

Canine Flu 2023

Information about Canine Flu and Canine Flu 2023 guidelines from Diane Schultz, the Director of AKC Obedience, Rally & Tracking.



here are a lot of unknowns about this newest canine illness. We should all do our best to work to avoid the spread of this disease by following some basic recommendations:

- Keep your dog up to date on vaccines, including but not limited to Bordetella. Parainfluenza, and Canine Influenza, and avoid direct contact with other dogs.
- If your dog has been exposed to a dog with an upper respiratory illness, but is showing no symptoms, it is recommended you quarantine that dog for a minimum of 2 weeks. Do not take it to any areas where other dogs will be.
- If your dog has been exposed to a dog with an upper respiratory illness, and is showing symptoms, it is recommended you quarantine that dog for a minimum of 4 weeks after all symptoms have passed. Do not take it to any areas where dogs will be.

Absolutely do not take your dog to any events if it is showing signs of respiratory illness such as coughing, sneezing, wheezing, any nasal discharge, lack of energy, or difficulty breathing.

Out of an abundance of caution, for Obedience events, clubs should provide hand wipes for judges and stewards to use between dogs. Stewards may wear gloves to handle individual dog equipment including dumbbells, gloves, and scent articles.

What is Canine Influenza?

Dog flu, or canine influenza virus, is a highly contagious respiratory disease caused by an influenza A virus, similar to the viral strains that cause influenza in people. There are two known strains of dog flu found in the United States: H3N8, H3N2,

How Is Canine Influenza Spread?

Respiratory secretions escape into the environment in the form of coughing, barking, and sneezing, where they are then inhaled by a new canine host. It is also spread through contaminated objects and environments, like water bowls, collars, and kennel surfaces, or through contact with people who have had direct contact with an infected dog.

Symptoms of Dog Flu

Cases range from mild to severe and, unlike human influenzas, are not seasonal. Keep an eye out for the following symptoms year-round:

- Coughing
- Sneezing
- Nasal discharge
- Purulent nasal discharge
- Runny eyes
- Fever
- Lethargy
- Difficulty breathing

Dog flu symptoms resemble kennel cough symptoms.

There are vaccines available for both the H3N8 and H3N2 strains of canine influenza. Your vet may recommend the vaccine based on your lifestyle.

UnderDog Agility League

Love Agility? Come check out the Agility League! Winter season enrollment opens on December 14th and will remain open through January 7th. Winter Season will run Jan 15, 2024 - April 9, 2024.



hat is Agility League? The AKC Agility League adds a fun and exciting way for agility enthusiasts to train and compete on teams, giving a new aspect to what is an individual sport. The league provides an opportunity to compete safely in a recreational format on your home training field while sharing the experience with competitors around the country and earning regional and national rankings.

How does it work?

Tri-Cities Agility Barn is looking to form 3 or more League/ teams. League/teams size is three to eight dogs. League/ teams may be a mix of Regular, Preferred and Veterans dogs and a mix of jump heights.

Skill divisions are offered in Freshman (dogs who have not earned titles yet); Sophomore (dogs that have earned Novice or Open titles); and Senior (dogs with Excellent or above titles).

League/teams may have a mix of levels on the same team because dogs may compete up in level. For instance, a Freshman dog may compete on a Senior team, but a Senior dog cannot compete on a Freshman team. But all dogs on the team must be judged and scored by the level which the team is enrolled. So, all dogs on a Senior team are judged and scored by the Senior fault system, regardless of individual skill level of the dogs.

Tri-Cities Agility Barn will set up a course every two weeks. Teams will come to run the course at 2720 S 38th Ave, West Richland, WA 99353. Courses will be available the Wed after they are released by 4 pm and will stay up until the following Monday at 8 pm. Scores for each course must be reported by 11:59 pm EST by the team's scribe on the Sunday before the next Round's course map is released.

If we get more than 3 teams, we may open additional dates to run the course. In past the past season we have had runs on the first Wed and Sunday of a round. We have allowed folks to work together to schedule additional times as needed.

How will I know if my dog and I are ready to compete?

The League is designed for dogs that are competing or just about ready to make their trial debut.

Not quite ready?

That is what UnderDog League is all about. Many folks are learning the last few obstacles they need to enter a trial. None of our teams are trying to climb the rankings. We are all about learning, having fun, and enjoying the sport!

The following equipment/skills are helpful for a successful season of League participation: Tunnel Tire, Jump Board, Jumps, Dog Walk, Flat work Teeter, Pause Table, A-frame, Weave Poles, Single Bar Jumps, Double Bar Jumps, Triple Bar Jumps.

Cost: AKC Charges \$25 for participation for the year and then \$30 each 12 week season. Tri-Cities Agility Barn charges \$12 per course one course per 2 week round. The cost for the season would be \$72. Total cost to both AKC and Tri-Cities Agility Barn is between \$97-\$127.
