ORDINANCE 718-25

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF OCEAN GATE, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING CHAPTER 140 OF THE BOROUGH CODE ENTITLED "ADRIAN HALL," TO ADD A NEW SECTION 140-6, ENTITLED "HOURLY RENTAL RATES WHERE REPEATED REGULAR USE IS SCHEDULED BY ONE APPLICANT"

WHEREAS, the Borough of Ocean Gate ("Borough") has established regulations and fees for the use of Adrian Hall by members of the public; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Borough recognizes that certain requests for use of Adrian Hall may not be adequately addressed by the standard rental structure set forth in the Borough Code; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body wishes to authorize the ability to adopt hourly rates in circumstances where repeated regular use is scheduled by one applicant;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Ocean Gate, County of Ocean, and State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 140, entitled "Adrian Hall," is hereby amended to include a new section 140-6, entitled "Hourly rental rates where repeated regular use is scheduled by one applicant" which shall read as follows:

- § 140-6 Hourly rental rates where repeated regular use is scheduled by one applicant.
 - A. A separate hourly rental rate of \$50.00 per hour is hereby established for recurring use or special uses of Adrian Hall. This hourly rate shall be applied where an applicant seeks to use the facility on a repeated basis.
 - B. All other rules, deposits, application requirements, and conditions of use set forth in this Chapter shall remain applicable to rentals made pursuant to this section.

SECTION 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall take effect after second reading and publication as required by law.

ORDINANCE 719-25

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF OCEAN GATE, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING CHAPTER 487 OF THE BOROUGH CODE ENTITLED "RENTAL DWELLINGS," TO ADD A NEW ARTICLE IV, ENTITLED "LANDLORD RENTAL RESPONSIBILITY"

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40:48-2 et seq. provides in relevant part that a municipality may make, amend, repeal and enforce ordinances not contrary to the laws of this state or of the United States, as it may deem necessary and proper for the good government, order and protection of persons and property, and for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the municipality and its inhabitants; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Borough of Ocean Gate has determined that it is important for landlords to abide by certain standards of responsibility in the selection of tenants and the supervision of rental premises; and WHEREAS, the State Legislature has provided the authority to provide such regulation and require landlord responsibility, in certain circumstances, for the consequences of disorderly behavior by their tenants, in N.J.S.A. 40:48-2.12n et seq.; and

WHEREAS, the Borough has determined that providing such regulation will benefit the public health, safety and welfare;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Governing Body of the Borough of Ocean Gate, County of Ocean and State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 487, entitled "Rental Dwellings," is hereby amended to include a new Article IV, entitled "Landlord Rental Responsibility" which shall read in its entirety as follows:

Article IV - Landlord Rental Responsibility

§ 487-56 Purpose

The purpose of this Article is to enable the Borough of Ocean Gate to take effective action to assure that excesses arising from irresponsible rentals, when they occur, shall not be repeated, and that landlords be held to sufficient standards of responsibility in order to preserve the peace and tranquility of the Borough of Ocean Gate for its permanent residents.

§ 487-57 Definitions

As used in this Article, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

HEARING OFFICER

A licensed attorney of the State of New Jersey appointed by the governing body, who shall not be an owner or lessee of any real property within the Borough of Ocean Gate, nor hold any interest in the assets of or profits arising from the ownership or lease of such property.

LANDLORD

The person or persons who own or purport to own a building in which there is rented or offered for rent housing space for living or dwelling under either a written or oral lease which building contains no more than four dwelling units. In the case of a mobile home park, "landlord" shall mean the owner of an individual dwelling unit within the mobile home park.

SUBSTANTIATED COMPLAINT

A complaint for a violation of any provision of Title 2C of the New Jersey Statutes or any municipal ordinance governing disorderly conduct, upon or in proximity to any rental premises, and attributable to the acts or incitements of any of the tenants of those premises which has been substantiated by prosecution and conviction in any court of competent jurisdiction.

§ 487-58 Complaints.

If in any twenty-four-month period a specified number, which shall not be less than two complaints, on separate occasions, of conduct upon or in proximity to any rental premises, and attributable to the acts or incitements of any of the tenants of those premises, have been substantiated by prosecution and conviction in any court of competent jurisdiction as a violation of any provision of Title 2C of the New Jersey Statutes or any municipal ordinance governing disorderly conduct, the municipal governing body or any officer or employee of the municipality designated by the governing body for the purpose may institute proceedings to require the landlord of those premises to post a bond against the consequences of future incidents of the same character.

