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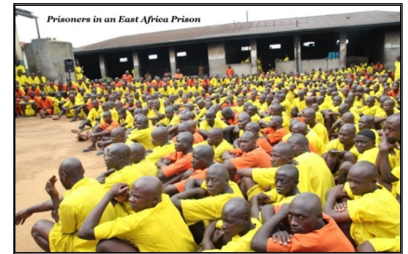

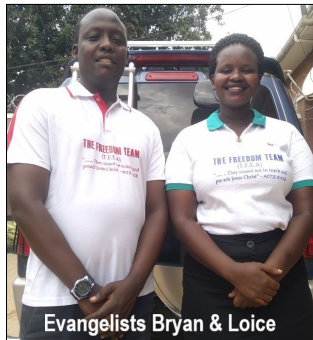
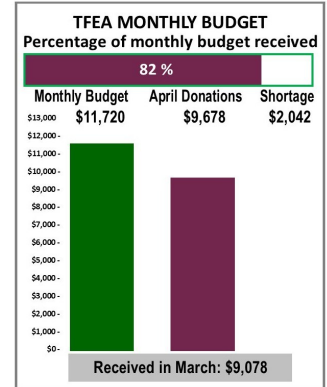

WAY of JESUS House Church Movement

Evangelist Bryan, TFEA East Africa Operations Director, writes:

Praise the Lord Jesus for the month of April 2026, We have grown to **32 way church Centers** this month. We have had physical visits to each of these centers during the month getting to know new people, setting up leadership, hearing their testimonies of how they were released and our first encounter in prison, sharing with them the vision and mission of TFEA, and also letting them know that there is a bigger family of WAY Church Clusters.

Thank you so much for the bicycles and motorcycles, the work has been made very easy. With transportation available, coordinating the centers and collecting data of baptisms, salvations, and attendance, has become easier. At each center we have a superintendent and his team of **30 elders** overseeing each center bringing us to a total of **32 superintendents and 768 Elders**. Now we have **948 Way house church clusters**.

We have asked the WAY Church leaders who have been released from prison and reunited with the community and got jobs and are able to buy the Bibles to donate their old Bibles **"the WAY Bible"** to inmates who still in prison and they welcomed this idea with joy. This will help us cope with the overwhelming number of respondents who need Bibles. We will follow up and see how this will work. There is generally a great revival in every village in this region.

Lastly, we deeply appreciate TFEA for the love and care for the widows, words can hardly capture the depth of our gratitude for your dedication to transforming lives through the construction of these widow houses. You have done more than just build houses, you have rebuilt lives, built hope, secured the future.

TFEA has become a tangible testament to love and compassion, wiping away the tears of our old mothers and ensuring peace and security, It means a lot to sleep peacefully under a secure roof. Thank you so much.

These new widow houses represent a restoration of dignity that was once lost, a journey from fear and displacement to a place of safety, now their children can be raised in safety. Thank you, TFEA, for planting a seed of hope, the widows now look forward to a brighter, safer tomorrow.

Evangelist Loice writes:

Attached is the attendance report for 24 centers, we have 7 new centers that aim to receive the forms from sister Joy and fill in the data and also send them here, making a total of 32 centers. The new centers cover all the 4 subregions of western Uganda, ANKOLE, KIGEZI, TOORO, and BUNYORO, Sub Regions. Thus covering different cultures and languages including Runyankore, Rukia, Rotor, Runyoro languages.

We have 8 command centers for the 32 centers, this system is helping us to collect data, our motorbikes collect data from command centers, the command centers collect data from the centers through superintendents by phone calls and recording of the numbers.

Executive Summary & Vision: Throughout the month of April, we have witnessed the undeniable faithfulness of God moving through our prison ministry. Like a refreshing wind, this movement is tearing down walls of hopelessness and softening hearts that once seemed hardened. We are seeing a significant increase in attendance and engagement across all our events and cell church services, with Bible study participation growing steadily as God draws souls to Himself behind bars

Numerous inmates, once broken and discouraged, are choosing to dedicate their lives to the Lord through our "Prisoners of Pain" events. The WAY of Jesus Bibles have been instrumental in transforming the prison atmosphere into a sanctuary of repentance and newfound faith. The TFEA team continues to witness the power of the Gospel changing lives from within, marked by testimonies ranging from emotional tears of surrender to joyous praise.

- Total Prisons Reached: **19**
- Total Prison Salvations: **12,014**, Rededications: **884**, Prison Events: **239**
- Total Prison Cell Churches: **1,151**
- Meeting Frequency: **Twice daily** (every morning and evening)

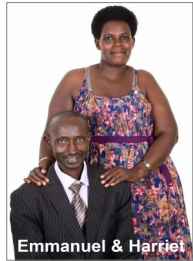
Ministry Highlights: Rubindi Prison Launch

As part of our ongoing mission to expand our outreach, we are launching our ministry into the Rubindi Government Prison facility in May. After surveying five new prison facilities and obtaining the necessary permissions, we felt led to prioritize Rubindi as our next step. Rubindi is a mixed-gender facility, and we are looking forward in faith to what the Lord Jesus will do there for His glory.

