- EARLY CHILDHOOD NETWORK ADVOCATES: ADD 15 MILLION TO AN EXISTING LINE IN THE ALASKA BUDGET (RATHER THAN A BILL)
- CHILDCARE RECEIVES THE MOST WRITTEN TESTIMONY OF THE BUDGET PROCESS
- SENATOR STEADMAN ADDS IT TO THE SENATE BUDGET COUNTERPROPOSAL
- REDUCED TO 7.5 MILLION, SIGNED BY DUNLEAVY
- GOES DIRECTLY TO SALARIES AND WAGES, ONE-YEAR APPROPRIATION

GOVERNOR'S TASK FORCE ON CHILDCARE

- •Identify policy solutions to childcare workforce constraints.

- •Identify opportunities to foster public-private partnerships
- •Develop framework for a pilot program to offer on-site childcare facilities in a State of Alaska office to serve as a model for employer-provided childcare benefits.

IT COMES DOWN TO REVENUE

- ATTRACTING AND RETAINING QUALITY TRAINED EMPLOYEES
 REQUIRES MONEY
- WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT REQUIRES MONEY
- FAMILIES CANNOT AFFORD TO PAY WHAT CHILDCARES WOULD NEED
 TO CHARGE FOR COMPETITIVE WAGES AND BENEFITS
- CHILDCARE IS A PUBLIC SECTOR INDUSTRY TRYING TO OPERATE IN THE PRIVATE SECTOR

MUNICIPAL RESPONSES

- In April 2023, voters in Anchorage, Alaska dedicated their retail marijuana sales tax revenue to early childhood education. At a retail sales tax of 5%, the revenue will generate approximately \$6 million a year for childcare and early education.
- The City of Juneau includes monthly perpupil stipends to childcare providers in its budget.

Investigate and implement a municipal solution to Sitka's childcare challenge. Work with the Sitka Tribe of Alaska, large employers, and the Early Childhood Coalition to seek long-lasting solutions.
