

From the Pastor's Desk....

"Peace be with you." – Jesus to the disciples that first Easter evening

Do you have that "happy place?" That place where you go to retreat, get away, find sabbath or quiet?

Or maybe it's a thing you do...work out, go for a run, take a nap, walk the dog, read a book or have a cold beer.

Or maybe it's a thing you use...cross necklace, rosary, lucky rabbit's foot, security blanket.

What is it...where is it...how is it...that you find peace? The older I get and the more of life I experience the more certain I am that we are designed to be at peace. Except much of our lives call us away from that. Good day everyone! I want to give you an update on how we are helping families here in our community through Family Promise. As of this week there are 5 families that make up 21 people at the Family Promise facility. Our Cook team is scheduled for Monday April 15th and Friday May 31st to cook. They provide the ingredients and we just cook and deliver it to the families. Last time we were able to also provide them EVERYTHING on their pantry list thanks to so many generous donations. Again I am going to provide a box in the Narthex where you can pick up a copy of their list of needs and then drop off items. Since churches are only providing meals 3 days a week their pantry list helps fill the gaps and the other 4 days. Cash donations designated to the Family Promise fund are used to complete the list when we inventory what items have been donated. CONGREGATIONAL DISASTER PREPAREDNESS

The Congregation Council has decided to develop a Disaster Response Plan using the ELCA Congregational Disaster Preparedness Guidebook, which can be found at the ELCA web site searching for disaster response guidebook.

The purpose of this is to provide a plan for answering the "what if ... and what do we do now" questions in the event of any type of disaster, be it a fire, storm damage or other situation that impacts our ability to operate and or serve the wider community. The guidebook provides a step-by-step process for us to create a plan unique to our situation.

This is no small task and too much for the council to do by itself. That said, we are in need of volunteers to serve as a collaborative team in the development of the plan so that the congregation is ready to respond to a threat of and actual impact of a disaster.

We joyfully celebrate the installation of Christ Lutheran's new Allen digital organ GX-215 with Genisys voices. May it be used in praise and worship for many years. God has provided this instrument through the generosity of all his children and special designated gifts. It was purchased through the Allen Organ Studio in Atlanta. Owner Jeff Ayers personally oversaw the installation, voicing, and initial instruction. Dr. Henry Lewis headed the selection process.

We also give thanks for the instruments that have been given to God's glory from 1992 to 2024. How God works----Pastor Mark Christoffersen was getting a haircut around the time our church was being built in 1992. In his conversation at the salon, he said that Christ Lutheran needed an organist. Hair stylist April Dinkins said, "My mother is an organist." Indeed her mother Wanda Brumfield became the first organist at CLC and moved her personal Hammond organ into the sanctuary, and April and her husband Dewayne became faithful choir members for many years. Upon Wanda's shoulder injury and retirement in 1996, she donated the organ to our church, and Diane Mulkey added organist to her choir director responsibilities.

In the early 2000's, Mary Couch, a former substitute organist at Good Shepherd Lutheran and an organist at St. John's Methodist Church, Gainesville, GA, was no longer able to play her organ because of limited eyesight. Through her friend Elaine Key, she wanted to donate her organ to our church and we gratefully accepted her gift of a Baldwin organ. Our Hammond organ moved on to another church in northeast Georgia. The Baldwin organ is a 1977 model and has served us well with some repairs by Weyman Holcomb until the past year. Besides Ms. Wanda and Diane Mulkey, substitute organists have played for our services including Carolyn Wierson, Mackie Brown, Rebecca Conatser of Christ the King, Cumming, GA, and even Phyllis Seibert, Pastor Andy's mother.

Our oak Kimball upright piano located in the fellowship hall was a gift from Doris Reynolds and family at the time the church was built. It was used in the sanctuary for many years. Brenda Clark donated her beautiful Yamaha ebony grand piano to Christ Lutheran when physical limitations kept her from playing it in her home. We appreciate these gifts and continue to use them to enhance worship.

Pastor Andy dedicated the new organ on Sunday, March 17 and it was played in our worship services for the first time. The WELCA ladies under the leadership of Zona Buchen and Nancy Garland hosted a celebratory reception in thankfulness for all of God's good gifts and specifically our new organ.

COMMUNITY FOOD PANTRY

In January the Pantry served 247 households and 238 in February. As of the end of February our congregation has donated \$1,777.14 to the Pantry.

Recently, after deliberation, the Board of the South Hall Food Pantry, which consists of two voting members from each of the churches serving at the pantry, decided to move towards becoming a "Choice Pantry" from a "Pre-packaged Pantry" (food that is already bagged and given to those in need). This transition will be done under the guidance and financial help of the Georgia Mountain Food Bank and is expected to occur by midyear. The goal of this change is multifaceted, to better serve those in need, reduce waste (food that some clients may not want, use or need) and reduce the financial pressure on the pantry's resources. This transition will be a challenge, change is not easy and tough decisions await. Please keep the Pantry in your prayers.