Resources & Logistics:

- **Bibles:** We extend our deepest gratitude to the TFEA ministry for the invaluable gift of Bibles. These have become a miraculous beacon of hope within these dark walls. Inmates who once felt forgotten now find true comfort, mentorship, and a loyal friend in the pages of Scripture. The Word has brought deep spiritual revival, proving that no one is beyond the reach of divine mercy and grace.
- **Transport:** Our reliable van and motorcycle, shared among team members, has been essential in helping us efficiently reach scheduled areas for data collection and work supervision.
- **Safety:** We thank God for granting our teams safe travels, secure accommodations, and highly successful events in April.

Superintendent Emmanuel's WAY Church Report - April 2026

The Lord has continued to bless and enlarge our boundaries this month, like we said in our previous report, we have also spent most of April, setting up and establishing, training and stabilizing the leadership of the 32 centers and we have established a system of call centers where specific centers collect data through coordination with superintendents and their assistants, using phone calls and record them, then the Evangelists will use bicycles and collect the recorded data from the nearest call center to the Mega Center through several hands of Elders and Evangelists to the office Emmanuel and Harriet. We have **32 centers, 768 elders** and Evangelists in administrative work, we also have **948 WAY Church Clusters** that reported **64,571 recorded salvations** in WAY Church clusters for the month of April.

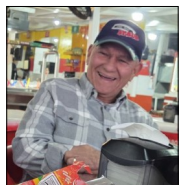
The outbreak-of-churches continues in the western region of Uganda, with the most recent ones discovered in Kibingo Shema district, Kyarusozo, Kyenjojo district, Bukwali Fort Portal City, Kanungu district, Kyamuhunga area, and the Kigezi sub region. This revival has already covered the entire nation of Uganda, through transfers to areas that we have not even reached, also by the released prison inmates throughout the year from prison to the community. God is indeed using the outcasts of the society to change Uganda. Like it was in the Bible when the overlooked people in the society were used by God to shame the wise of that time, this has been the way of the Lord from the beginning.

We thank you so much for the motorcycle and the bicycles, they are very helpful in easing transportation of the attendance reports and coordinating different activities across the region, collecting data, supervising its accuracy, following up time-tables of baptism events, doing the baptisms, special pastoral visits, supervision of new areas, etc.

Thank you so much for blessing the widows' families, we are going to share more heartfelt testimonies of widows. Giving them homes means a rebirth, because its giving them hope. This is an unforgettable kindness to our community, we deeply appreciate you for this, may the good lord richly bless you.

Eulogy of our First TFEA WAY Church Ambassador by Evangelist Bryan

Shabban - April, 2026

Our beloved late brother Shabban, 59, is survived by a widow and 5 children. Shabban passed on mid-last month, leaving behind a great testimony in East Africa as one of the most dedicated and zealous TFEA ambassadors in East Africa. Shabban, a former Kakiika prison inmate for 23 years, met the power of God through the TFEA prison ministry in East Africa in early 2022. Shabban was once lost within the dark walls of Kakiika prison, his future written off by the Rwenjeru community and the neighborhood, and his spirit broken. Yet, through our dedicated prison ministry, the light of Jesus Christ pierced his darkness through the ministry of Prisoners of Pain....God's Grace events by the Freedom Team, leading to a profound transformation that resulted in a miraculous, unexpected release from Kakiika prison after serving in the TFEA PRISON CELL CHURCH for about a year. Instead of walking away from his past, shifting to another village, Shabban embraced his calling that he had received while in prison, turning his story of incarceration into a powerful testimony of God's redemptive power. He immediately began seeking to serve the Lord in his village of Rwenjeru, and those still forgotten behind bars. Upon his release, Shabban began our very first "WAY House" church on land donated by his mother an old woman who was 89 years old then, a former witch doctor, a rain maker, feared in the community. But after the release of her son miraculously and after the testimony given to her directly by her son, Shabban, she gave her life to Jesus Christ,

Through this small beginning of our very first WAY House Church, then called a WAY Community Church, the Holy Spirit sparked an unprecedented revival, as Shabban and his team carried the Gospel with relentless passion throughout Rwenjeru and the neighborhood, leading to the birth of the Mega Center, a 1400 seat sanctuary in Rwenjeru, commonly known in Rwenjeru as THE BIG CHURCH. Within just four years, that small WAY House Church has multiplied miraculously, birthing over 900 WAY Churches in the Rwenjeru and surrounding regions, breaking chains of hopelessness and spreading a movement of spiritual renewal that has never been heard anywhere in East Africa and Uganda in particular. This, however, is just the beginning of the legacy Shabban has built. His ministry has not only planted churches but has also birthed a WAY of Jesus Community School sitting on the land donated by his family, to educate the next generation and has raised over 1,600 ministers trained to lead with the same WAY House Churches with a servant's heart. From a former inmate to a father of thousands in the faith, TFEA's Shabban story stands as a testament that God uses the broken things to build powerful, enduring movements. Shabban has gone to rest, but the work of God continues powerfully here in East Africa.

