why I'm stressing this later...

The question came up in the group — does gender matter in regards to 2 dogs? I want to say it unequivocally DOES matter. 2 boys will work things out. A boy and a girl will work things out. 2 girls a lot of times will friggin KILL each other!!


The problem is based in hierarchy. In the canine world, there's no such thing as equality. Someone is either above or below. If we put dominance on a scale of 1 to 10, (1 being the most submissive, 10 being the most dominant), If you have 1 dog who is a 2 and 1 dog who is an 8, there will be no problem, because it's very clear who's above and below. The problem arises when you have 2 5's or a 4 and a 6, or a 5 and a 6, or a 4 and a 5. Then it is a lot murkier who is above and below, and in the case of girls, this is where the big drop down drag outs happen. One says 'NO!' And then the other says 'Oh no you DIDN'T!' And that's when it's ON.... And I will tell you age has no factor in this. I've seen 8-10 week old puppies doing this (usually from the same litter). I've seen girls that have gotten along for YEARS all of a sudden start this because something has happened to change the hierarchy (can be something as big as another canine sibling who was the top dog passing away to something as small as one of the girls starting to get a bit stiffer due to arthritis). I will tell you from experience — you can have 2 girls that have been TOTALLY FINE for 6-7 YEARS, and then end up with this problem. No, it doesn't happen with EVERY set of 2 girls. But it happens often enough for me to say it's not worth the risk. Do NOT purposely go out and get 2 girl dogs.

Breeders — I will tell you I deal with this problem at least once every other month. If you do not already have a policy of not selling a female pup to a home who already has a female, I highly recommend you start. As good breeders, we want our dogs to go into forever homes. This is a good way to avoid returns later. And as spectacular as doodles are, they are STILL dogs. They STILL abide by the canine hierarchy thing, and yes I HAVE seen this problem arise with a doodle. Personally, this is one of the big issues I wish all breeders knew about, as well as all rescue groups and shelters. It would save people a LOT of heartache....

Now, every time I've talked about this issue, I get all kinds of comments 'Well look at how my 2 girls love each other!' Complete with cuddle pictures.... and I will say, that's great, for YOU. But this is why I went over my experience level in the beginning of this post - I used to train trainers, and I will tell you what I told them — you haven't even scratched the surface on what's out there until you have personally worked with at least 100 of them. If you only keep girls, and you haven't encountered this yet, consider yourself VERY lucky. I hope you are never the owner who has to just sit outside your front door and cry while your 2 girls are having a 15 minute fight that you couldn't break up (Yes, this DID happen to one of my owners. And it was a lab and a golden retriever, by the way. Both dogs ended up in the hospital, and then they rehomed the younger one which was what I suggested in the first place before this incident). So please don't post your 'my 2 girls love each other' pictures. It is NOT going to

change my opinion. It will just make me pray for you that nothing ever changes between your girls....

But if you're considering adding a dog and you are thinking 2 girls are a good choice, please please please reconsider. You may very well be saving yourself a LOT of heartache (and vet bills!).
