

Welcome back to our first-ever filmed 2021 Annual Showcase! This year we are picking up where we left off and resuming the *The Tales of Beatrix Potter* from DTL2-G2 and *Napoli* from G3-A2. Our students have been working extremely hard to present the excerpts from these ballets, as well as showcase PPDC solos and ensemble pieces choreographed by our wonderful staff.

I'm so grateful for our dedicated teachers and so proud of our students and parents! Your perseverance and determination to succeed despite the difficulties of online learning and the stress of COVID-19 have inspired me.

Even though many of our plans were derailed by the worldwide pandemic, Rachel's Ballet successfully implemented programs that kept our students dancing. For example, even though we didn't have

our normal *Nutcracker* production this year, we were able to have multiple in-house holiday performances on a smaller scale to a reduced live audience that was broadcasted over Zoom.