Testimonies from Widows who have also been given a new Home!

Sarah Nabirye (69 years old, Resident in Ruhenda Forest camp for 37 years)

My words cannot fully describe the depth of my happiness and gratitude to the big church, Emanuel and Harriet, and all others at the big church, for rescuing me and my four grandchildren from the camp forest cold nights and the sound of running water that was always crossing by my house of canvas day and night, a place we called home for 37 years, we lived in fear of wild animals, they gave us herbs to smear our body that it would protect us from wild animals, and out of desperation we used them herbs for years, we believed a lie. We were often displaced and harassed by authorities in the forest, I remember the leaking roof all night, whenever it rained. Our shift to this new, home has been a miracle. We now have walls that provide security and a roof that keeps us dry. I finally sleep through the night with a peaceful heart, knowing that my grandchildren are no longer exposed to the rain and cold or the wild of the forest, but are growing up in a place of dignity and true comfort. AMEN.

Florence Nalubega (71 years old, lived in Ruhenda Forest for 32 years)

The big church has become our new home and place of refuge, when we first heard about the big church stories of changing lives, we never thought that they would be interested in people like us, because we were useless, very old, and poor, but the big church is different from all churches, it has completely transformed our lives by moving us out of the dark, cold, forest of Ruhenda into this beautiful and spacious house. As a widow struggling to provide for three orphans from my late son, the weight of our previous living situation was too much to bear, my grandchildren were always sick because we had no toilet and my canvas was near a place which the community used as a toilet, and the water from the place was stinking, my nights and days were so unbearable, I longed to be safe one day in better place. Now that we have a secure home and a clean, good latrine at the big church, I feel a sense of pride I haven't felt in decades. My grandchildren are finally healthy and safe from the diseases that plagued us in the forest camp, and I am eternally thankful to the big church, Emanuel and Harriet who picked me on the bicycle with my children and property, for giving us a foundation upon which we can truly rebuild our lives.

Grace Achieng (67, Ruhenda Forest camp resident for 29 years)

For the last 29 years, me, my daughters and my grandchildren have lived in a state of constant uncertainty in the forest camp of Ruhenda, in a cold, canvas structure within the government forest, we built it by ourselves. The isolation and the struggle for basic necessities made every day a battle, but when the big church people came to us, and the churches started in our camp, Emmanuel started to take us to new homes, he carried our things on his bicycle, the new, comfortable house, halleluiah, it feels as though a heavy veil of sorrow has been lifted. This is more than just a building to us, it is safety, love, and care, my grandchildren feel loved by the big church people, and they can play without fear. TFEA has given me a renewed hope for the future, and I am filled with joy knowing that I am raising the next generation in a home that is protected, warm, and filled with lovely people of God.

Rose Nakato (73 years old widow, rescued after 38 years in Ruhenda Forest Camp shack)

I am a widow, with 3 daughters who are all HIV positive, and 19 grandchildren, 3 of which are HIV positive, I was living on the edge of hope, away in the deep forest with no clear future for my dear family. The daily struggle against the wind not to blow away my home, the mud brought by heavy rains into my canvas house, running water sometimes could take my mattress, and the lack of security in the Ruhenda government camp was exhausting, people are against their fellow humans, animals also against us, and the weather also against us, nothing was for us, everything against us and our children, **but Emmanuel and the big church have taught us that God is for us**, they didn't just give us a house, they restored my dignity as a grandmother and a member of this community. The days of patching a leaking plastic roof of canvas with grass and plastic cover are over.

Mary Kyomuhendo (62 years old, and lived 27 years in Ruhenda Forest)

I want to offer my humblest thanks to the big church for the love and care, they have shown to my family. Moving us from the harsh realities of the government forest camp to this beautiful house. In the camp, we were forgotten, but here, we are seen and valued. The house is warm, and secure, providing a stable environment that my grandchildren have never known before. I thank God every day for the big church team, Emanuel and Harriet, for telling those angels about us, thank you for acting as a bridge to take us from the wilderness into a place of peace, comfort, and permanent shelter.



New Style Widow Homes

We are committing to building 40 more of these new style, cemented smooth wall, widow homes that will last for many years for widows who have no other way of receiving a safe and secure place to live.

Each new home has 2 widows which are oriented to the location to direct the wind exposure and sunlight.

The construction is being done by the WAY of Jesus Community School construction class under the guidance of our Engineers Michael and Ronald. The Government is providing firebricks and the students are building walkways for the widows and their families.

The cost of providing one of these homes is approximately \$250.
