Pastor's Column



From the Desk of Pastor Marv Herman

As we approach the months of November and December, let's take a moment to reflect with gratitude, our Howarth and Paint Creek churches, our community, and our friends and family. In a world where challenges often overshadow our blessings, it's essential to remind ourselves of the abundance in our lives. especially as we celebrate Thanksgiving and Christmas.

Thanksgiving evokes fond memories for me, just as it does for many of you. I recall my childhood days in school when we crafted pilgrim hats and Native American headdresses. reenacting the first Thanksgiving. Whether or not those stories were historically accurate didn't seem to matter to us back then; what mattered was the joy we had by celebrating the time we had together. I can still remember the pictures of tracing my hand on paper to create a picture of a colorful turkey, which my mother proudly displayed on our refrigerator each year.

Memories of gathering around family table the during Thanksgiving always filled my heart with warmth and laughter. I can still hear my Grandfather Fred Herman speaking Thanksgiving Day as our family gathered saying, "Remember this meal and be thankful; take this time together


