





Retired pig farmer invit

ONEIDA — When Gene Holt left the hog farming business, he didn't exactly leave the pigs behind.

The retired hog farmer from near Oneids is the proud owner of a pig collection numbering over 1,000 pieces. That porky populare took more than 12 years to accumulate. But Holt couldn't bear to be in hog heaven alone, so he formed the Happy Pig Collectors Club.

"It's been an education trying to start something like this," Holt

The club's third newsletter was sent to members recently. Holt is listed as the founder and chief storyteller on the newsletter masthead. The editor is Mary Bjorling, Altona.


"I wouldn't have started unless Mary said she'd help me," Holt said

His wife, Betty Lou, enters each newsletter on a computer disk which is sent to their daughter, Betsy Holt, in Colorado. Betsy does the layout and sends the new-letter back to her father for proofreading.

The newsletter currently comes out four times a year to members who pay \$20 annually for the privilege of joining the club. Holt encourages members and others to send him pictures, stories, jokes, cartoons and ads, which he runs for free in the newsletter.

. In the beginning, Holt wrote to Farm & Ranch Living magazine to stir up interest in his new club. He received about 40 responses, some of those people became members. He also advertised in several newspapers, but says he didn't receive many responses from the ads.

After he founded his club he heard about Pig Tales & Hog Wash, a pig collectors newsletter founded by Jamet Gallagher of Audubon, Minn. Due to illness, Gallagher had put her newsletter on hold, but sent a list of her subscribers to

Holt. Some of those collectors joined the Happy Pig Collectors Club. There are currently 54 members in about 14 states, including all the midwestern states, plus North Dakota, Florida, Arkansas, California, Montana and Connecticut.

The members are not just former

pig farmers, either.
"Most have urban addresses," he said. "I don't think it has much to do with farming at all."

"But she's been a good sport and I think she kind of likes the idea now," he said.

Among Holf's personal pig gathering is the piggy bank he had as a child, but that wasn't really the spark that started him on his hobby. He says he can't really remember one certain pig that got him started, but at least two upstairs rooms in his home prove that no two pigs are exactly alike and that there are a lot more pig items around than some people may have realized.

Holt said his wife refuses to dust his collection and admittedly he "doesn't do a very good job of it," but the pigs, many of which are in cabinets with glass doors, don't appear to be neglected.

Besides pigs made in just about every medium imaginable, Holt also collects articles, catalogs featuring pig items and pictures he finds of pigs.

"I got all pig things and money to spend on pig items for christmas It was the best Christmas I ever had," Holt said.

One person buying a gift membership for a relative wanted a card to announce the gift, so Holt had membership cards printed that say, "So that I may gain more en-joyment from my hobby and meet and mingle with others cursed with the same strange affliction. Just to share the nonsense of it all and give respect to 'When I see a pig I think of you.""

He also has business cards with a scene drawn by Betsy Holt's sister-in-law. The card features a pig driving a tractor which is bearing down on a roostee crossing the road A sign on the side says, "Walcome to Knox County Pro-mote pork, run over a chicken!"


And Holt is always looking to add to his collection. He's ever watchful for different pigs and items he doesn't have in his vast collection.





Fun Facts: The "city-size" pig weighs over 300 pounds. Most painted pigs are redone with a new identity every two to three years. Cadiz Comfort Zone sold more than 300 pigs of various sizes and materials in 2016. Most of the concrete pigs sold in Cadiz originate at Boyd's Concrete in Lake City, Kentucky.

THIS LITTLE PIGGY

New visitors to Trigg County and Cadiz see many usual smalltown fixtures, but one of the ornaments around town raises a few questions.

Karla White of Cherokee Antiques said tourists come to her all the time and ask, "What's the story with all the pigs," when looking at the many, custom-painted concrete pigs around town. Well, Trigg County is home to the Ham Festival, which will celebrate its 44th year in October 2020.

Cindy Sholar at the Trigg County Tourism Office said the idea for the unique monuments to Trigg County's signature industry came when she visited Cincinnati, Ohio, for a meeting.

Cincinnati featured several pig statues celebrating the meat-packing industry. The Mayor of Cadiz in 1999, the late Lynn Bailey, said that the town needed statues of this sort.

"I couldn't picture pigs on Main Street, but at the next Main Street meeting, we discussed branding the community," Bailey said. "We are what we are, and have to work with what we've got. Since Trigg County is about ham, we went with pigs."

Sholar said she spoke to Bob Brame, owner of Ace Hardware in Cadiz, and inquired about the statues.

"He was very supportive and gracious about everything we were planning to do. We started to order the large pigs for businesses and let them have them at my cost," she said.

Having started along Main Street, the pigs have spread through Trigg County as a symbol of community identity. Sholar said pigs can be seen at shops at the intersection of I-24 and U.S. 68/80 and as far west as the Lake Barkley area.

Newcomers seeking concrete pigs to add to their gardens now have a large variety of pigs to choose from at Consignment World and Cadiz Comfort Zone on Main Street.






