INTRODUCTION:

Check-ins!

First, go around and share each other's names once again, just in case there are new faces in your group! Then, share some check-ins. This can go as following:

- Share your name, and how old you are/what grade you are in!
- What was your favorite part of last week?
- What was hard last week?
- What was something new you learned last week?

There are a couple different formats you can use. Here is some inspo!

Lemon - Lotus - Lollipop

Lemon is something sour (bad) that happened, lotus is something new you learned, lollipop was your sweet moment of the week!

High - Low - Buffalo

High point of the week, low point, and something cool you experienced!

Mountain - Valley - Treetop

Mountain is the high point of the week, valley is low point, treetop was a moment that pointed to God!

Shoe - Hat - Backpack

Shoe represents somewhere you went, hat represents a moment you'll remember, and a backpack was something you learned to take with you in the future!

BOOK:

Open the conversation with Sunday Schoolers by talking about what they've learned about how rivers, lakes, and all water is full of life. Share that today's story also mentions the life within these waters; and a big gulp!

Jonah and the Whale!

Read the story of Jonah and the Whale in Jonah 1-3. You can also find this story in the SPARK Bible on Page 190!

Have campers make actions with their hands when they hear certain words or events. For example when they hear about water, have them make wave motions with their hands. When God gives a command, have them pretend to speak into a megaphone! When Jonah doesn't do what God says, have them cross their arms across their chest and shake their head "no". And, of course, when the big fish swallows up Jonah, have them make an engulfing motion with their hands!

This can be a lot to remember, so you can also have them act it out as you read! As they hear words or actions, tell them to act it all out in their own way!

Ask Sunday Schoolers the following questions:

- Why was God asking Jesus to go to Nineveh? (So that people would live in the way of God's love.)
- Why do you think that Jonah said "no"? (Let them guess the different answers!)
- Why do you think God chose to send a fish?

LOOK:

God made you special!

In this story, we learn that God is watching out and cares for each of us; and God needs our help sometimes to make sure that we are caring for others. We are called to care for each other, and think of others before ourselves!

Have Sunday Schoolers share some of the gifts and talents they have. Explain that sometimes, God wants us to use these gifts and talents to share God's love with others. This is why God made us all unique! God has made you the way you are for a special purpose. Just like God made Jonah for his purpose, to share the good news with the people of Nineveh!

TOOK:

Materials: Sunday schoolers will need paper, and markers!

Here is a fish that Sunday Schoolers were sent as a cut out- if they don't have it, invite them to create any COOI fish they want on the paper.

For this activity Sunday Schoolers will spend a few minutes creating a fish or using the template on a blank piece of paper. Invite Sunday Schoolers to get as creative as they would like! Invite them to think about the story earlier about the Rainbow Fish and the story of Jonah. Once they have completed the fish, Sunday Schoolers will not fill the fish up with gifts that God has given them! Using different color markers, they can write in their gifts that they believe God gave them and makes them special! (WHICH WE WILL ARE)

Once complete have Sunday Schoolers share their fish and gifts. Invite them to put in their room on their fridge etc to serve as a reminder of the many AWESOME gifts each one of us has!
