- Ocular Health: Regular screening for hereditary eye conditions such as cataracts, Progressive Retinal Atrophy (PRA), and Pigmentary Uveitis is integral

- to our breeding protocol. Annual specialist exams are standard for our dogs, ensuring early detection and responsible breeding decisions.
- Genetic Conditions: DNA screening for diseases like Ichthyosis (skin condition)
 and Neuronal Ceroid Lipofuscinosis (fatal neurological disorder) allows us to
 breed responsibly, producing genetically healthy puppies without compromising
