



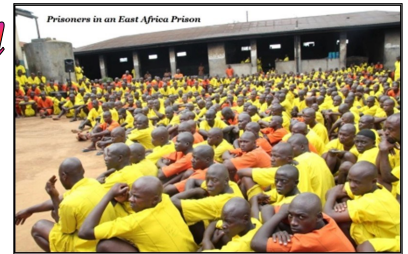

Dear TFEA/Freedom Team Partner,

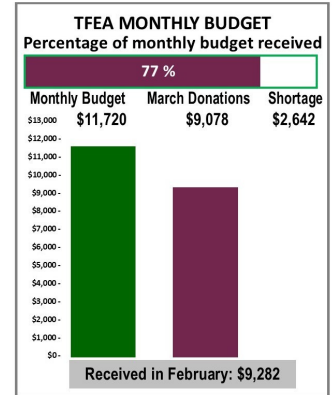

WAY of JESUS House Church Movement

Evangelist Bryan, TFEA East Africa Operations Director: Reports

WAY Church locations: These WAY House churches cover the most part of the Western Region of Uganda and some parts of the Southwestern region, Including the most recent one in the area of Kabale in Southwestern Uganda.

WAY Churches: God has established **778 WAY House Church** clusters in **24 geographical** areas with over **51,000 people attending** the Sunday Services. However, these churches usually meet 5 or more times each week. Most all of these churches have been started by former prison inmates who have come to Christ through our Prisoners of Pain.....God's Grace video documentary, joined one of the many prison cell churches and upon their release from prison started a WAY House Church duplicating what God is doing inside the prison cell churches.

Most recent location: The Kabale center in Southwestern Uganda has been in operation since January. We discovered this center through a former inmate in mid-March. This center has 7 WAY House churches already in operation, 7 homes of former inmates, and one of these former inmates was on murder charges, with a sentence of 25 years in prison, who was released miraculously after only 13 years.

WAY Church Leadership: These churches are under the supervision of our **24 Superintendents** and **720 Elders**. The work they are doing is coordinating the centers and collecting data of baptisms, salvations, and attendance. The administration at each center location is stable and well trained in collecting the data by the end of each month on all of the 24 centers, including the newest Kabale location.

WAY Church Growth: Most inmates released from prison with **The WAY of Jesus Gospel** in their hands, have turned their homes into churches on arrival, bringing a revival in every village they step in. The **"OMUHANDA GWA YESU"** Movement as its locally called, translated as **THE WAY OF JESUS**, will have widely spread its wings and covered the entire region by the end of 2026.

Godly Inspiration: All of our growth has come by the Lord, God Almighty, Who has provided the inspiration and direction of each of these church planters by changing their heart to be His servants. God has used their time while attending the prison cell churches to give them a driving desire and inspiration to start a WAY House Church upon their release from prison.

TFEA Ministry in Uganda, Africa Prisons

Our Goal: Praise God for the year 2026, and in particular the month of March, when we have achieved the vision and mission of TFEA that we have prayed for a long time: **1,000,000 recorded salvations into the kingdom of God.** What a mighty God we have!

Our Mission: For quite some time, we have prayed and believed God for such a time as this. With great faith, we worked towards this goal, and by God's grace, He has answered our most important prayer request. He is using us to bring His people to where He is—not just common people, but social outcasts who had been abandoned by society. This includes the imprisoned, those forgotten by their families, individuals on life sentences, and those facing death with no hope of ever being free again.

Our Evangelists: God has rescued them, saved them, and turned them into Evangelists. Today, 99.9% of our biggest team of evangelists consists of former inmates serving in both prison cell churches and Way House churches.

Key Statistics Summary

Total Prisons Reached: 19 ~ Total Prison Cell Churches: 1,113 ~ Meeting Frequency: Twice daily

Bibles: So far this year we have printed & distributed 15,900 Bibles to prisoners receiving Jesus Christ.

Recent Highlights: Kiruhura Prison Launch. In April, we officially launched our ministry into the Kiruhura Prison facility. We carried out a survey of the facility and obtained government permission last year, and God has now enabled us to officially open our events there. The facility features a maximum-security department, and 75% of the inmates in Kiruhura are women. We are looking forward to what the Lord will be doing in Kiruhura Prison.

Spiritual Revival: Team members report a "**revival movement**" atmosphere during cell church services, particularly in the Bushenyi prison.

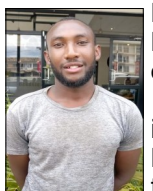
Bible Distribution: The distribution of The WAY of Jesus Bibles continues to show immediate, transformative impact on inmates struggling with addiction and despair.

