Battery recycling update – here is additional detail on the program we are attempting to upgrade. All of the information I gathered during my research came from the Hennepin County Environment & Energy Department. All of the trash from Lee Square is taken to downtown Minneapolis and is incinerated. It does not go to a landfill. We are asking you to place your alkaline batteries in the trash because they are safely incinerated and cause no harm to the environment. If you place them in your kitchen or bathroom trash, which is already bagged, you would **not** need to Ziploc them

The other types of batteries, botton, hearing aid, rechargeable **do** need to be Ziploc bagged and put into the battery recycling containers provided in the trash rooms. Please do not place them in the dumpsters!!

We set up some tables in the car wash area on Wednesday and started sorting through the buckets of batteries that have been accumulating for 20-25 years. We finished the same day, and all the alkaline batteries were put in the trash. A big shout out to those who helped: **Dianne Laniel, Mike Laniel, Lee Ann Thurston, Delores Killian, Mike Ellison, Gary Huser, and Tom Werbowski. Please thank them if you see them!!**

Subject: November 2021 Newsletter Update

I can provide you with the following updates for your November newsletter –

36th **Avenue Traffic and Pedestrians** – no progress on video review since last update – staff is heavily involved in the feverish activity of trying to finish up construction work for the season.

WTP – the activity at the site continues. Retaining wall construction at the back of the site is well progressed. Upper floor concrete is being poured and metal roof framing being erected ready for the roof. Inside the building, pipework installation continues and some walls have been painted.

Lee Avenue – black dirt has been installed and is being spread. We expect sod to be laid later this week. The base asphalt layer in 37th together with the final layer of asphalt over the entire project are scheduled toward the end of next week. That will effectively complete the work on the project apart from some minor cleanup and "odds and ends".


