





Congregation Connection

Dear Brothers and sisters in Christ

Outreach Updates: First off, the Christmas Shoe Box Ministry will wind up Nov 17th. We will be packing boxes of the loose donated items the week before. We especially need health items such as socks in various sizes, tooth brushes, combs, soap and washcloths. We also need the main toys for the boxes and school supplies. Lists of ideas are available at the table in the narthex along with boxes if you wish to make a family event and pack a few yourself. Shipping is still \$10.00 - please make checks out to our Church noting it is for shipping Shoe boxes. If you wish to track your box, directions are on the labels and we just need to note you have already paid so we don't pay twice.

I met with the other coordinators of Family Promise recently and they had several suggestions. Many have voiced that they feel disconnected as we are no longer cooking and sitting down with the families. With over 35 people to serve daily, with different schedules it is just too difficult to sit them at once and eat together. Also, meals are no longer cooked and brought in due to health department concerns and family preferences. I have been alternating between bringing Pizzas (takes 10) and Frozen party meals. Due to our limited storage I shop the day I take it to them. There is room for a frozen meal or two at church so feel free to drop things off yourself. I will post a picture of the new QR code on the clipboard in the narthex with their list of pantry needs. I try to do a drive quarterly for those items and have been able to provide 2 meals a month thanks to everyone's generous donations. If you would like to provide a meal please use the QR code or see me. They also would love it if people dropped by desserts such as cookies or cupcakes, which could be done anytime without needing to sign up. This would be a great way to feel connected with the families. Please see me if you have questions. Our next meal will be Pizza on Monday Nov 10th - Will need Salads. And Friday Nov 14th party size Lasagna (need 4) French bread with garlic spread, and salad. Please let me know if you can help these days. There will be a sign-up sheet on the clipboard in the narthex.

Thanks so much to everyone who helps with these missions. You are touching so many with

your gifts.