Jimmy: As a member of the Prison Evangelism Team since 2023, I bow my head in profound gratitude to God for TFEA's miraculous milestone: reaching one million souls with the Gospel through the TFEA ministry. Witnessing such a massive harvest behind bars is a testament to the power of God's grace upon this ministry.

Over the last three years, I have seen God move beyond physical walls to transform lives in the darkest of places. We have unbelievable testimonies of God using His Word—specifically The WAY of Jesus Bibles—to defeat suicidal thoughts and drug addiction. When I reflect on the many planning meetings with Joshua, the team's tireless dedication in traveling long distances, and their sacrificial love for the inmates, I acknowledge that reaching this milestone is entirely due to the Holy Spirit working through us rather than human strength alone. I am forever grateful to God for the opportunity to serve under this ministry, and I thank Joshua for trusting me with this responsibility.



Kenneth (Ken): My ministry mainly involves planning routes and following up on the printing and distribution of Bibles and Freedom Tracts to inmates. Because of this, I am privileged to understand and experience the impact of placing the Word of God directly into the hands of those searching for hope.

I often participate in selecting testimonies for translation, which means I read countless stories of how receiving a hard copy of the Bible has initiated spiritual transformation in thousands of incarcerated individuals. These Bibles are spiritual tools that offer freedom from guilt, shame, and despair. I thoroughly enjoyed worshiping with the inmates in several cell church services this month. The best way I can describe it is as a "revival movement" that is redefining the atmosphere of these prison facilities. I pledge to serve the Lord and make sure more inmates experience true liberty and hope, even while serving their sentences. May the Lord give us more grace!



Jacob: This month, our prison ministry has experienced significant success. As my brother Sam noted, TFEA is making history in Uganda this year. Giving The WAY of Jesus Bibles to the inmates is like handing them their life and light back from hopelessness, darkness, and isolation.

The demand for the Word of God in prison is overwhelming, and watching inmates receive their own copies—often for the very first time—has been deeply moving. These tangible gifts are transforming hearts, providing inmates with a new sense of purpose, peace, and stability in their daily struggles. It effortlessly helps them turn away from past behaviors toward a future with Christ. On behalf of the inmates, I want to say thank you to all who have made this possible. May God richly reward you.

Simon: I have learned so much from the inmates' testimonies, particularly how they maintain an attitude of gratitude despite their circumstances. I have seen women lacking basic needs like sanitary pads and toothpaste, yet feeling satisfied and joyful because of the Gospel of Jesus.

I have witnessed stories of deep, lasting repentance, especially during our recent Bushenyi prison cell church services. As one inmate described it, "eating the Word like food" has taught me about the transformative power of Scripture and the authenticity of faith in difficult places. Their resilience and eagerness to learn have shown me that God finds and frees hearts even behind cold steel bars. I leave every cell church service inspired by their spiritual insights and hunger for truth.



Samuel: I am truly grateful for the continued opportunity to serve within these prison walls, seeing God's mercy and unconditional love firsthand among those often forgotten by society. It is humbling to enter these facilities and see Christ in the faces of the incarcerated, realizing that no one is disqualified from God's grace. This ministry is as much a blessing to my own faith walk as it is to those I serve. It constantly strengthens my reliance on God as I watch Him work miracles in lives that are surrendered to Him. Allan: I thank God for the month of March. I handled most of the driving last month, and I am incredibly grateful for the road safety and the calm political environment, which meant no more roadblocks. I thank God for His traveling mercies throughout the month and look forward to an even greater month in April.



Supt. Emmanuel Report:

Praise God for the Mighty Growth in March 2026, we spent most of March stabilizing the leadership of the 24 centers and the coordination of data collection from the furthest center to the Mega Center through several hands of Elders and Evangelists to our office at the Mega Center.

We have 24 centers, 720 Elders and Evangelists in administrative work, because each of the 24 centers has 30 ministers trained in all TFEA activities for easy reference. The outbreak of churches continues in the Western region of Uganda, with the most recent ones discovered in Kabale district with seven churches already in operation. This wildfire spiritual revival will soon cover the entire nation of Uganda, from prison to the community. God will this time use the prisoners to change Uganda, there is no doubt about this, because even the local government authorities have confirmed this in their testimonies.

Testimonies from Prisoners whose lives have miraculously changed!

