

Dear TFEA/Freedom Team Partner,


God says **“For My thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways My ways,” declares the Lord. Isaiah 55:8 NAS**

TFEA Mobile Prison Team - Responsibilities

Evangelist Joshua writes:

It's exciting to share what God is doing. Here is an overview of our team's regular activities:

- **Outreach and Discipleship:** We actively distribute Bibles and tracts to the inmates, and collect event decision cards and help guide our ministry.
- **Leadership and Coordination:** We collect vital data and compile powerful testimonies directly from inmate cell church leaders.
- **Equipment Management:** Our team provides training on the usage and maintenance of TFEA equipment inside the prisons, ensuring constant monitoring and upkeep.
- **Oversight and Reporting:** We execute a monthly roadmap of events across 18 different prisons. We stay in touch with these locations—both physically and remotely—honoring our division of labor and compiling individual updates into one comprehensive monthly report.
- **Expansion and Planning:** We are constantly planning and evaluating our monthly activities, which includes surveying potential new prison facilities to launch our programs.

- **Post-Release Support:** We help follow up with released inmates, tracking their locations to support them and foster any potential new WAY Church plants.

Ultimately, our specific activities vary from month to month, depending entirely on how God is working and the direction He leads us.

Evangelist Bryan - February Report:

Praise the Lord for 2026, February is one of the most miraculous months in our entire ministry, we have never had growth as fast as this. We are constantly reminded that this is not the work of man, because its beyond our capacity and control, we **have 639 WAY House Church clusters and 23 centers in the country**, and in only February the **salvation decisions are 45,978 in these churches**. We are only a few steps away to the **one million souls**, and this year 2026 is going to be in history that God answered our long time prayer! **One million souls coming to Jesus Christ**.

Now I know why our teams in prisons and out of prisons have had a unusual favor over the years, because all this is the **working of God to fulfill His great plan for this nation Uganda**. At this point in time I will boldly say that Uganda is going through a time of revival and God is using the former out-casts of the society (prisoners), and the prisons as the training ground. Very soon this revival will spread to east Africa. When the inmates are released from prison with a Bible in their hands, **when they get home, first thing is to witness Jesus Christ to their families and a church is birthed right in their house**. This spreads like a wild fire to the whole village, community, subcounty, district. **God has done this Himself**.

The widows have all settled in their homes. Engineers Ronald and Micheal have gone ahead to make for them fixed wood- en beds and seats using trees. They are so full of joy as you will read their testimonies and pictures on page 3 and 4.

Evangelist Joshua - February Report:

18 Prisons 1,066 Prison Cell Churches 227 Events 11,231 Salvations 833 Rededications

Ministry Highlights: Bushenyi Prison Launch: This February, we officially launched our ministry into the **Bushenyi Prison facility**, and it has been a tremendous success.

A Seamless Transition: The work at Bushenyi was a "walkover" because we found many inmates of like faith who had been transferred from other TFEA-reached facilities. They easily blended with our team.

Prison Cell Church Growth: Before our official arrival, transferred inmates had already started 15 cell churches. This February, we established 9 additional cell churches. **First-Time Believers & Events:** We saw many first-time respondents and several rededications. The inmates received the programs with great joy and immediately began the "Prisoners of Pain" events throughout the month.

Observations & Challenges: Women's Needs at Bushenyi: Through conversations with the female inmates at Bushenyi, we realized many lack access to sanitary pads. This shortage causes some women to fear attending gatherings in the main hall. While this falls under government responsibility, we are fervently praying for God to provide a swift solution for them. **Resources & Logistics - Bibles:** We thank God for the continued gift of Bibles. Access to the Word of God has made inmates bold and well-trained. Upon their release, they become instrumental in the "WAY House Churches" revival network. We pray for continued funding so that every new respondent coming to Christ each month can have daily access to the Word. **Transport:** We are incredibly grateful to the TFEA ministry for easing our workload by providing a motorcycle. This will be shared among team members to reach scheduled areas for data collection and work supervision. **Safety:** We thank God for granting our teams safe travels, secure accommodations, and high- ly successful events. Praise the Lord!

Superintendent - February Report: 639 WAY Church Clusters 45,978 Salvations 10,000s Attending

Greetings in the mighty Name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. February has been an extra busy month for all of us, trying to catch up with all the new church outbreaks, all the Elders at the Mega Center have been involved in this deployment throughout the month of Feb. and thank God for the mighty growth. We have been praying for the **one million souls dream for the TFEA to come to pass soon** and Evange- list Bryan told us how close we are to achieving the dream, every one is getting excited and committing to God's work like never before.

Reporting from our Mega center now in Rwenjeru, the work of God has now grown to **23 central loca- tions country wide**.

As inmates continued to be released from prison in the month of February, **they invaded their home vil- lages with the zeal and the ignition from the prison cell churches leading to an outbreak-of- churches in their homes, and the Revival covering areas of Buteraniro, Isingiro, Kaberebere, Kibega, Ntungamo, Rub- orogota, Rukungiri, Rwamuranda, Rwashamire among others.**

This miraculous revival will soon cover the whole country from prison to the whole nation. One of our fellow elders said "From prison to the world." The forces of revival shaking our nation will come from prison and the government has already recognized this by giving our teams unusual access and covering. During our follow-ups **we have local government leaders testify of the transformation that has taken place within the former inmates** and how their influence has worked in the lives of their families and community. Many testimonies from the physical healings and deliverances, transformation and victo- ry have been submitted for translation.

