Weather was wonderful and all had great fun!



36th AVE N & KYLE AVE CROSSWALK AND WATER TREATMENT PLANT UPDATE

Subject: RE: October Newsletter/Lee Square

I can provide you with the following updates -

36th **Avenue Traffic and Pedestrians** – the footage from the police camera is waiting to be reviewed. Right now, there is too much construction activity for us to dedicate someone to watch the hours of footage to tally the details. It is likely we will not have the resources to review this until outside work slows down some.

WTP – the activity at the site continues. All the wall panels have been delivered and erected on site. Work has started on the retaining wall along the back of the site (the side closest to the Railroad line). Structural steel deliveries are being received on site. This steel will be used to frame the various wall and floor sections within the building as the Contractor works his way to fully enclosing the building prior to winter.

Lee Avenue – concrete curb and gutter started this week. Work in 37th Avenue is still required. This work has been delayed while the wall panels were being delivered to the WTP and will take place once we can co-ordinate alternate site access with the WTP Contractor.

That's what I have for now. Please let me know if you have any questions.


