# Bartonella and Why it's a Danger to Us and Our Dogs

Bartonella is identified as a pathogen—meaning that it is an organism that causes disease to its host. It is a particularly, sneaky bacteria because it is able to evade the immune system's launch of white blood cells to attack it by hiding inside its host's red blood cells

and blood vessel walls. As a result, it can go undetected by standard blood tests that look for elevated white blood cell counts as a marker of infection.

Bartonellosis, the condition of being infected with the Bartonella bacteria, is transmitted by fleas, lice, sand flies, and ticks. Mammals serve as good hosts including dogs, coyotes, raccoons, cows, foxes, horses, rodents, humans, and particularly cats. In cats, it is identified with the disease "Cat Scratch Fever" that produces fatigue and swollen lymph nodes. Interestingly, cats can carry high volumes of Bartonella without the expression of symptoms. In contrast, dogs, can experience a a myriad of severe symptoms that can be difficult to correlate (i.e., vomiting, diarrhea, limping, seizures, weakness, paralysis, and inflammation of the heart valves).

Detecting Bartonellosis is further complicated by its

ability to incubate in the body for long periods of time without symptom expression. As a result, cause and effect are often never linked. For example, if you find a tick and pull it out then develop mild flu-like symptoms within 3-30 days you may quickly deduce that you should get tested for Lyme's Disease. Unfortunately, with Bartonellosis, the host can get bit by a flea infested cat but not develop symptoms for many years later when their immune system is being stressed by another health or psychosocial stressor. Not too many of us will think back and remember "Oh yah, that's right—I was bit by a cat when I was 12—that must be the reason I'm having skeletal and joint problems today."

A leader in the field of Bartonella research is Dr. Edward B. Breitschwerdt who is the Melanie S. Steele Professor of Medicine and Infectious Disease at North Carolina State University (NCSU) College of Veterinary Medicine. He is also an adjunct professor of medicine at Duke University Medical Center, and a Diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine (ACVIM). He directs the Intracellular Pathogens Research Laboratory at NCSU and identifies Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) as a means for obtaining a more accurate diagnosis of Bar-

tonellosis than standard blood tests. He identifies the Bartonella bacteria as a "a really smart bad guy." Treatment requires long durations of antibiotics and according to the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), no antibiotic or combination of antibiotics have been found to com-



pletely clear Bartonella from the bloodstream.

If all of that isn't scary enough, Bartonella may also be linked to Hemangiosarcoma—a common canine cancer. Research conducted by Dr. Breitschwerdt found a high prevalence of Bartonella in tumors and tissue samples taken from 110 dogs with Hemangiosarcoma. Intuitively, these findings make sense as Bartonella hides in blood vessel walls and Hemangiosarcoma is a cancer of endothelial cells, the cells that line blood vessels. Hemangiosarcoma usually occurs in middle-aged and older dogs and certain breeds tend to have some higher risk (i.e., Golden Retrievers, German Shepherds, Labrador Retrievers, English Setters, Boxers, and Doberman Pinschers.

According to Dr. Breitschwerdt, Bartonella dates back to the Egyptian Pharaohs, 3000-4000 years ago, and will likely require the development of a vaccine to prevent it. In the meantime, he recommends that dog owners need to be vigilant in their practice of flea an tick control and consult with their veterinarian. In fact, he recommends year-round preventive treatment for fleas and ticks.



# What are the signs/symptoms of "Cat Scratch Fever?

\*\*\*\*\*\*

The most common signs of cat scratch fever are swelling of the lymph glands closest to the exposure site, a slightly elevated temperature, fatigue, and headaches. Caused by Bartonella bacterial infection transmitted through the saliva of infected cats. Blisters may appear



at the exposure site accompanied by nausea and vomiting.
