Report from Ministry Search Team for June 2025

The FCCB Ministry Search Team is very pleased to announce that the FCCB church council has approved a congregational meeting on Sunday August 10 to vote on inviting Doug Cameron to become our settled pastor. The draft Call Agreement between Doug and FCCB has been reviewed by Doug, the church council and conference minister Lynn Bunjak. Printed copies of the Call Agreement will be available at Sunday morning services starting June 29th or from Rob Griffin at griffinsuter@hotmail.com.

Doug is familiar to very many of us through his work as substitute minister at FCCB. He will be joining us for our Bonfire Service on Saturday July 12 so that everyone will have a chance to talk with him in a more informal setting. We have also included a short bio from Doug below.

If the congregation votes to call Doug as our settled pastor, he will start on September 1. Due to prior commitments, he will be on unpaid leave in October and resume his duties November 1. Treasurer Rob Griffin has updated the 2025 budget approved at our November 2024 annual meeting to include ministerial compensation for September, November and December. He has also drafted a 2026 budget. Both these budgets indicate that we will continue our strong financial position with Doug as our settled pastor. The budget spreadsheet will be made available along with the Call Agreement starting June 29th.

Doug was born in Rutland and raised in Winooski along with his four siblings. After graduating from Winooski High School, Doug joined the Air Force and served for four years, including 13 months in South Korea.

Upon his discharge, Doug returned to Vermont and began a 30+-year career in electronics sales. As his career was winding down, his lifelong interest in Bible study was increasing, leading him to enroll in the UCC's VAST program, a three-year course of study. During this time, he felt God calling him to ministry, resulting in his being licensed to serve as the Settled Pastor of the East Brookfield Congregational Church, where he served for seven years.

Following his time in East Brookfield, Doug served the Randolph Center church for 18 months, and the Williamstown United Church for seven years, retiring in April 2023. After about six months of retirement, it was clear that God was still calling, and Doug began doing pulpit supply for churches in the Washington Association.

Doug and his wife, Donna, live in East Brookfield. They have three children, eight grandchildren, and five great-grandchildren. In addition to spending time with family, Doug enjoys golf, kayaking, and studying Scripture.

# From the organ bench:

The first half of the 2025 calendar year has seen an abundance of music events here at FCCB.

In addition to contributing my talents at the piano, organ, guitar, choir, bell choir and collaboration with instrumentalists/singers during worship, I have been giving more frequent performances outside of worship. There was a Current Counterpoint Concert in March, a Springtime concert at the beginning of May, and recently, the Summer Solstice program featured the choir similar to that of last June. Other members featured in the program were the Birchwood Trio, Denise Ricker on flute and a newcomer to the choir, Paula Chiuchiolo. This concert received a great deal of praise and enthusiasm from the audience, and the church raised \$254 for Capstone Community Action compared to the \$100 raised in each of the previous concerts. We love what we do, and we want to continue to share our talents in the music world.

### From the Treasurer

We continue to be in a very strong financial position, with no debt and greater income than expenses.

- Ordinary income: Our total income for 2025 year-to-date is \$46,034. However, this total income includes \$6,575 in donations and matching grant to the Building Fund. So our ordinary income year-to-date is \$40,359. This is comparable to our ordinary income at this time in 2024 of \$40,198 (that is, total income of \$41,198 minus Building Fund income of \$1,000).
- Ordinary expense: Our total expense for 2025 year-to-date is \$39,581. However, this

includes \$307 in interest on our Cornerstone Fund loan paid in January and the first half of February, and \$5,744 in one-time building expenses (basement cleaning, parish hall storage, driveway maintenance, new walkway). So our ordinary expense year-todate is \$33,837. This is significantly less than our ordinary expense of \$38,038 at this time in 2024 (\$39,450 in total expense minus \$1,412 in loan interest). The lower expense in 2025 year-to-date is largely due a decrease of \$5,464 in ministry expenses in 2025 year-to-date compared to 2024 year-todate (substitute ministry expense of \$6,329 in 2025 ytd versus total ministry expense of \$11,793 at this time in 2024, including settled pastor and substitute ministry).

Our net total income year-to-date is \$5,619. Our net ordinary income year-to-date is \$6,522. We currently have total assets (excluding building, property, etc) of \$36,564, including Primary Checking of \$9,602, Building Fund of \$393 and Vanguard portfolio (as of March 31, 2025) of \$26,559. Our positive cash flow is enabling us to move toward the \$45,515 in assets we had at the end of 2024, before we paid back \$15,000 on our Cornerstone Fund loan.


