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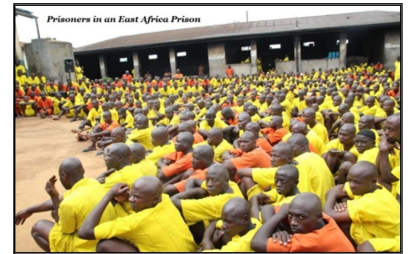

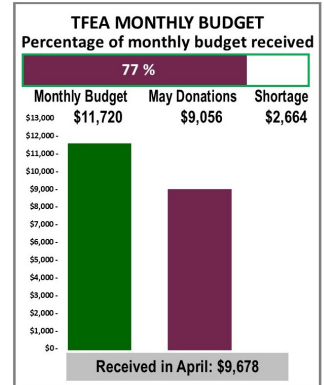

WAY of JESUS House Church Clusters Movement Continues to Grow

Evangelist Bryan writes:

Greetings and appreciation to the TFEA family world wide for yielding to God to be used for His glory in what we call a mighty move of God here in East Africa. First, my wife Loice and I, want to thank you deeply for your love, prayers, spiritual covering, financial support, and wise guidance. Your support has enabled us to serve in these capacities, and to go further than we could ever reach on our own, we are truly grateful.

We praise God for the growth He is giving us this month, **37 geographical WAY CHURCH CENTERS** currently established, **1024 WAY CHURCH clusters** running across those 37 centers. As of June 4th, we have received reports of **4**

MORE NEW CENTERS ALREADY IN OPERATION. And we have been able to visit two of them physically as I report now, this brings us to **41 CENTERS IN TOTAL**, we are planning physical visits to all of them soon to establish the work properly and include them on our **TFEA** outreach map.

The 12 additional bicycles you provided have made a huge difference, helping the evangelists move faster and serve more efficiently in the physical visits to WAY Church centers, conducting baptisms, setting up leadership structures for new centers, recording testimonies from the field, sharing the mission and vision of TFEA, and taking records of WAY Church attendances.

We deeply appreciate TFEA's love and care for the widows. By God's grace we have started the construction of 20 new widow houses and we are working hard to complete them in the shortest possible time so the widows can move into their safe homes. For many years they had suffered in the grass huts in Ruhenda forest, enduring rain and cold nights. God has answered their prayers as you will read in the testimonies on page 4.

We covet your continued prayers as the Lord God continues to do this great work through you. Please pray for us that God will protect us as a nation through the health threat of the Ebola virus, some 5 districts have been closed to block further spread following the death of two doctors from a national hospital and other patients, but we are safe with all our team members.

May the good Lord richly bless you.

TFEA & The Freedom Team: Prison Activity and Events Report - May 2026

Praise the Lord Almighty for the month of May! The steady progress in the prison ministry continues excellently as we approach the end of the first half of the year.

We begin by expressing our deepest gratitude to our dedicated TFEA partners and spiritual parents. Your unwavering support has made our outreach operations sustainable over the years, allowing us to reach more souls than we could ever imagine. Furthermore, your continued spiritual guidance and advice have kept us grounded in our vision and mission, providing the wisdom needed to navigate challenges and lead our teams with grace.

RUBINDI PRISON LAUNCH & IMPACT

This month, we launched into the Rubindi prison with excellent results. Since our arrival, the response has been overwhelmingly positive. Inmates and staff alike have welcomed our teams, and we are witnessing an environment of hope and transformation. Our on-ground TFEA inmate team continues to run daily morning and evening cell church services, which has been vital in keeping the fire burning at the altar. **Rubindi Launch Statistics: 12 Prison Events, Total Respondents: 709, First-Time Salvations: 681** (all baptized in the Name of Jesus).

THE POWER OF BIBLE DISTRIBUTION

All respondents in Rubindi received Bibles, with some sharing among themselves so we could distribute our supply responsibly. We thank you so much for this provision; the Bible is our greatest tool in the prison ministry. It continues to speak to the inmates long after we leave and sustains them until we return for the Prisoners of Pain, God's Grace events. Having an adequate supply of scriptures has been a massive blessing to the East African TFEA ministry. When we read through the testimonies, we are amazed at the working of God's grace. These Bibles are changing inmates' lives by helping them overcome suicidal thoughts, speaking words of comfort that we were unable to speak, and placing the Word of God directly into the hands of those seeking redemption.

