Please go to USRowing and become a member. General liability coverage is available to all members with a current membership and waiver agreement.

Remember that all boats must be signed out and in. This is for safety. We are charged a fee by River Point Marina for our activity so this is another reason that we need to note our activities.

There are procedures for communicating about boats that have been damaged.

We share the city dock with other users, please be mindful of this. Don't be overwhelmed, you'll learn these things as you go.

Riverpoint Marina changes the code to the bathroom occasionally. You can find the code on the white board in the middle bay of Stockton Rowing Club.

We hope that you find the joy of rowing on our precious Delta as a rewarding and fun activity. See you on the water!

SRC CLUB RULES

- 1. Parking is encouraged outside Riverpoint Marina gates.
- 2. Always sign out and in (including coxswains for 4+s and 8+s) on the clipboard in Bay #36.
- 3. Use only club equipment, not private boats. All equipment is listed on the inventory page which has been placed in each bay. Club boats are marked. Each club boat has a sign out sheet. Please locate and complete, signing in and out.
- 4. Do not use advanced equipment that belongs to the club unless you have demonstrated your proficiency to a coach and such use has been approved. (See masters coordinator or adult instruction coordinator if you are unsure.) A partner is required to assist in removing club singles from the boat rack and to and from the water.
- 5. Guests must sign a release of liability waiver. Guest must be accompanied by a boathouse member. Waivers are in a binder by the sign out sheets. Scullers who use club boats must wear rear-view mirrors.
- 6. Leave SRC slings out at your own risk. Items that are stolen or missing should be replaced by the person who left them out.
- 7. Always clean and return all equipment to its proper place in the boathouse.
- 8. If the dock is slippery or icy, do not use unless removed or covered.
- 9. Notify a board member about any damage to club equipment.
- 10. In case of an accident, report any injury to a board member immediately.
- Always lock up when no members will be present in the boathouse. Stockton Rowing is not responsible for any lost or stolen property and only insures SRC equipment.
- 12. Leave the Marina gates locked.
- 13. Always put safety first. See our website for a safety video.

MASTERS' CODE OF CONDUCT

In addition to the RiverPoint Landing Marina-Resort rules and regulations for parking, safety and uses of the property, the following is a general SRC Code of Conduct for all members.

- All rowers and coxswains are on the water to row and learn to better their skill.
 SRC is deeply committed to providing an inclusive and equitable environment for individuals with diverse cultural backgrounds and regardless of their race, gender, socioeconomic status, or physical ability. All rowers, coaches and coxswains will be treated with respect.
- Be courteous and respectful to RiverPoint Marina's staff, guests and other RiverPoint tenants encountered.
- Members will operate with honesty and integrity. Members should work together toward a common goal.
- Members will avoid swearing or shouting. Do not threaten others nor engage in acts of verbal or physical abuse. Bulling, harassment or hazing is strictly prohibited.
- No member is to critique another rower's performance either on or off the water unless specifically requested by the rower. No one rower should be negatively singled out by another rower.
- All members are expected to learn and follow proper boat handling on land and water and to assist each other with safe handling of all equipment.
- All members are expected to treat SRC equipment with care and are responsible for the careful use of equipment on and off the water. Do not use damaged equipment; all damage to equipment is to be immediately reported.
- All members will help keep the boathouse and surrounding area clean and orderly and take any and all personal gear home.
- All members are expected to assist in boat house workdays and participate with other club activities such as Learn to Row and other events than help the sport of rowing.
- Members are expected to use iCrew and notify their Coach or Captain of any absence in advance of a practice or row.
- Alcohol or any other controlled substance is not to be consumed prior to rowing.
 During Masters' regattas, alcohol should not be consumed until all races have been completed and equipment is safely loaded
- Any member found to be in violation of these rules may be suspended or removed from the club and forfeit dues, fees or deposits.