A. The governing body, or officer or employee designated pursuant to § 487-58 shall cause to be served upon the landlord, in person or by registered mail to the address appearing on the tax records of the Borough of Ocean Gate, notice advising of the institution of such proceedings, together with particulars of the substantiated complaints upon which those proceedings are based, and of the time and place at which a hearing will be held in the matter, which shall be in the municipal building, municipal court or other public place within the municipality, and which shall be no sooner than 30 days from the date upon which the notice is served or mailed.

B. In the event a tenant is convicted of any of the conduct described in § 487-58, the governing body, or officer or employee designated pursuant to § 487-58 shall cause notice advising that the conduct specified has occurred to be served on the landlord, in person or by registered mail, at the address appearing on the tax records of the Borough of Ocean Gate.

§ 487-60 Hearing; violations and penalties.

A. At the hearing convened pursuant to this Article, the Hearing Officer shall give full hearing to both the complaint of the Borough of Ocean Gate and to any evidence in contradiction or mitigation that the landlord, if present or represented and offering such evidence, may present. The Hearing Officer may consider, to the extent deemed relevant by the Hearing Officer, prior complaints about the residents of the property, even if those complaints did not result in a conviction. At the conclusion of the hearing, the Hearing Officer shall determine whether the landlord shall be required to post a bond in accordance with the terms of this Article.

- B. Any bond required to be posted shall be in accordance with the judgment of the Hearing Officer, in light of the nature and extent of the offenses indicated in the substantiated complaints upon which the proceedings are based, to be adequate in the case of subsequent offenses to make reparation for:
 - 1. Damages likely to be caused to public or private property and damages consequent upon disruption of affected residents' rights of fair use and quiet possession of their premises;

- 2. Securing the payment of fines and penalties likely to be levied for such offenses; and
- 3. Compensating the municipality for the costs of repressing and prosecuting such incidents of disorderly behavior; but no such bond shall be in an amount less than \$500 or more than \$5,000. The municipality may enforce the bond thus required by action in the Superior Court, and shall be entitled to an injunction prohibiting the landlord from making or renewing any lease of the affected premises for residential purposes until that bond or equivalent security, in satisfactory form and amount, has been deposited with the municipality.

C. A bond or other security deposited in compliance with this section shall remain in force for a period recommended by the Hearing Officer but not less than two nor more than four years. Upon the lapse of the specified period the landlord shall be entitled to the discharge thereof, unless prior thereto further proceedings leading to a forfeiture or partial forfeiture of the bond or other security shall have been had under § 487-60, in which case the security shall be renewed, in an amount and for a period that shall be specified by the Hearing Officer.

§ 487-61 Proceedings against landlord; recovery from tenant.

A. If, during the period for which a landlord is required to give security pursuant to § 487-60, a substantiated complaint is recorded against the property in question, the governing body or its designee may institute proceedings against the landlord for the forfeiture or partial forfeiture of the security, for an extension of the period for which such security is required, or for an increase in the amount of security required, or for any or all of those purposes.

B. Any forfeiture or partial forfeiture of security shall be determined by the Hearing Officer solely in accordance with the amount deemed necessary to provide for the compensatory purposes set forth in § 487-60. Any decision by the Hearing Officer to increase the amount or extend the period of the required security shall be determined in light of the same factors set forth in § 487-60 and shall be taken only to the extent that the nature of the substantiated complaint or complaints out of which proceedings

arise under this section indicates the appropriateness of such change in order to carry out the purposes of this Article effectually. The decision of the Hearing Officer in such circumstances shall be enforceable in the same manner as provided for in § 487-60.

C. A landlord may recover from a tenant any amounts of security actually forfeited as described in this section.

SECTION 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 3. If any section, subsection, paragraph or provision of this Ordinance shall be held to be invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall take effect after second reading and publication as required by law.

