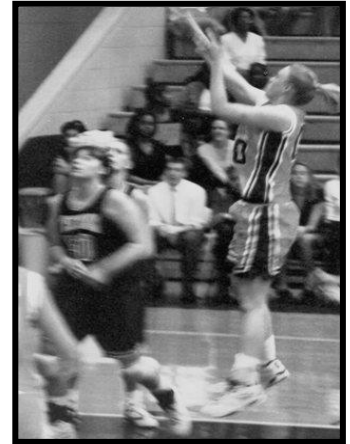


## ERIN JOHANNES BEGLEY

Many successful women athletes attribute their drive to excel and their future success to early athletic competition with boys. Erin JohannesBegley was no exception. Being the only girl in a family with two brothers, Begley's memories of sports revolved around the action that occurred in her own yard, with her older brothers, Justin and Jason, and their neighborhood buddies.

Her mother, Kay, a Lynchburg College athlete, and father, Arnie Johannes, a professional baseball player, encouraged Erin, as she filled her year with sports -- camps in the summer and a sport for each season of the school year. Coaches whom she reveres include her father, youth league coaches Mike Ogden and Mike Goolsby, and school coaches, Lynette Miles, Barbara Wood, William Gouldthorpe, and Leslie Secrest.



Begley experienced early success: all-star designation, team Most Valuable Player, Elks Hoop Shoot winner, and undefeated season in middle school. As a high school athlete, she participated in volleyball, basketball, and softball, with her 1000<sup>th</sup> point in basketball being acknowledged in front of family and friends. Other achievements included All-District selections in basketball and softball, highlighted by the Virginia State All-Star softball game.

Success in basketball enabled Begley to attend Wingate University in North Carolina on scholarship, following in the footsteps of her brother, Justin. The basketball program competed in the NCAA Division II South Atlantic Conference, and played some Division I opponents, a British national team in England, and several collegiate tournaments. Her Wingate team won two conference championships.

Begley has served as a coach, first as graduate assistant at Wingate, then at other youth and high school levels.
