- The pre-eminent mentorship program for Canada's housing and homelessness sector
- Offers a combination of programming and mentorships designed to strengthen leadership capacity in the sector



- The destination for education, professional standards, and accreditation for Canada's community housing sector
- Offers training, coaching, and resources for both experienced and novice housing professionals



Intro to the Housing Professionals Mentorship Program (HPMP)

OUR MISSION – to strengthen leadership in the housing and homelessness sector by:

- Building strategic networks and community
- Developing leadership competencies
- Igniting passion and interest in housing
- Supporting career development
- Enhancing knowledge around core housing themes (e.g., housing policy, advocacy, asset management and development, operations)

OUR IMPACT – HPMP has matched over 250 housing professionals across Canada (and beyond!) since 2018.

- The 2022 cohort features 80 participants

 38 mentors and 42 mentees spanning nine provinces, two territories, and one US state
- Recipient of a Canadian Society of Association Executives Award for Distinction



HPMP Overview

- Connects experienced housing professionals with those who are looking for mentorship to strengthen the community housing sector
- Revolves around an assigned mentorship based on different criteria (interests, expertise, geographic location, etc.), coupled with programming and other professional development opportunities
- Runs from February to July each year; the application period happens September to November
- Costs \$400 for mentees, and \$0 for mentors






