The ladies from Mount St. Joseph who attend Riverside Foundation Work and Activity Center (RWA) enjoy a variety of activities. Programming is designed to best help each individual meet their own personal needs and goals. In their core groups they may work on reading, writing, math, budgeting, communication, social and self care skills while also having time to enjoy leisure activities such as music, dancing, outings and art. The warmer weather means more opportunities to go out into the community, whether that be to learn about budgeting at Walmart or the mall; learning about history at the local museums; picking out books at the library or just enjoying a walk in one of the local parks.

RWA contracts with local businesses to complete assembly and packaging jobs. These jobs may be a seasonal such as holiday treat bags or ongoing such as assembling parts for ITW or packaging soap packets used to clean soft ice cream dispensing machines! Whenever possible, MSJ ladies are given the opportunity to work on one or more of these jobs.

Most importantly it is the goal of RWA to give all our clients a program where they feel respected and supported as they work to achieve their goals. Making new friends along the way makes it all the more enjoyable!

NURSING NEWS:

The Nursing Department would like to highlight the wonderful medical staff that are an integral part of caring for the residents of Mount St. Joseph.

Dr. Gurbax Saini is Mount St. Joseph's primary care doctor and is here every week to provide medical care. He also sees residents in his Island Lake office if needed. The residents really like Dr. Saini, are excited to see him, and consider him a friend.

Robin Saini, APN comes to Mount St. Joseph monthly to do ear flushes which each resident receives annually. Dr. Tom Leischner, DDS is our on-site dentist. He and his assistant, Ramona Ory come to Mount St. Joseph on a monthly basis to provide dental care. Dr. Leischner generally brings a little treat to share with his patients—lip gloss and bracelets are favorites among the residents! The nursing department hosts an annual pot luck with the dental team—Dr. Leischner provides the main dish, as he loves to cook!

Dr. Tom Gustafson and Dr. Rachel Hutchins are optometrists. They come to Mount St. Joseph on a monthly basis to do annual eye exams. Their gentle approach provides a calm environment, making the residents feel at ease during their exam. Dr. Rachel recently gave birth to a little girl, so she is taking some time for her family. Dr. Rabia is filling in during her absence.

Dr. Buranosky, Ophthalmologist, sees our residents for cataract care and performs eye surgeries at Highland Park Hospital.

Mount St. Joseph's on-site podiatry care is provided by Dr. Suzanne Roeckell Mareno. Dr. Suzanne visits monthly in order to see the residents on a rotating schedule, every 61 days. She comes early in the mornings so that the residents can catch the bus to their workshop.

Mount St. Joseph Physical and Occupational Therapy services are provided by Anita, Raj, and Garima. They are a wonderful team who work cooperatively with the nurses, doctors, and professional staff. They see residents in the Gross Motor room at Mount St. Joseph and also at Countryside Center of Little City.

Music at MSJ:



Chime classes have been busy preparing new music programs to play for others when they are ready. Four new members have been added to these classes so we are happy to have them!

The Mount St. Joseph Handbell Choir continues to play monthly at Sunday Mass as well as prepare their new music program. As spring slowly arrives to Northern Illinois, they will be out sharing their music again. The Choir performed at Palm Sunday Mass on April 14th.

Music Therapy continues during the Mount St. Joseph Day Training hours. January activities included a multi-sensory activity with winter songs, bells, flavored marshmallows, and stamping a winter scene with scented paints. Very fun! February activities included telling a Valentine story with instruments and visuals as well as "candy" songs (our theme of the month).

In March, we clapped and danced along to live Irish fiddle music and songs about farm animals (theme of the month). The favorite was moving to the "Chicken Dance!"

Sacred Heart and Angel Guardian cottages enjoy music activities every Wednesday after workshop and all cottages look forward to monthly Saturday Sing-alongs.
