

Visiting Leeds Industrial Museum

Arriving at the museum and going in

Leeds Industrial Museum at Armley Mills is in a large old building that used to be a textile mill. It is in Armley, next to the canal.

The address of Leeds Industrial Museum is

Opening times of the museum:

Monday: Closed (open 10am-5pm on bank holidays only)

Tuesday – Friday: 10am – 5pm

Saturday and Sunday:
12 – 5pm

(last admission 1 hour before)



You can't see the museum building from the road. Look out for a large yellow sign for **Leeds Industrial Museum** amongst bushes on the side of the road. Turn into the car park.



Park here, unless you have a disabled person's parking permit and need to park near the entrance.



The museum is about 100 yards from the car park.

There is a private road leading to the museum. There are yellow metal gates at the start of the road. They will be open when the museum is open.

The road is flat.



Be careful on this road. Sometimes there are lorries and other vehicles driving along it.



There is another yellow museum sign at the end of the road.
Keep going along the road.
At the end, it bends to the right, past an old stone gate post.



The entrance of the museum has a large yellow sign above the doors.
The doors open automatically.
There are cobblestones leading up to the entrance, then the pavement is flat.



Next to the entrance, on the right, is a space for disabled parking permit holders.
Alternatively, if you are a disabled person and someone is driving you, in a car or minibus, they could drop you off here, then park in the main car park.



Once you have come through the doors, go to the reception desk on the left.

There are cards and gifts for sale here.

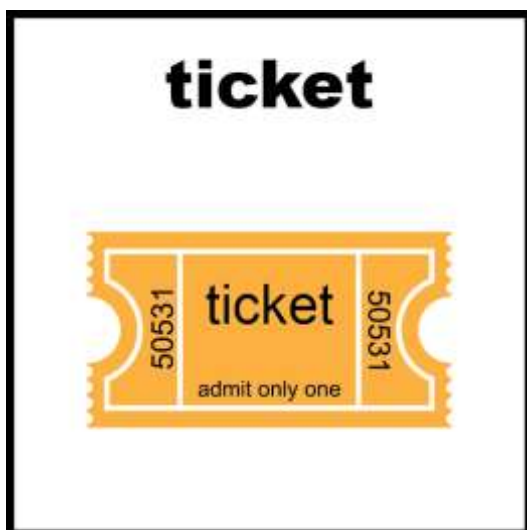
There might be other visitors in this area.



There will be one or two members of staff at the reception.

They sell tickets to the museum.

They can also answer any questions about the museum.



You have to pay to visit the museum, unless you are just coming for a free tour of the exhibition ***Any work that wanted doing.***

Head through the doors to the right of the reception desk to go in to the museum.

There will be other visitors wandering round the museum. There might be groups of school children visiting too.



Go through the first room if you want to visit the exhibition ***Any work that wanted doing.***



The exhibition is in the Textile Gallery. It starts once you have gone past the first textile machines.



Carry on through this gallery and into the next to look at the artwork and the machines.

The exhibition is on this floor only. But the museum is bigger and you can get to other floors by lift or stairs.
