His wonderful wife, Evelyn, was the most important thing in his life and one of the things he loved to do with her was dance. He was an animal lover who always had a dog as a member of his family and fed the birds in his yard every morning. Victor was very happy and content in his final days.

Vic served proudly in the Army from 1942 to 1946 honorably discharged as First Sergeant.

He created his own paycheck his entire life, starting in the coal business in 1935. After World War II he took charge of his parents' tavern business in Frackville. At that time he also started manufacturing and selling lightweight cinder aggregate. He operated these until 1981, when health considerations forced him into active retirement.