ORDINANCE 720-25

AN ORDINANCE TO REPEAL AND REPLACE ORDINANCE 720-25 AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF OCEAN GATE, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, IN ITS ENTIRETY AND ADOPTING PARKING RULES, AND REGULATIONS FOR THE BOROUGH OF OCEAN GATE, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Ocean Gate, County of Ocean, State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1. Parking ordinance shall be hereby established to reflect the following:

SECTION I GENERAL PROVISIONS

- A. DEFINITIONS: Whenever any words and phrases are used in this chapter, the meaning respectively ascribed to them in Subtitle I of Title 39 of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated shall be deemed to apply to such words and phrases used herein.
- B. REPEAL: All former parking ordinances of the Borough of Ocean Gate listed above are hereby repealed, and all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with or inconsistent with the provisions of this chapter are hereby repealed, except that this repeal shall not affect or prevent the prosecution or punishment of any person or any act done or committed in violation of any ordinance hereby repealed prior to the taking effect of this ordinance.
- C. OFFICIAL TIME STANDARD: Whenever certain hours are named in this ordinance; they shall mean either Eastern Standard Time or Eastern Daylight Savings Time as may be in current use.
- D. EFFECT OF ORDINANCE: If any parts of this ordinance are for any reason, held to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.
- E. REGULATIONS NOT EXCLUSIVE: The provisions of this ordinance imposing a time limit on parking shall not relieve any person of the duty to observe other, more restrictive, provisions prohibiting or limiting stopping or standing or parking of vehicles as set forth in N.J.S.A. 39:4-138, or any other New Jersey Statute or as hereafter provided.
- F. VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES: Unless another is expressly provided by New Jersey Statutes or expressly set forth herein, every person convicted of a violation of a provision of this ordinance or any supplement thereto shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Two Hundred Fifty (\$250.00) Dollars or imprisonment of fifteen (15) days or both.

SECTION II PARKING, STANDING, STOPPING

A. PARKING PROHIBITED AT ALL TIMES: No person shall park a vehicle at any time upon any streets or parts thereof indicated below:

- 1. No parking on Borough property where marked.
- 2. Asbury Avenue and Avalon Avenue between the "No Parking" signs From East Chelsea Avenue to the signs on Avalon Avenue).
- 3. Wildwood Avenue from E. Longport to the Boardwalk.
- 4. E. Bayview Avenue from Wildwood Avenue to Stone Harbor Avenue.
- 5. Anglessa Avenue from E. Longport to the Boardwalk.
- 6. East Cape May Avenue from Wildwood Avenue to Stone Harbor Avenue for ambulance access to the field for emergency airlifts.
- 7. Beach Place from Narragansette to Ocean Gate Borough town line.
- 8. Arverne Avenue within 50 feet, East and West of the two Firehouse Driveways.
- B. SEASONAL PARKING LIMITATIONS: No person shall park a vehicle at any time upon the streets indicated below during the times specifically described below:
 - 1. Narragansette Avenue from Boardwalk to East Longport- from June 15 through Labor Day.
 - 2. West Arverne (south side only) from Navasink Avenue to Ocean Gate Avenue between "No Parking" signs during times as indicated, in effect during the school year.

C. SEASONAL PARKING PERMIT DECALS:

- 1. Seasonal Parking Decals shall be issued by the Finance Department Clerk or an agent designated by the Borough Council of the Borough of Ocean Gate.
- 2. Seasonal Parking Decals shall be available to residents and non-residents at the Ocean Gate Municipal Building or the Wildwood Pier Beach between June 15 and Labor Day in accordance with the following rules and limitations:
- a. From January 1st to June 14th each year, individuals may purchase Seasonal Parking Decals at a discounted rate, the cost of the decal will be listed in the fees and fines ordinance.
- b. From June 15th to Labor Day, the cost of a Seasonal Parking Decal shall increase according to the fee and fines ordinance.
 - c. Parking Decals shall be permanently affixed on the OUTSIDE LEFT REAR WINDOW.
- D. SEASONAL PERMIT PARKING: From June 15 through Labor Day- No person shall park a vehicle on the streets, parts of streets and parking lots without a Seasonal Parking Decal as follows:
 - 1. East Longport from Asbury Avenue to the Boardwalk.
 - 2. East Chelsea Avenue from Asbury Avenue to the Boardwalk.
 - 3. Wildwood Avenue from Bayview Avenue to E. Longport Avenue where parking is allowed.
 - 4. Stone Harbor Avenue from East Bayview Avenue to the Boardwalk.
 - 5. Monmouth Avenue from East Bayview to the Boardwalk.

