

Assigning Committee Short Rules
(revised June 2021)

A. Purpose

The purpose of these guidelines is to make assigning more efficient for our membership body in order to give the officials enough time to receive their schedules, and plan from week to week. These guidelines are designed to assist the Assigner by reducing the amount of turnback's and issues that may present themselves while assigning.

B. Guidelines

1. Veto Power by Committee

- a. The Committee will analyze the schedule and may by a 2/3 majority vote change any assignment(s). Prior to such vote it is strongly recommended that the Committee express their concerns to the Assigner and give him the opportunity to address the concerns and make changes, which shall be done within 24 hours. Amongst other things, the Committee shall focus on fair distribution of games, and not having officials doing more than two top ten matchups per week as determined by PBC Hoops.

2. Master Schedule Access

- a. Access to the full arbiter master schedule in "viewer mode only."

3. No 3 100's on any Regular Season Game

- a. No 3 officials with a rank of 100 will be assigned to work together on a regular season game unless so scheduled by the Assigner and approved by the Committee. These restrictions will not apply for post season playoffs.

4. Schedule to be submitted 10 days in advance & a maximum of 72 hours to analyze


- a. The Arbiter game assignment schedule will be completed in full and will be given to the Committee at least 10 days prior to the game contest. The Committee will have a maximum of 72 hours from the time received to analyze and address scheduling concerns with the Assigner, or vote to accept the schedule as is. If scheduling concerns are not agreed upon by the Assigner and the Committee, the Committee shall take a vote to make game assignment changes. If a 2/3 majority vote is approved, the assigner shall make the required changes.

C. Limitations

The Committee will work in cooperation with the Assigner in order to make the best possible assignments. These will be based on their best judgement, ranking, crew dynamic, availability and ability to officiate said level of game. Should any issues arise the chairman of the assignment committee will submit issues in writing to the Board Liaison who shall in turn take it to the ECBOA Board of Directors.

The Committee and Assigner will follow the established guidelines and the Board of Directors has the authority to make proposed changes by a majority vote at any time.
