## ATWATER KENT LEFT ESTATE OF \$9,130,971

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 4 — The value of the estate left by A. Atwater Kent is placed at \$9,-130,971.11 in the first accounting submitted by the two executors and approved in Superior Court.

The executors, George W. Noble and Harold Ashworth, reported that the original inventory showed assets of \$9,481,163.95 and that income since Mr. Kent's death, totaling \$22,626.71, had brought the total value to \$9,503,790.66.

But the account also showed that administrative expenses, taxes, claims paid and losses had reached \$372,819.55, leaving a net balance of \$9,130,971.11 in the estate as of last Oct. 31. The executors informed the court that they held \$5,004,921.07 in cash with the balance mostly in stocks and bonds.

Mr. Kent, 75 years old, died last March 4.

Known as one of the world's most liberal hosts, Mr. Kent willed thousands to celebrities of film and social circles who had been his guests. Included were such names as Greer Garson, Hedda Hopper, Edgar Bergen, Billie Burke, Sir Charles Mendl, Cornel Wilder, Cobina Wright, Claire Windsor, Richard Ney, Gloria Morgan Vanderbilt and Thelma Morgan Furness.

Legally parted but not divorced from his wife, Mrs. Mabel Lucas Kent, the capitalist willed her \$2,000,000. Mr. Kent's charitable and educational bequests under the will totaled \$1,335,000.

The will also contained provision for Mr. Kent's three children, A. Atwater Kent Jr., Elizabeth Kent Vanalen and Virginia Kent Catherwood.
