Perhaps the most stirring epitaph in Pine Hill is that of **Littleton Wynn**, a member of the settlement party who died in 1852.

On his tombstone appears a standard English warning to the living:

"Behold me now as you pass by As you are now, so once was I As I am now, soon you must be Prepare for death and follow me."

The clever will respond in this way:

"to follow you, I'll not consent, until I know which way you went."
