2021 Assembly Speakers

Mao Kong, our keynote speaker, is a community activist and advocate for victims of domestic violence and human trafficking. She has extensive experience



working with people of different cultures and backgrounds. For the past ten years, Ms. Kong, who heads the Covid Triage Department for Gunderson Health of La Crosse, has partnered with the Gundersen Health System, local colleges, the Greater La Crosse Area Diversity Council, and other organizations to empower and educate others about diversity, equity, and inclusion.

Kong was born in a Thai refugee camp and immigrated to the United States when she was nine years old. Along with her message of empowering women, Mao will share her personal story of challenges and cultural identity.

Sandra Hoeser, a Viterbo Graduate with a BS degree in Education and a MS degree in Education from University of Guam, has been a Career



Counselor and taught at the Federal
Penitentiary for Women. This work has given
her insight in assisting women transitioning
from a life of incarceration - where one lives a
life of dependence - to a world of
independence; a life in a communal society
that teaches interdependence and being open
to one another and carrying one another's
burdens.

LaKisha (Kish) Hudson is a single mother of 7 and grand-mother of 5 and has lived in the La Crosse area for over 22 years. She recently overcame homelessness and has been permanently housed for almost 5 years. Kish is currently an Independent Living Specialist, Certified Peer Specialist and a Prevention Specialist employed by Independent Living

Resources in the Lacrosse area.

New Horizons provides shelter and services to a seven county (population 238,236) area in Wisconsin and Minnesota.

New Horizons Shelter is staffed 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year to provide emergency shelter and food to victims of domestic violence and their children. They also provide legal services, counseling, support groups, community advocacy, and other resources aimed at helping victims of abuse or human trafficking.
