A. About the GIS Choral Music Handbook

The purpose of this handbook is to acquaint choir students and parents with all the aspects of membership in the choirs. Read and keep this handbook in your assigned folders. It is my hope that the information included will make participation more enjoyable and rewarding.

C. Green Intermediate School Organizations

- 1. **Fifth Grade Choir** This ensemble is composed of fifth grade students with treble voices. The group will sing unison and two-part music.
- 2. **Sixth Grade Choir-** This ensemble is composed of sixth grade students with treble and changing voices. This group will sing unison and two-part music.

F. Grading

1. Classroom Participation and Conduct

You can earn up to 6 points each day. Class points are based on positive participation and performance, motivation, effort, cooperation, quality of work, self evaluation, and the following of school and classroom policies and rules. See the Participation Rubric in this handbook. NO CELL PHONES PERMITTED IN CHOIR ROOM.

2. Attendance at Performances

Public performance of the music we rehearse in class is the "final test" for choir. Therefore, you must participate in <u>ALL</u> performances of the choir in which you are a member. If there is a conflict with the scheduled performance, please see the section below, Absence from a Performance.

You can earn full credit for **EACH** performance by:

- ✓ Attending all performances
- ✓ Being prompt for all performances
- ✓ Being well groomed and wearing required concert attire
- ✓ Making a positive contribution to the performance
- ✓ Observing proper concert etiquette

***** Absence from a Performance

While concerts have been planned around the district calendar, unavoidable conflicts will come up. Absences can be excused or unexcused. If you have any concerns or questions about an excused absence, please contact me.

- 1. **Excused** If you have a conflict with a performance, due to a school, Green Local sporting, or family event, please email me (starralaina@greenlocalschools.org) at least a week in advance of the performance. If an emergency illness, accident, or occurrence arises prior to a performance, call the school and leave a voicemail for me at 330-896-7700 ext. 613112. Any excused absence will be given an alternate assignment in order to make up the grade missed by the performance absence.
- 2. **Unexcused** Extraordinary circumstances will be handled on an individual basis, but an absence for any other reason is usually not excused. In this case you would not be given an alternate assignment in place of the performance and you would not be able to earn points toward your grade.

G. Concert Attire

All Green Intermediate School students are required to purchase a Green Local Schools Choir Shirt to wear at concerts with black pants and black shoes. If you already own the shirt, you are set. If you need to purchase a shirt, the online store link is posted in Canvas. The store closes on 9/18