MINISTRY REACH & FUTURE GOALS

We are currently in **20 prison facilities**, with **1,212 cell churches**. Our target is 25 prison facilities this year, meaning we are hoping to cover 5 more prisons. The cell churches continue daily in fellowship, prayer, and discipleship among inmates, actively turning correctional facilities into centers of spiritual renewal and revival.

TEAM HEALTH & RESILIENCE

We thank God for the physical strength and dedication of our team. We give thanks for the good health and protection of all our volunteers. Our teams have remained energetic and resilient, allowing us to maintain a consistent and highly impactful ministry.

Superintendent Emmanuel's WAY Church Report - May 2026

We greet you in the mighty Name of Jesus, thank you for your wisdom and support, we realize that the provision of bicycles has been Godly wisdom because the work is easier and faster now. The Lord has enlarged our boundaries, when we reported 37 geographical centers earlier, more new centers were confirmed the very next day in the first week of June, we now have 41 centers in total, the physical visits and establishment of these new 4 centers plus inclusion on the TFEA outreach map are in progress and will be complete by mid-June.

Our system of call centers has helped us greatly. It allows us to get information to the Mega Center from Elders quickly, saving fuel, and enabling us to collect data even during difficult times of Ebola virus without traveling physically.

The out break of new churches continues uncontrollably, our eyes and ears remain open to follow up wherever God is moving.

The additional 2 motorbikes have made supervision and follow up much easier. The 12 additional bicycles have been distributed to the Elders at a ratio of 1 bicycle for every 6 Elders and this has greatly eased mobility for visits and reporting. We now have 52 bicycles. We deeply appreciate your blessing upon the widows, construction has started on the lower plots of the Mega Center and we have already collected trees and wall sticks from well-wishers. This is bringing hope to those who have suffered many years in grass huts. May testimonies of healings deliverances, and transformational victories have been submitted for translation from Runyankore, Western Uganda revival through TFEA ministry is evident. God is working mightily in our midst.

What you have sown is already bearing fruit and today the Elders gathered at the Mega Center compound to receive the bikes and are standing with the bicycles as you see in the picture with their traffic reflector jackets ready to move, full of joy and expectation. The excitement is real.*

Loice and I, with Emanuel, have even more to praise God for: the company that sells us reconditioned bikes blessed us with a bonus bike for being consistent customers and also we were able to bargain for 11 bikes, and so we now have 12 more bikes ready to go. God is good to us!! When they arrived we distributed them to the different centers so our evangelists can take the good news into the villages like never before. What a joyful day this was. Thank you for standing with us. We are looking ahead with renewed hope, believing this is the start of a season where many more will hear and come to know Christ. Praise the Lord! Praise the Lord! Construction has Started on 20 more Widow Homes



New Style Widow Homes that have windows on each end.

We have sent the funds to Uganda for the construction of 20 more of these new style, cemented smooth wall, widow homes that will last for many years for widows who have no other way of getting into a safe and secure place to live.

Each new home has 2 widows which are oriented to the location to direct the wind exposure and sunlight.

The construction is being done by the WAY of Jesus Community School construction class under the guidance of our Engineers Michael and Ronald. The Government is providing firebricks and the students are building walkways for the widows and their families.

The cost of providing one of these homes is approximately \$250.

Joy Tushabe, female, 78 years Old

For years, my children and grandchildren always told me that before I die, they would build for me a decent house, but my two sons died, one was killed by the hippo, another drowned in the river, all my hopes were shattered and I knew I would live and die in the forest and be buried right there. Living in the forest reserve felt like we were hidden from the real world and we were constantly afraid of being evicted. I never thought I would ever live in a real, modern house. God is merciful, after staying at the big church and volunteering in compound cleaning, recently Emmanuel and Harriet handed me a home, a modern house where I live with my children and grandchildren, this is a life dream up to now, but I know it's real, my God has made a way for me. The big church didn't just give me a house, they gave me a peaceful night's sleep and a spiritual place to raise my children.

