Transitional Housing Program

Mission

Transitional Housing Program for Veterans is a transitional housing model designed to provide safe and stable housing for both male and female veterans who are committed to returning to employment and/or independent living.

The program provides structure in a respectful, clean and sober environment with individual and group chemical dependency counseling, mental health counseling, employment services, and life skills groups.

Transitional Housing Program for Veterans staff and partners provide veterans with assistance, encouragement, and needed support services to foster lasting stability. They assist veterans in reaching personal goals and breaking the cycle of homelessness.

SERVICES

Case Management: Veterans in the program work in a collaborative partnership with case managers to form an individualized plan. Accountability, progress in achieving goals, and abiding by program rules are cornerstones to continuation in the program.

On-Site Chemical Dependency Services: Veterans in the program have access to individual and group chemical dependency services, including AA and NA groups.

The program is a zero-tolerance environment, with random drug and alcohol testing.

On-Site Mental Health Services: Veterans in the program have access to mental health services to identify issues that need to be addressed and to develop a course of treatment. The treatment plan may include individual and/ or group mental health services. Part of the treatment may include life skills training and community volunteer work.

Transportation: Transitional Housing Program for Veterans has vehicles to transport veterans in the program to case management related appointments. The Port Orchard location is also located near bus lines and is also accessible from the Seattle area.

Women Veterans Wing: The Women Veterans Wing provides more privacy and security for Women Veterans participating in the Transitional Housing Program by offering a separate housing wing dedicated to serving the needs of Women Veterans.



ELIGIBILITY

- Served in any branch of the U.S. Armed Forces
- Received an Honorable/General Under Honorable/Other than Honorable Discharge
- Homeless for one or more nights
- Desire to lead a clean and sober lifestyle
- Desire to make meaningful life changes leading to independent living
- Willing to undergo criminal background check
