TREASURER REPORT

Year to date, as of November 30, 2025, Lee Square Cooperative's Net Operating income is \$46,847.

Reserves: As of 11/30/2025 our total reserve fund balance was \$1,414,964.

The Reserve Fund expenses, reflected in November's statement, totaled \$6,778. This expense was for the repair and replacement of leaking pipes in the garage area. Reserve funds are used to complete repairs and maintenance of the cooperative structure.

After the December financial statements are published in January, I plan to provide a more thorough Treasurer's report related to 2025 results.