Specioza Mukankusi, female, 77 years Old

When my husband passed away 27 years ago, I thought life was over, I desired death because I saw no reason to live and suffer all my life, he left me in the middle of nowhere with 14 young children, and 4 grandchildren. Staying in the government forest reserve meant constant fear of eviction, transfers, and digging food on the rocks to survive, I had to sellout my self to anyone to survive with my children, it was painful but I had no escape route, we were always struggling, with no permanent roof over our heads, we sold the surplus food to buy a canvas every three months to stay safe. Today, stepping into my new home feels like a dream. God indeed has shown us that widows are not forgotten. My children finally have a secure home, living with real people in a real place, closing the door and opening the door, my children are not used to this, sometimes we leave the door open, because we are not used to having keys, how can this be? If not for God? God has remembered us.

Florence Kyomugisha, female, 78 years old

There is no way to tell you all how I feel or how my children feel at this time, we kept thanking God and people every time until they told us it's enough, but we feel its not yet enough, so we keep saying thank you to everyone, the big Church and Emmanuel and Harriet, it is hard to express the joy in my heart. Leaving the harsh conditions of the forest and being given a beautiful, modern home by the big church has changed everything about my life. I no longer worry about leaking roofs or the authorities chasing us away. I feel like a respected member of the community again.

Jane Busingye, female, 75 years Old

I never had any children during my youth, because I desired to work hard and build myself after several failed marriages. When I started living in the government reserve, I worked hard through digging and selling crops hoping that I could eventually get money and have my own land and house, but as years went by, I realized that this was impossible and so I settled in the government reserve forest and that was my only hope and destiny, we were always viewed as encroachers on earth. But the big church people saw us as human beings who deserve a better life. Me getting this beautiful home is like a dream up to now, something unbelievable, but I can't tell you now how it feels to have a permanent place I can proudly call my own. All I can say is, "I thank you Jesus", thank you to the big church people for loving and considering me, I have nothing to give you back but my heart prays for you every minute for God to bless you.

Robinah Kabagenyi, female, 73 years old

I cannot thank the big church people, my new found family enough for this incredible gift. It has taken me some time now transitioning from the forest mindset, into a proper, modern house mindset, I keep forgetting where I am. Its unbelievable, there are no moving animals at night, no rain falling on us all night, no sound of the canvas with drops of rain all night, no extremely cold nights, no setting fire to chase animals at night, no constant fear of eviction, this has really transformed our daily lives and our health. We have been given hope, security, and a beautiful future. I feel so much love and appreciation for everyone who made this possible for us and our children

Petrous Mutekangomayesihem, female, 71 years old

I was stuck inside the dark Ruhenda forest for years, after the death of my husband. My husband died of malaria that had been untreated for long, he worked hard for us and he was our only hope with my two children. As a young widow with two children, I didn't know how to raise them alone. After many years of suffering and hopelessness, my son who had been in prison for 20 years was released and that was my turning point. Salvation came to our home through the testimony of my son's release and salvation in prison. He took us to the big church, and we became part of the big church family, life begun to change, and it felt like we have many relatives, now recently the church gave me a home, a safe home and a community. My daughter who had been an alcoholic gave her life to Christ and lives with me at the church, my son was given a bicycle and is involved in the work of the ministry, the church is our new and forever home, I no longer feel broken and angry. I thank God I have a peaceful place to stay.

Mwene Rugyenza Pauline, female, age 67

My husband Mark died of lung cancer. He left me in the middle of nowhere, with my six children, I was just 27 years old, my children were still young and all we had was a small hut in the forest, no food, no hope. The loneliness crushed me daily. I had no parents to run to. I thought my husband was my shelter in this world, I was left with nothing and nowhere to go. The sufferings we have gone through cannot be described by words, but also the comfort and relief that we feel right now cannot be described by human words. Since the big church welcomed me into my new home, I met my fellow widows, we shared our testimonies, we cried together and healed. I have never felt alone again. I have sisters in Christ around me, and we laugh and pray together every single day. I thank the big church for opening their doors for us. I was hopeless but now I feel protected, safe, and truly loved by my church family.
