BILL 23

The Province of Ontario wants 1.5 million new homes built in the next 10 years. In the provincial plan Markham has a target of 44,000 homes, which is double the current pace of new home construction for the next decade. We are expected to double our growth while facing a reduction in revenue from development which allows us to build strong, vibrant neighbourhoods that residents have come to expect. To ensure we have new parks, community centres and the necessary road network, the City will need to significantly raise property taxes or risk overcrowding in existing amenities and services across the city. Municipalities use a model that growth should pay for growth and without changes to Bill 23 this will shift the burden of growth to existing Markham taxpayers. A high level estimate from city staff could result in a 50-80% increase to property taxes if we maintain existing service levels (depending on regulations that are not yet defined.) The impact of the property tax increase is estimated at \$600 - \$1000 per year to the average homeowner. Every resident should be concerned on the impacts that this will have on all of us.

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Markham Council approved the City's 2023 Budget of \$668.6 M including a 3 per cent property tax rate increase.

The 3.00% property tax increase translates to an increase of approximately \$38.85 in property taxes for the average residential household in Markham. The tax rate increase includes 2.4% for Markham's day-to-day operations and 0.60% for infrastructure investments.

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2023 Water/Wastewater Rate

Markham purchases water through York Region and the Region provides Markham with wastewater treatment services. The purchase price for the water includes the Region's cost for water distribution and wastewater treatment services.

The 2023 Budget results in a 3.8% increase to the water and wastewater rate of \$4.7937m³.

Markham's portion of the rate increase is necessary in order to:

- > Fund the day-to-day operations of the Waterworks Division within the Environmental Serviced Department
- > Fund the future replacement of existing water and wastewater assets over the next 25 years
- > Compensate the increase as imposed by the Region and to catch up with the temporary pause of water rate increase during the past two years due to pandemic

Box Grove Community Housing Development

The City of Markham is one of Canada's most diverse communities and the need for affordable housing remains high. York Region is exploring an opportunity to develop community housing at the corner of 14th Avenue and Donald Cousens Parkway in the Box Grove neighbourhood. Initial project plans are considering a midrise development of approximately 150 units with both affordable and market rental units. The project is in the early planning stage and once complete, will provide much-needed rental housing options for families, seniors and those living alone. Your input is important and helps ensure York Region's plan best considers the community's needs. Here are ways you can get involved:

Stray Animals

Markham is not only home to humans. We coexist with different wildlife such as foxes. coyotes and rats. There is also an increasing number of deceased birds due to the Avian Bird Flu situation in Markham. There are measures you can take to make sure that we are able to peacefully

coexist with our wild-neighbours. If you find a stray domestic animal or sick or injured wildlife, please call the Contact Centre at 905-415-7531 or email animalservices@markham.ca to report to Animal Services. An animal service officer will come on site to get the animal to provide them with the care and protection needed. Construction Noise By-Law

The operation of any equipment connected with construction is only allowed between Monday and Friday 7am to 7pm and Saturday 9am to 5pm. Construction noise is prohibited Sundays & all Statutory Holidays. This includes home renovations and the replacement of a roof.

Road Watch

Road Watch is a community driven program that provides residents with a means to report aggressive or unlawful driver behavior. Unsafe lane changes, disobeying traffic lights and stop signs are some typical types of behaviours that qualify for a Road Watch submission.
