O give thanks to the Lord for He is good; for His mercy remains forever. *Psalm 106.1*

God's plan for me begins with my birth on March 21, 1928. I was born in Cefalu', Sicily, Italy. My mom and dad were great! They were hard working and God loving. My dad left for America (the land of dreams) to find work and settle his family. He worked in the steel mills of Pennsylvania and the building of the subway in Chicago. Within five years, dad's name came up on the immigration quota list and he returned to Italy and return to the U.S. with mom and me.



God's plan continues. We settled in Chicago, and I will always remember my frightening admission to kindergarten in the local public school (George Washington). I remained in this public school until graduation from 8th grade. Since graduation took place in January and my parents wanted me to be enrolled in a Catholic high school, I was permitted to attend the newly opened Santa Maria Addolorato parochial school from January until June. In June, I enrolled at St. Stanislaus Kostka High School. During my high school years, I began to assist the sisters after school. Here I got to know the Daughters of St. Mary of Providence. I began to feed my curiosity about nuns. I saw them working with students—loving them, encouraging them, making them comfortable in their new environment, their new language and culture (almost all the students enrolled at Addolorato were Italian or other European heritage). I noticed the sisters were professionals and God loving women. They spent time preparing the required material for their students including the most necessary goal for life, namely the love of God, and neighbor, including their dedication to the God to whom they vowed chastity, poverty, and obedience with joy.

God's plan continues. As I began to explore what I was going to do with my life. I began to think — could this be my life in the future? A religious teacher, bringing people to God. Thanks to the Sisters, especially to Sr. Salvatore and Sr. Magdalene, I began to further observe and question. By February 11, 1947, I was able to join the sisters and my religious and professional training began. Novitiate, First profession—August 14, 1949, Perpetual Vows—August 14, 1954.

God's plan continues. My congregation saw to it that I had a well-rounded educational program. Over and above my high school diploma, I was given time to graduate with a Bachelor of Science diploma from Loyola University in Chicago, and a Masters in Education diploma from Eastern Michigan University in Ypsilanti, Michigan. I also received Teacher Certifications for Illinois, Pennsylvania and Michigan.

God's plan continuesnd. My first assignment was St. Mary of Providence School in Chicago. My second assignment was my home parish Santa Maria Addolorata where I taught fourth, seventh and eighth grade. Since 1961, my assignments have all been in the field of special education namely, St. Mary of Providence, Elverson, Pennsylvania,; Our Lady of Providence, Northville, Michigan; the Rose Center, Chicago, Illinois; Mount St. Joseph, Lake Zurich, Illinois—at present.


As you can see, I have never left the U.S.A. I have found fulfilment in serving special people with my Sisters and lay staff with it's surprises God gives us.

O, I have been to Italy, the land of our Founder, for General Chapters and one insightful trip to Bogota' Columbia ... "Blessings".