Marcus, male, age 38, Bushenyi Prison

I have spent 3 years here, serving 8 years sentence. The day the Freedom Team came to our Cell hall, I had been thinking and talking with my friend about how much we missed our freedom and how if given a chance we cannot again misuse the freedom we had, and now that very day we were invited to the hall to attend the Freedom Team event, and my friend told me that they had brought the freedom that we had been discussing about earlier and we laughed about, little did I know that I was receiving freedom again, halleluiah, I was in a dark place, planning to take my own life. I felt abandoned by my family and God. But when the Freedom Team prayed for me and gave me a brand-new WAY of Jesus Bible, something broke inside me. The love they showed me, from total strangers, convinced me that God actually cares about a broken person like me. I now lead a cell church in my block. The Word has taken away my anger and filled me with a peace and freedom I cannot explain. I am not free from this prison yet, but I am truly free inside.

David, male, age 41, Bushenyi Prison

I have been suffering from chronic pain in my left leg for three years now, and the prison health department took me through all the treatments but it couldn't do much for me. I had given up on this ever since I gave my life to Jesus and became content, I have been part of the Freedom Team cell church in my block. During the Tuesday evening cell church service, the team leader asked if anyone needed healing. I was reluctant, because there was no visitor, it was just us as inmates and I did not believe that God can use one of us who is in prison, but they all laid hands on me and prayed with such conviction. I felt heat rush through my leg instantly during prayer. When I stood up, the pain was totally gone. I have been walking, running, and doing exercises without pain for two weeks straight. Jesus is real, and He is in this prison

Sarah, female, age 58, Kakiika Prison

My name is Sarah, the only daughter of my mother, I was known as the violent one, always in lockdown for fighting. When I received the WAY of Jesus Bible gift, I read it first, just to pass time. However, my life and entire thoughts begun to change as I read it, the preachings from the cell church team leaders about God's forgiveness kept echoing in my mind. I finally bowed my knees in my cell and asked for a new heart, the Team prayed for me again, and followed up and since then my transformation has been radical. I now lead the cell church in my block, The guards always ask me what happened to me, because I was always having injuries on my face, now I look calm and disciplined, I no longer feel the need to attack others. I have found my identity as a daughter of God, not a criminal, one of the female guards has received Jesus because of my testimony.

Samuel, male, age 39, Ntungamo Prison

I came here expecting to serve my time and go back to the streets. The Freedom Team was just a distraction to me. But the Team didn't just show the video, during the cell church fellowship, we heard testimonies, they loved us, they became extemporary, that love of my fellow inmates shattered my hardened heart. I started reading the Bible they gave me, and it's changing my mind completely. I've stopped engaging in the illegal, undercover deals inside the prison. I am mentoring younger inmates now at our cell church; indeed, Jesus offers a better future.

Elizabeth, female, age 43, CPS Mbarara Central Prison.

I was suffering from extreme anxiety and panic attacks that would leave me paralyzed in my cell, I was transferred to stay alone in the room. The Freedom Team brought me into the cell church worship. During a time of worship, I felt a heavy weight lift off my chest instantly, they told me it was my healing that I had received. It was a miraculous deliverance indeed. I haven't had a panic attack in over a month. I am now full of joy, and I am the one encouraging other who are unwilling to attend.

Joseph, male, age 45, Kakiika Prison

I never thought a book could change someone, but the WAY of Jesus Bible I received during the Freedom Team's Prisoners of Pain.....God's Grace event outreach two years ago, did exactly that. I was hooked on drugs and hopeless. As I read the story of the Prodigal Son, I realized I could come back to God. The testimonies on the documentary from the team reminded me that I have worth. I've been clean for two years now, and I'm reading my Bible everyday and attending cell church services. The Bible is my new lifeline.

Maria, female, age 42, CPS Central Prison

I was filled with bitterness and hatred. The Freedom Team didn't judge me when I was rude to them, they loved me and taught me about forgiveness, It was hard, but I prayed to be able to forgive. I received Jesus and I let it go. Since I let go of the hate, my mental health has improved dramatically. I'm actually writing letters to my husband and children now, repairing relationships I thought were dead. The Freedom Team has taught me how to love again.

John, male, age 44, Kakiika Prison

Serving a life sentence, I thought life was meaningless. The TFEA Freedom Team prison outreach has changed that perspective. Being part of the cell church, I found purpose, reading my Bible gift has transformed my life, I've accepted that while I may not leave this prison, I can still serve God here. I am teaching others to read using the Bibles provided, and I've found a new purpose.

Sarah, female, age 49, Ibuuga Prison.

I am Sarah, I lead our block cell churches combined, I am one of the pioneers of Freedom Team cell church ministry. Recently, I was developing severe blurry vision and was told I needed special care, which I couldn't get access to here in the cell. During the evening cell church meeting, the brethren were led to pray for healing. I told them about my eye. After they prayed, I opened my eyes and I could see clearly. The blurriness was gone! I read a verse from my Bible to the whole cell church assembly to prove that I can see and read clearly, God is performing miracles here! Halleluiah!
