MOVE STORY FORWARD



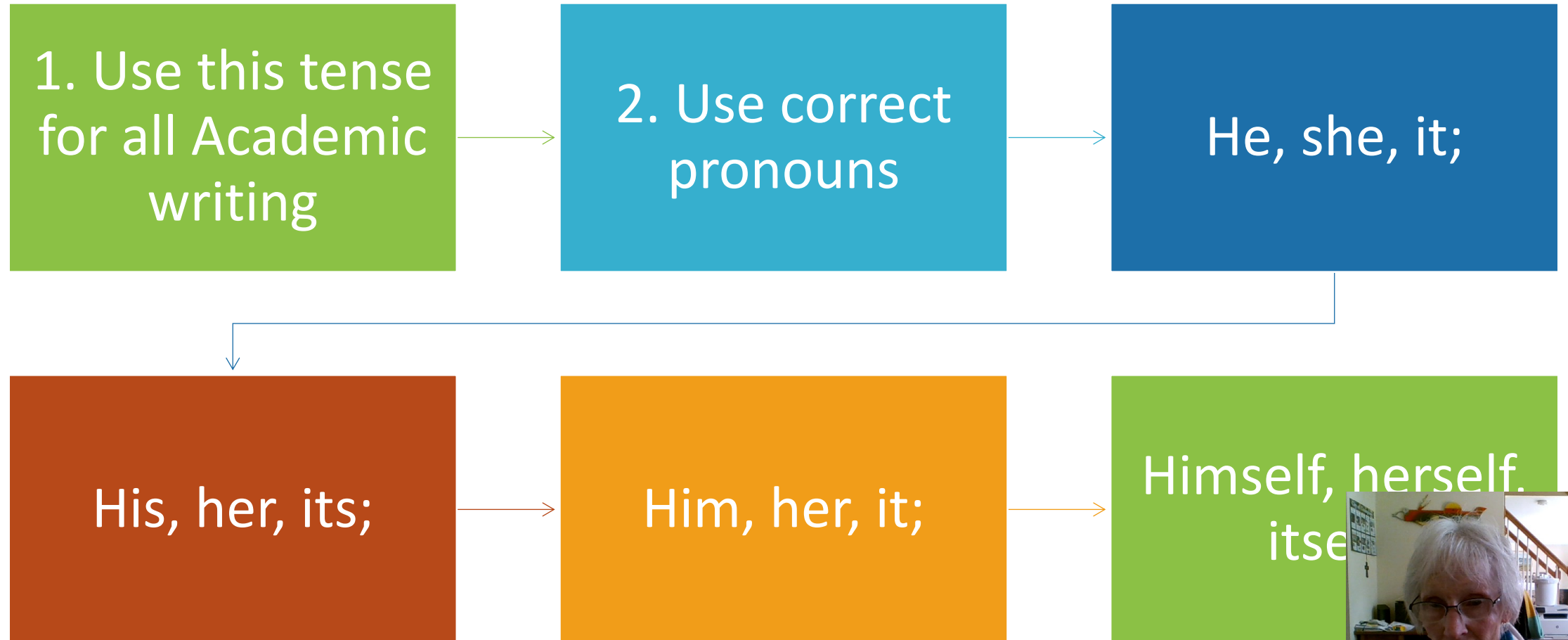
2. PAST TENSE EXPLORES

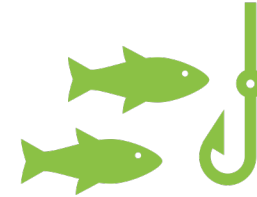

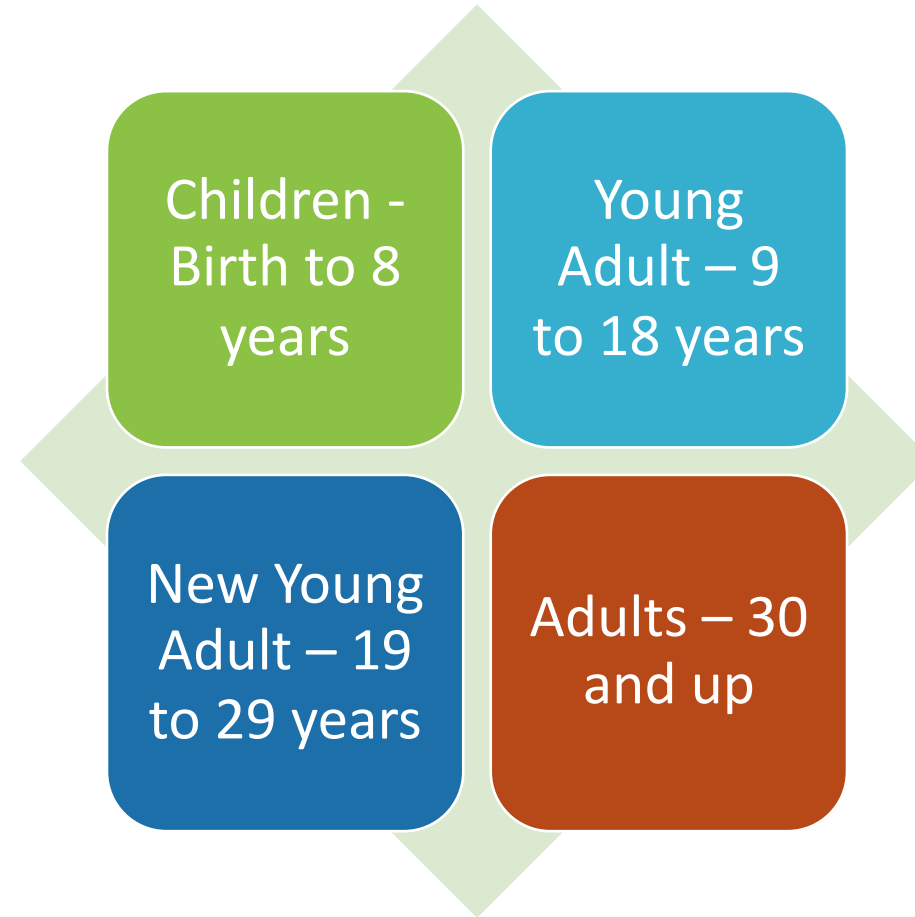

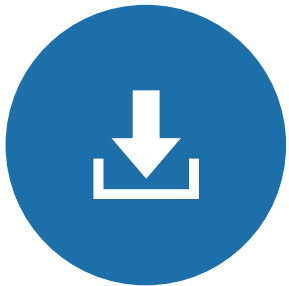
