What Every Delta Should Know

WHO SPEAKS FOR THE CHAPTER?

The Chapter President or her designee speaks for the chapter. No one has the authority to speak for or make a commitment for the Chapter unless authorized by the Chapter President.

PROGRAMS/PUBLIC MATERIALS

On programs where the Founders are listed, place a note at the bottom (*Deceased).

The title "soror" should not be printed on programs for public events.

ATTIRE

The word "uninterrupted" is not a part of Deltas requirement. Example: Silver and gold buttons are often on suits but we prefer white.

RESPECTFUL OBSERVANCES AND RECOGNITION

FOUNDERS: The names of Founders should be listed on all Founders Day programs.

The use of the Founders pictures should be limited to official documents, posters, and wall hangings. Their pictures are not for casual usage, such as on T-shirts, tote bags, puzzles, screen savers, etc.

CHARTER MEMBERS: Sorors who organize chapters are called charter members. They are not called founders or founding members.

REGIONAL DIRECTOR/REGIONAL REP-RESENTATIVE: When the Regional Director and/or Regional Representative enter a regional or chapter activity, and when they are introduced, the membership stands and remains standing until these revered sorors are seated.

Misuse of Delta Symbols: It is inappropriate to use Delta Sigma Theta Sorority's letters, symbols, and other official insignia on body parts. For example: branding, tattooing, head shaving; fingernails and toenails; or any piercings, other than earlobes.

Delta paraphernalia should not be worn in casinos, nightclubs, and bars. The elephant and duck are not symbols of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., and should not be used.

~ Message for March 2014 ~

"Maintain Unity"

The church of Ephesus, during the time of Apostle Paul, encompassed both Jews and Gentiles, both men and women, both rich and poor, and both masters and slaves. It was comprised of a lot of different thinking people. And where differences exist, so does friction.

One concern Paul wrote about to the Ephesians was the issue of unity. But observe what Paul said regarding this issue in Ephesians 4:3. 
