Duties of a Volunteer Firefighter

Lewis County Fire District #6

Fire suppression. Volunteer firefighters use fire hose to extinguish a variety of fires including small fires in dumpsters caused by a tossed cigarette. They also put out car fires in parking lots. A Volunteer firefighter can perform the same duties that a Career firefighter can, with proper training.

Search and rescue. Volunteer firefighters may be called upon to assist with search efforts when a reported missing person is believed lost or abducted. Good physical conditioning is an asset in quickly covering a remote area where a body might be hidden.

Traffic control. The duties of a volunteer firefighter can include directing traffic at the scene of a fire or major accident to assist police or state patrol officers. They may set up cones and roadblocks to reroute traffic in other directions.

Emergency Medical Services. Depending on the department, volunteer firefighters may need CPR and first-aid certification through organizations such as the Red Cross. Training in basic life-support methods and having an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) credential is helpful because they are often the first responders on the scene of fires or accidents.

Drive Emergency Apparatus. If you are 21 or older and meet the qualifications to drive emergency vehicles, you can assist by responding to an incident with a variety of apparatus.

Other Duties. On occasion, you may be asked to perform a task not explained in this document. This document is not intended to be an exhaustive list of responsibilities but, rather, offers a glimpse into various jobs that you may be required to perform.

Support Role of Volunteer Firefighters

Community outreach. Volunteer firefighters may visit schools, participate in parades, and attend community gatherings to promote fire safety. Working with the career staff, volunteers can assist with any program that the department puts on to raise public awareness.

Fire station chores. Some volunteer firefighters sleep overnight at the fire station and share in the routine tasks of daily living such as cooking, cleaning, and laundry. They regularly inspect and maintain tools, equipment, and fire apparatus.

Administrative Work. Volunteer firefighters may assist with office and administrative duties. They author reports and compile information. They plan regular training exercises and drills that volunteer firefighters must attend to keep their skills sharp.

What We Offer Our Volunteers Lewis County Fire District 6

Training. Using a Volunteer Task Book, you will be trained in every aspect of the fire service, including the Incident Command System (ICS). From answering the department phone to advancing a charged hose line into a structure on fire, you will learn the very basics of firefighting. Also, opportunities are available for you to learn and use medical skills. As you progress in your role as a volunteer, more advanced training will be offered to you. Within your first year of volunteering with Lewis County Fire District 6, you can take the Firefighter I exam. These courses will allow you to be recognized by Washington as a Certified Firefighter. With this certification you can get a career position, if desired, with LCFD 6 or any other department in the state.

Development of interpersonal skills. Working as part of a team, you will gain insight and instruction on life skills. One of the greatest dynamics of the fire service is the time when we are not responding to an emergency. You will learn how to have a good relationship with others, how to solve problems, and how to resolve conflicts. These skills will equip you with the ability to interact with various age groups and prepare you for dealing with the public when called to respond.

What We Require of Our Volunteers

Lewis County Fire District 6

- Once you have met the qualifications to become a volunteer firefighter you will be assigned to a Shift Officer who will oversee completion of your task book and work with you to achieve your FF1 certification.
- Dedicate 24 hours per month to your assigned shift. These shifts must be scheduled one
 month in advance. This will allow the Shift Officer ample time to prepare your training
 for that shift. Your shift can be a minimum of 4 hrs. up to 24 hrs. The number of hours
 you dedicate to the volunteer service, the faster you can progress to Firefighter 1
 certification.

• Be available to respond by apparatus to calls outside of your scheduled shift. There are various stipends available for compensation based on non-shift response, shift response, or training. These will be explained during the initial stages of application.

Eligibility for Volunteer Firefighter Program Lewis County Fire District 6

- 1) You must be 18 years of age to apply. 21 years of age to drive emergency apparatus.
- 2) Pass a background check and have established a pattern of responsible citizenship as evidenced by the absence of the following:
 - a) Convictions for an offense that is a felony in Washington State.
 - b) Convictions for a gross misdemeanor offense in the past seven (7) years.
 - c) Convictions for a misdemeanor offense in the past five (5) years.
 - d) Convictions for any domestic violence offense.
 - e) Indicators that your integrity, honesty, character, or work ethics would be incompatible with the standards and values of Lewis County Fire District 6.

Steps to Becoming A Volunteer Firefighter

Lewis County Fire District 6

- 1) Complete and sign the volunteer firefighter application and waiver forms and mail or submit to Lewis County Fire District 6.
 - a) Station 61 (Headquarters)2123 Jackson Hwy.Chehalis, WA 98532
- 2) Schedule an appointment for a Station Tour. The Chief, Volunteer Coordinator, or designee will give you an overview of the station, the apparatus, and the life of a firefighter working a shift for the District.
- 3) Schedule first Ride-a-Long. This will last approximately 4 hours. You will get to ride in the apparatus, work with some of the equipment, and get a feel for how you will fit in as a volunteer firefighter. After the initial Ride-a-Long, two more Ride-a-Longs must be scheduled with the two other shifts.

After the three Ride-a-Longs, the shift Lieutenants, Volunteer Coordinator, and the Chief will review your work as a candidate and determine if you will continue with the process.

4) If you move forward in the volunteer process you will be asked to attend an orientation at which time you will fill out all necessary paperwork, be directed to take a physical exam, and be subject to a criminal history and driver's license check. Once all the necessary information is received by the District, you will receive a shift assignment and firefighting gear.

All applicants for volunteer positions with Lewis County Fire District #6 will have their driving records evaluated. Lewis County Fire District #6 uses the violation point system listed below. If your permanent driving record reflects a total of six (6) points or more for a period of 7 years preceding the date of your application, or to the discretion of the Fire Chief, you will not be allowed to continue in the process. Therefore, if you know that your driving record is less than six points, you may apply. However, any new violations that occur before the completion of the probationary process, which put your total score over six points, will disqualify you. Annual evaluation of a member's driving record may be made during a member's volunteer service. Any current member found in violation of this evaluation will result in the suspension of driving privileges and/or termination of volunteer service with Lewis County Fire District #6.
