Deworming Schedule:

Deworm all horses every six weeks with fecal examinations once or twice yearly or as otherwise determined by the doctor.

Give Quest Plus on months 3, 6, 9, and 12.

This deworming regimen may be modified depending on individual farm and horse variations.

Date Given

Vaccination Schedule:

Foals:

- Deworm at 2-4 weeks of age, then monthly, alternating between Strongid (pyrantel) and Panacur (fenbendazole). Dose according to current weight. Continue this regimen until one year old.
- Begin vaccinations at 3-4 months of age or as otherwise determined by the doctor.
- Booster vaccines 4 weeks later, then follow adult schedule.

Adult Horses:

- · Core (every 6 months) Includes:
 - o Rabies
 - o Tetanus, Eastern & Western Equine Encephalomyelitis
 - o West Nile
- . Influenza/Rhinopneumonitis: Every 6 months
- Strangles: Given yearly prior to likely exposure.
- Coggins (EIA): Once yearly
- Other vaccines may be recommended based on risk, such as Leptospirosis & Botvax

Notes:

- Pregnant Mares should receive Rhinopneumonitis at 5th, 7th, and 9th months of pregnancy. Routine vaccines to be given approximately one month before foaling.
- Foals need IGg test at 12-24 hours and newborn treatments, including enema, iodine navel, and selenium injection
- Dental Care: Assessed during Wellness Exams every 6 months and treatment performed as needed.
- Hoof Care: Performed at least quarterly, generally every six to eight weeks (hooves assessed during Wellness Exams every 6 months)