- 6. East Longport from Anglesea to the Boardwalk.
- 7. Newport Avenue from East Longport to the Boardwalk.
- 8. Borough Parking Lots:
 - a. Wildwood and East Longport Avenues.
 - b. East Bayview Avenue between Wildwood Avenue and Stone Harbor Avenue (Volunteers Park).
 - c. East Longport Avenue, west of Anglesea Avenue.

E. EMERGENCY PARKING

- 1. Emergency- No parking. Upon the declaration of an emergency, there shall be no parking upon the streets or sections of streets where temporary Emergency No Parking signs are displayed. The Chief of Police, or in his absence the ranking police officer is authorized to declare an emergency and direct the posting of said emergency no-parking signs when weather conditions, accidents, fires, and public celebrations dictate or require the avoidance of hazards or other conditions with the free flow of traffic. Notification that the Emergency- No Parking signs are being or will be posted shall be given to the operator or owner of any vehicle which has parked prior to the posting of the signs.
- 2. Whatever snow has fallen and the accumulation is such that it covers the street or highway, no vehicle shall be parked on either side of any Borough Street or portions thereof. The parking provisions herein shall remain in effect after the snow has ceased and until the streets have been plowed sufficiently to the extent that parking will not interfere with the normal flow of traffic.
 - 3. Any unoccupied vehicle parked or standing in violation of this ordinance shall be deemed a nuisance and menace to the safe and proper regulation of traffic and any police officer may provide for the removal of such vehicle. The owner shall pay the reasonable costs of removal and storage which may result from the removal before regaining possession of the vehicle.
 - 4. Violations of this section shall be subject to a fine as listed in the fees and fines ordinance.

F. RESTRICTED PARKING:

- 1. No person shall park within the borough on any public road, street or public parking area or designated municipal parking area any vehicle as listed below:
 - a. Motor Homes.
 - b. Motor Coaches.
 - c. Campers.
 - d. Boat or Water Craft Trailers with or without boat or watercraft.

- 2. No truck, tractor, trailer, semi-trailer or omnibus having a registered gross vehicle weight in excess of four (4) tons shall park on any street or parking lot within the Borough between the hours of 9:00 PM and 6:00 AM.
- 3. No bus or livery in excess of 10 passenger capacity shall park on any street or parking lot within the Borough between the hours of 9:00 PM and 6:00 AM.
- 4. Violation of this section shall be subject to a fine as listed in the fines and fees ordinance or imprisonment for a term not to exceed fifteen (15) days, or both. The Ocean Gate Police Department is hereby authorized to remove any such vehicle in violation of this section. Any towing and storage fees shall be the responsibility of the owner of the said vehicle.

G. SPECIAL PERMITS- TRUCKS OVER FOUR TONS:

Upon approval of the police department special daily permits may be issued for a maximum of seventy-two (72) hours for specific construction, renovation and/or building related activities that require overnight parking of a truck over four (4) tons gross vehicle weight. (The cost for a special permit is listed in the fines and fees ordinance)

H. MANNER OF PARKING:

- 1. Parking Lines Where there are lined parking spaces it shall be unlawful to park any vehicle across any line or marking designating a parking space or to park said vehicle in any way that the same will not wholly be within a parking space as designated by said markings.
- 2. Violations of this section shall be subject to as listed in the fines and fees ordinance.
- I. NO STOPPING OR STANDING: No person shall stop or stand a vehicle upon any of the streets or parts thereof indicated below:
 - 1. Ocean Gate Avenue the width of the street along the boardwalk.
 - 2. Ocean Gate Drive, West side from Point Pleasant Avenue to Chelsea Avenue.
 - 3. Navesink Avenue, west side, from Ocean Gate Drive to Lakewood Avenue.
 - 4. West Lakewood Avenue, north side, from Navesink Avenue to Ocean Gate Drive.
 - 5. Ocean Gate Drive, east side, from Point Pleasant Avenue to Navesink Avenue.
 - 6. Violations of this section shall be subject to a fine as listed in the fines and fees ordinance.

