Reminder for those of you using the workshop in the garage, please clean up after your project is done. A member reports having to spend 45 minutes cleaning up a huge mess before he could start on his own project. He requested a safety camera to be installed. A WIFI camera will not work in the garage, any other kind of camera is too expensive at this time. Keep this space clean and SAFE for others to use at all times.

Another member reports noticing many new scams received via email and on her cell phone. She suggests using protection offered from your bank or credit card company. Don't let anyone pressure you into making a decision, that's a scam. Never send money or gift cards to anyone other than trusted family/friends. Unless you know who is calling, do not answer the call, let it go to voicemail. If an unknown caller is claiming you owe money, asking for a fee, claiming to be your bank, Amazon, Celebrity, Lawyer etc. DO NOT respond to them. Make the call to your trusted source, they will confirm you just received a spam/fraud/scam call or email. Share your experience with others to avoid someone else being a victim.

TREASURER REPORT

Year to date, as of August 31, 2025, Lee Square Cooperative's Net Operating income is \$17,440. This total will likely continue to decrease as the annual expenses are paid; for example, property tax and insurance. This is ok and not unexpected, as we are on track to make the year-end goal of break-even.

Reserves: As of August 31, 2025 our total reserve fund balance was \$1,361,979. No withdrawals were made during the month of August. YTD 2025 withdrawals from Reserves total \$170,167. These Reserve funds are used to complete repairs and maintenance of the cooperative structure.

Donations: The Finance Committee is monitoring the collection of member donations. There has been an uptick in donations from members for various projects around the Coop. The Finance Committee and J-Team are working toward procedures to track the receipt and distribution of these funds. This information will be shared in the upcoming months.

Budget 2026:

The 2026 Budget process began at the end of August and will continue through September. The Budget Focus Group, including J-Team, and representatives from the Building & Grounds and Finance committees, and the Board of Directors, will be meeting weekly to fine tune the projections for the 2026 Operating expenses of Lee Square Cooperative.