One of the widow's children who is 16 years old has a two year old son because of the conditions of their former housing where children were not protected, now she is safe. The new homes has brought safety to widows children from the abuse and early pregnancies.

Testimonies from Widows who received New TFEA Widow Homes!

Widow Annette Muhumuza Annamarie (Age 69)

When my husband passed away 20 years ago, my in-laws took our home and gardens, sold them out to my late husband's business partners and they shifted and relocated to another village, and I was left hanging in space with 5 children and nowhere to go. My world was broken into pieces that I could never bring together again, my two daughters were forced into marriage at only 13 and 14, to one man, a polygamist, and drunkard, I had no choice and no one to defend me, my in-laws supported this evil for money exchange with my daughters, I left alone with my other children, I was taken by a well-wisher to the camp at Ruhenda to stay with refugees, I worked in the gardens to buy a canvas at 10,000- shillings and there in the canvas has been my place to sleep for the last 20 years at Ruhenda forest. About two years ago, when my son was released from prison, He took me together with his siblings to stay at the big church and our pastor Emmanuel recently moved me into the new "WAY of Jesus Wing" built by our church. It is a beautiful room, it has a locking door, it has a wooden bed, and for the first time in 20 years, I feel safe and so loved. The big church community also has blessed me with food sometimes, and a place to dig my own food, I always tell people that Jesus loves me daily. I'm no longer just surviving, Jesus cares for me.

Widow Ruzubagira Mbaba Keirrah (Age 73)

My name is Keirrah, I thank God for His love and mercy over my family, Just as I was celebrating my sons release from prison, I thought in my heart that this was enough miracle for me this year, I have been living at the church place for two years now, in the left corner of the big church is my mattress and I had decided that this little corner is my forever home. At the beginning of January, a group from the church led by the Elder Emmanuel, asked me about my situation, after a few days, they invited me to move with my mattress into a beautiful Room with a bed and wooden seats in the church's community widows WAY of Jesus wing. How beautiful it is to wake up to the sounds of other women, sharing meals and Bible verses too, and the pastoral staff and elders always available around us. Jesus gave me back my son, gave me a house and gave me a family.

Widow Eliyahu Moambe Evelyn (Age 70)

After my husband went to be with the Lord last year, I have been living at the big church together with my daughter and two grandchildren, I felt peace and comfort living at the big church with a family of believers. This year I was miraculously considered among the widows to receive a home at the way of Jesus Wing. It's wonderful. But more than the home, they gave me a purpose. I also help in the church cleaning and ushering department. Am no longer a lonely, depressed widow, am a grandmother to dozens of children at the Mega center and I feel valued and supported by the congregation, and I know I have a place here for the rest of my days.

Widow Josephine (Age 60)

I thank God for the big church, I went through many life's trials that I have never even mentioned to you but my heart is thankful to the WAY Mega Church. You know when I was living alone as a widow in Ruhenda camp, I became a target, men would break into my house, the hut that I was in and did all sorts of things to me, sometimes in my children's presence. I had no way to report them in fear of being killed, I lived in hurting silence, and I was constantly fearful. I don't know how the church thought about providing a secure, designated area for widows who have no one else to turn to, but I know the many prayers I prayed to God in my heart daily have been answered. Here God has brought me, we are protected and live safely, I am heading our widows' communal garden. Right now, I am focusing on healing and spiritual growth. The big church has truly acted as the defender of the widow in my life.

Widow Mwebembezi Mpesi Agnes (Age 58)

My husband passed away when my elder son was in prison, when the big church was constructed I was given a chance to come and stay here, I am one of the people that started living here about 4 years ago, and my son was released from prison last year, we stayed here together until Emmanuel our Elder recently gave us a home here at the church I have no words to explain this but the church has shown me that God really is the defender of the weak.

Kitamura Margarette Mwinkanjuna (Age 64)

After losing my husband in 1996 and leaving me in a small, grass roofed house, with all my hopes gone, I tried suicide 3 times and our community rescued me miraculously after an overdose of Rat poison, I thought death would help me rest from the troubles of this world, but there was something much more helpful ahead. After healing for a few months, a strong wind destroyed my hat, leaving me at the mercy of the community, this brought back the pain and memories of my late husband. Questions filled my heart, who will care? Who will build another hat for me? who will love me and my children? For many years I have lived in pain and uncertainty. Now in my old age, I met Jesus, he is more than my husband, he gave me a home with my children, not just a home but refuge from pain. I came here with almost nothing, just my polyethene bags and the Taplin. I now have a home, a supportive community, and a heart full of hope and joy. The weekly fellowship meetings at the big WAY Church have changed everything. I am surrounded by women who understand me and love me, and we are stronger together. They provide not only a roof but also emotional support that has helped me rebuild my life. At 64, I have my lovely church sisters who hug me and many genuine friends, I feel cherished.
