PROCLOMATION AWARDED (The Crosstown Reunion)

From the displacement of residents that started in the late 50's and continues until this present day, the idea of a reunion of past and present residents was born. Through the efforts of Mr. Willie (Too Boy) Latin and Mrs. Jessie Mae Caruthers, that idea became a reality on Labor Day 1994.

The event held at Princess Park was a big success with residents returning from as far away as Los Angeles attending. There were BBQ grills and tents galore in the park. Food was shared as well as stories of those long ago and not so long ago years.

After the failing health of Mrs. Jessie Mae and the death of Mr. Latin, Rev. Danny Mitchell took the reins and kept it going until his election to the LA House of Representatives. Mr. Allen Lawrence kept the annual tradition going from 2005-2010. During this period, attendance was affected as Black neighborhoods all over the city started their own gatherings. (I call them gatherings because these neighborhoods are still intact, with the exception of the Bottoms.) In 2011, I took up the torch to keep the tradition alive. There's a renewed interest in the Crosstown Reunion and the attendance is growing every year.