- 7. North side of W. Arverne Avenue, between No Stopping or Standing signs located within the School Zone.
- J. MUNICIPAL & GOVERNMENT OFFICIAL VEHICLE PARKING ONLY: East Longport Avenue directly the Wildwood Avenue-Comfort Station.

K. PARKING DISTANCE TO A STOP SIGN:

- 1. Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 39:4-138.6, the permissible distance a motor vehicle may be parked from a "Stop" sign is twenty-five (25) feet within the Borough of Ocean Gate.
- 2. This ordinance does not apply to Stop signs in the Borough of Ocean Gate located within a school zone and the permissible distance a motor vehicle may be parked from a "Stop" sign located within a school zone shall remain at fifty (50) feet, as mandated by N.J.S.A. 39:4-138(h).
- 3. Vehicles shall at all times comply with all other parking regulations, including but not limited to regulations on parking permits, street cleaning and parking along emergency snow routes.
- 4. The Borough of Ocean Gate shall not be required to install or maintain any markings, signs or other indications for permissible parking distances; it shall be incumbent upon the driver to ensure that their vehicle is parked within the permissible parking distance at any time.

- 6. Violations of this section shall be subject to a fine as listed in the fines and fees ordinance.

Section 2. INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES:

All other Ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed as to such inconsistency.

SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY:

If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence or other part of this Ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of this Ordinance, but shall be confined in its effect to the section, subsection, paragraph, sentence or other part of this Ordinance directly involved in the controversy in which said judgment shall have been rendered and all other provisions of this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

BE IT ORDAINED by the BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF OCEAN GATE, IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby authorized as general improvements to be undertaken in and by the Borough of Ocean Gate, in the County of Ocean, New Jersey (the "Borough"). For the improvements or purposes described in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$435,000, said sum being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefor, including the sum of \$21,750 as the down payment for said purposes as required by the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1 et seq. The improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby authorized as water utility improvements to be undertaken in and by the Borough of Ocean Gate, in the County of Ocean, New Jersey (the "Borough"). For the improvements or purposes described in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$2,000,000, said sum being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefor. 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Borough of Ocean Gate Corrective Action Plan for Calendar Year 2024 Audit

FINDING/RECOMMENDATION # 24-01:

Finding 24-01

There were deferred charges to future taxation unfunded balances as of December 31, over five years old.

Criteria:

Upon authorization of capital projects, the Borough establishes deferred charges for the cost of the capital projects to be raised by future taxation. Funded deferred charges relate to permanent debt issued, when unfunded deferred charges relate to temporary or nonfunding of the authorized cost of capital projects. According to N.J.S. 40A:2-4, the Borough may levy taxes on all taxable property within its jurisdiction to repay its debt. The Borough raises the debt requirements for its debt in its current budget as funds are raised thereby reducing the deferred charges.

Recommendation:

That the deferred charges over five years old be funded either by borrowing or by raising the funds in the next succeeding budget cycle.

Management's Response

The deferred charges will be funded during 2025.

Implementation Date – 2025

Finding 24-02

The analyses of capital fund cash includes cash deficits for ordinances over 5 years old.

Criteria:

Deficits arise when expenditures are incurred and paid on projects for which the funding has yet to be fully provided but other funds on deposit are available to cover the expenditures until the full funding is achieved.

Recommendation:

That cash deficits identified in the analyses of capital fund cash be funded.

Management's Response:

The cash deficits identified in the capital fund will be funded.

Implementation Date: 2025

Finding 24-03

The fixed asset listing required to be maintained in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:30-5.6 did not include assets that were required to be included.

Criteria:

For fixed asset accounting and reporting purposes, all capital assets are grouped into the following fixed asset categories: Land, Buildings, Improvements Other than Buildings, Equipment, Construction Work-In-Progress and Lease purchase Agreements. The fixed asset inventory maintained on the excel spreadsheet did not include all land and buildings listed in the name of the Borough. All land and building information should be incorporated within the fixed asset inventory maintained on the spreadsheet. In addition, the computer software system that the Borough uses has a fixed assets module available and the Borough might want to consider using the Edmunds fixed assets module.

Recommendation:

That the fixed asset listed be updated to reflect all properties owned by the Borough.

Management's Response:

The fixed assets listing will be updated to include all properties owned by the Borough.
